The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 7th, from His Majesty's Minister at The Hague, forwarding the following translation of a Decree of the Netherlands Government, dated September 5/6, respecting the importation of rags, &c., from certain Italian ports:—

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance :
Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 11, 1909;

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after September 8, 1910, their Decree of 27/29 August, 1910, shall be modified in such manner as to prohibit the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing and unwashed under-clothing and bedding from Margherita di Savoia, Barletta, Trani, Bisceglie, Molfetta, Andria, Carignola San Ferdinando, Puglia and Trinitapoli.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far

as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply :

I. As regards importation and transit :

To goods which have arrived from the said places but which appear sufficiently clearly to have come originally from elsewhere, and which are packed and have been transported in such a manner that they cannot have been in contact with infected objects :

II. As regards transit :

To goods which have been packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or handling on the way.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 4th, from His Majesty's Minister at Lisbon, intimating that the Sanitary Authority of the Island of St. Michaels has decided that, in consequence of the epidemic of cholera, for the present the crews and passengers, of whatever class, of vessels from the South of Italy, shall not be allowed to land, with the exception of passengers coming to the Island, the number being limited to six, and on condition of remaining under observation for the time required for making the necessary analysis, permission being given for the landing of cargo.
