The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 5th, from His Majesty's Ambassador at Constantinople, enclosing a copy of two circulars, dated August 30th, notifying the following decisions of the Constantinople Board of Health respecting quarantine on vessels arriving from Italian and Russian Ports:-

Italian Ports.

The measures adopted on the 20th August are modified as follows:-

(a.) Arrivals with or without passengers om the ports of Margherita-di-Savoia, Barletta, Trani, Bisceglie and Molfetta, will be submitted to 5 days' quarantine including duration of voyage, with disinfection. If the voyage exceeds 4 days, 24 hours observation with disinfection will be imposed.

(b.) Vessels coming from the coast between Manfredonia inclusive, and Brindisi exclusive, with the exception of those coming from the 5 ports mentioned in the above paragraph, will be submitted to a medical visit if without passengers, if with passengers 5 days' quarantine with disinfection will be imposed.

(c.) Vessels coming from the coast between Brindisi and Gallipoli both inclusive will be submitted to a medical visit if without passengers, if with passengers to disinfection in addition to a medical visit.

(d.) Arrivals from all Italian ports other than those situated between Manfredonia and Gallipoli will be submitted to a medical visit.

Russian Ports.

(1.) The lazaret of Monastir-Aghzy (Cavak) will no longer take vessels with passengers coming from Russian ports of the Black Sea and From September 1st they will go Sea of Azov. to the lazaret of Sinope.

(2.) Drinking water on board such vessels need no longer be renewed on arrival in Turkey if the Bill of Health shows that the vessel has not taken water on board at the ports in question.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated September 7th, from His Majesty's Representative at Trieste, transmitting the following translation of a Circular, dated August 24th, issued by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste, respecting sanitary precautions in case of cholera outbreak in the Austrian Littoral:-

Telegraphic instructions having been received from the Imperial and Royal Ministry for Commerce, dated August the 20th, 1910, No. 25466, respecting the eventual outbreak of cholera in the Littoral, the following regulations, with reference to the sanitary treatment of vessels navigating on the coast, are issued :-

Paragraph 1.

Should cases of cholera be officially ascertained within the limits of a port, and the danger of such a disease spreading, the following regulations will be put into force in the Littoral:

The period for which such regulations shall remain in force, shall be decided by the Marine Board, and at the same time all facilities granted during normal sanitary conditions, are suspended, with reference to the usual report of arrival, and to the sanitary Bill of Health.

Paragraph 2.

Port offices will have to be more strict with reference to port and police regulations of the port, and to the sanitary conditions of vessels and crew in the port itself.

Paragraph 3.

(1.) All localities of the ship must be kept constantly clean, the waterclosets must be washed with disinfectants.

(2.) Drinking water or water for personal use taken at some cholera-infected port, which has not been taken from a source declared healthy by the Authorities, must be boiled before use.

(3.) All prohibitions and special regulations issued by the Authorities in the interest of public health, in order to impede the spreading of the disease in question, must be applied also to the vessels.

(4.) All vessels must be provided with the principal medicines for cases of emergency, and this in sufficient quantity corresponding to the number of persons on board, and also be provided

with sufficient means of disinfection.

Those vessels which are employed in the port navigation or in the neighbouring places, or fishing boats along the coast, are excepted, but the decision is left with the Port Authorities. All medicines and disinfectants must be com-The Marine Board will prescribe the medicines and the disinfectants to be kept on

Paragraph 4. The Marine Board may order, should they find it necessary, the medical visit of the vessels before their departure from ports where cases of cholera may have been verified. The result of such medical visit will have to be put on the Bill of Health.

Paragraph 5.

In case that an epidemical disease should be ascertained in more important commercial centres, or in case that vessels which are transporting passengers should touch ports where epidemical disease has been officially ascertained, the Marine Board may order that the Companies should take medical men on board their vessels in order to watch over the state of the crew and of the passengers during the voyage.

Paragraph 6.

Prohibitions of import and export issued in consequence of outbreak of Cholera, are to be rigorously obeyed. Dirty linen of person and bed, used cloths, used rags and sacks, may be taken on board in ports where cases of Cholera have been officially ascertained only after having disinfected, but not if their exportation has been prohibited.

Paragraph 7.

Pleasure excursions, pilgrimages, and in general extraordinary journeys which would have as consequence the importation of the contagious disease, are prohibited.

Paragraph 8.

Persons belonging to the crew are bound to report to the Master every case of malady broken out on board which comes under their knowledge, and the Master himself will have to personally ascertain the state of the sick person. Should any suspected symptoms be verified, such as vomiting, cramps, diarrhoea, the sick person will have to be at once isolated. The vomit and excrement must be at once disinfected.

Paragraph 9.

If the vessel is in port, the cases must be reported at once to the port officials, and await their decision. Vessels which during the voyage have such sick persons on board must call at the nearest port (quarantine establishment) where the discharge and isolation of the sick person is possible.

The stations for medical visits and respectively for the discharge and isolation of the sick person, will be indicated at the moment of the outbreak

of cholera in the Littoral.

Paragraph 10.

Should the vessel for any reason (nautical influence, great distance, unfavourable winds, &c.), not be able to reach a quarantine establishment, must call at the nearest harbour and await there further instructions from the Harbour Office with reference to the vessel being sent in quarantine.

Paragraph 11.

Vessels which before their departure from an infected port have undergone a medical visit and have a doctor on board and upon which during the voyage no suspicious case of illness has been verified, obtain usually the "free pratique." Vessels which have not undergone a medical visit at their departure from an infected port and have no doctor on board, can obtain "free pratique" only after a successful medical revision.

Paragraph 12.

Vessels, upon which a suspicious case of cholera has been medically verified, will be treated as follows:—First, the ill person must be taken on shore. The vessel's localities and effects, which, according to the doctor's opinion, have to be considered as infected, will have to be disinfected. The vessel, should the doctor esteem it necessary, will have to change all water on board before she can get "free pratique." Should these measures of precaution not be possible on the spot, the vessel will be brought to the quarantine station. Passengers are only allowed to land in such ports where it is possible for them to undergo a medical visit, and their effects will be disinfected.

Paragraph 13.

The Commander of the vessel is responsible for the carrying out of the measures ordered and the expenses are for the account of the vessel.

Paragraph 14.

The Port Offices must report to the Marine Board (Trieste), without loss of time, all cases which refer to the sanitary conditions of vessels and within the limits of the port itself, as well as with reference to the carrying out of such regulations.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9(1)

COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX.

Parish of Hurstperpoint.

To the County Council of East Sussex;-And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of East Sussex for the issue of a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising part of a certain road situate within the Parish of Hurstperpoint:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising so much of the main road through the village of Hurstperpoint, as extends from a point opposite the White Horse Inn to the junction of the road with South-avenue (formerly known as Hill-road).

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

ORDER of the Local Government Board: Motor Car Act, 1903: Regulations under Section 9 (1).

BOROUGH OF LUTON.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Luton;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the Town Council of the Borough of Luton having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising

certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Borough of Luton (hereinatter referred to as "the Borough"), We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers

given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—
ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the borough which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-sixth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

SCHEDULE.

George-street;

Upper George - street, and so much of Dunstable-road as extends from its junction with Upper George-street to its junction with Cardigan-street

So much of Manchester-street as extends from its junction with George-street to a point 50 yards north of its junction with Bridge-street;

So much of Castle-street as extends from its junction with George-street to a point 50 yards south of its junction with Hibbert-street and Windsor-street

So much of Park-street (or Park-square) as extends from its junction with George-street to its junction with Church-street; and

So much of Church-street as extends from its junction with Park-street to the Great Northern Railway Bridge.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 17TH SEPTEMBER 1910.)

NOTTINGHAM (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER ог 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

-(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected; and (b)with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass, or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass, or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894

to be a Veterinary Inspector.
(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Detention of Animals.

4.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass, or mule, which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:-

(i.) The horse, ass, or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a

Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
(ii.) No other horse, ass, or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field, or other premises, unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority.

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:
 - (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange:
 - (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected:
 - (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee, or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feedingtroughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee, or occupier:
 - (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses, or mules, of litter used for or about any horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
- (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee, or occupier of the place to be cleaned and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

- 6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.
- (2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses, and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses, and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (Police);

Section forty-four (General Administrative Provisions):

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections

and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass, or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a horse, ass, or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a Notice under this Order, the owner of the horse, ass, or mule, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the horse, ass, or mule is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order-
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector:
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

11. This Order extends to the county borough of Nottingham.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of October, nineteen hundred and ten.

DEVONSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations.

1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may,

in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

Confirmation of Regulations.

2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply-
 - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.
 - (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
 - (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations, without further or other proof.

Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):-

Section forty-three (Police);

Section forty-four (General Administrative Provisions) ;

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.—(1.) Sheep brought from the Island of St. Kilda or Dune Island or Soay Island or Boreray Island, in the county of Inverness, shall not be landed in any other part of Great Britain unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising the movement of the sheep to premises for detention under this Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which those premises are situate, and such licence shall operate as an authority to land the sheep at any place situate in the District of the Local Authority by whose Inspector the licence is granted, and not elsewhere. The licence shall be available for six days, inclusive of the day of issue, and no longer.

(2.) The sheep shall be moved from the placeof landing to the place of detention specified in the licence by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement they shall, so far as practicable, be kept separate from all sheep not being moved

with a licence under this Order.

(3.) Sheep moved to a place of detention shall within seven days of their arrival thereat be dipped by the owner or other person in charge-thereof by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence and to the satisfaction. of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and shall not be moved from the place of detention until they have been so dipped, except for the purpose of being dipped.

(4.) The owner or other person in charge of sheep detained under this Article shall keep the

same separate from other sheep.

(5.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing such movement.

(6.) The licence may be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to the Invernessshire (Skye and Outer Islands) Sheep-Scab Order of 1909 with such modifications as may be necessary.
