

No. 1348.—ENGLAND, EAST COAST—
RIVER THAMES ENTRANCE.

*Duke of Edinburgh Channel—Shingles Patch,
Extension to the Northward; Amended Track.*

Position.—Edinburgh Channel Light-vessel;
lat. $51^{\circ} 33\frac{1}{4}'$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 15\frac{1}{4}'$ E.

Details.—A recent examination of the Shingles
Patch shows that it has extended considerably to
the northward, depths of 30 feet being now
found on the track for deep draught vessels,
shown on Chart No. 1607.

Shoal patches:—

(a) Position.—At a distance of $9\frac{1}{4}$ cables,
S. 42° E., from the Duke of Edinburgh Light-
vessel; lat. $51^{\circ} 32' 46''$ N., long. $1^{\circ} 16' 36''$ E.,
Chart 1607.

Depth.—30 feet.

(b) Position.—At a distance of $11\frac{3}{4}$ cables,
S. 38° E., from the Duke of Edinburgh Channel
Light-vessel; lat. $51^{\circ} 32' 34''$ N., long.
 $1^{\circ} 16' 52''$ E.

Depth.—29 feet.

Remarks.—From (b) the 5-fathom contour line
extends south-eastward just outside No. 2, B.W,
Chequered Buoy.

Amended track:—

Details.—The track now shown on the chart
through the Duke of Edinburgh Channel should
be expunged. From a point distant $8\frac{1}{4}$ cables,
S. 50° E., from the Duke of Edinburgh Light-

vessel, new tracks, S. 44° E. and N. 73° W.,
should be drawn, the latter meeting the Black
Deep Track about 4 cables, S. 50° W., from the
Duke of Edinburgh Light-vessel.

Variation.— 15° W.
