Elevation.—40 feet.

Remarks.—The position of this light, and the new breakwater are shown on the accompanying; reproduction of a portion of plan No. 3534.



Remarks.—A careful examination of the locality in which breakers were reported by the Master of the steamship Naseri, having failed to find any trace of shoal water, the note "Breakers reported 1910" has been erased from the chart.

## (2) Rosario Islands—Light-and-Bell-Buoy Established.

Position.—Westward of westernmost Island; lat. 10° 11′ N., long. 75° 49′ W.

Description.—Colour not stated. The buoy exhibits an occulting white light.

Remarks.—" Position approximate" has been placed against the buoy on the chart.
