The town of Naples in Italy is to be regarded until further notice as infected with cholera.

Under former notices, the following are at present regarded as infected with cholera:-Apulia in Italy and European Russia with the exception of the Province ("Guvernement") of Archangel.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and calling at ports in the Provinces of Nordland, Finmarken, and Tromsø, or using the inner channel between Honningsvaag and Lødingen, should be ordered by the pilots to the provisional cholera hospital at Tromsø. But vessels arriving at Hammerfest, Vardø, or Vadsø, with single cases of cholera on board, can expect until further notice that these patients will be received for treatment on shore under the further directions of the local Board of Health.

In other cases, vessels with cholera patients on board and bound for Norwegian ports should be ordered by the pilots to the Quarantine Station

at Odderøen near Christiansand.

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after October 7, 1910, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Constantinople and Trebizond shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are con-

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from Constantinople and Trebizond but which can be shown to have come originally from elsewhere, and which transported in such a manner as to render it impossible that they should have been in contact with infected objects;

II. As regards transit:

To goods which have been packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or treatment on the way. The Hague, October 5/6, 1910.
