PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Algarkirk, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, between that benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, which two benefices are situate in the said county of Lincoln and in the said diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln is the Patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Algarkirk, and also of the said

two benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said two benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, are at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said benefice of Algarkirk has endowments of such an amount as that after the charges hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments the said benefice of Algarkirk will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parishes of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Algarkirk which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Algarkirk is now vacant.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said three benefices is situate (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal), and with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln, acting as such Bishop and also as the Patron in right of his See of each of the said three benefices as aforesaid (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we,

the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme is published in the London Gazette and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same all the tithe rent charges, glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall at the date of the publication in the London Gazette of such Order in Council or which may thereafter belong to the said benefice of Algarkirk shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the respective Incumbents for the time being of the said two benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, with the annual sums or yearly charges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of one hundred and fifty pounds to be as from the date aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and a clear annual sum or yearly charge of eighty pounds to be as from the date aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, such clear annual sums or yearly charges to be appor-tionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said two benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, respectively, or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the respective Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year.

"And we further recommend and propose that each of the Incumbents for the time being of the said two benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent charges of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum and of eighty pounds per annum respectively hereby proposed to be created (that is to say): power, if and whenever any part of the said rent charges to which he is respectively entitled shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-eight days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof, to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same reut charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises, together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the nonpayment thereof, and for the purpose of collecting, receiving, and recovering such endowments or any of them to use, exercise, and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting, recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same, as may be statutably exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"Provided always that none of the powers aforesaid shall be exercised by or on behalf of either of the Incumbents for the time being of the said two benefices of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, until the expiration of twenty-one clear days at the least after a written notice demanding payment of the sum then in arrear shall have been left at the last known residence of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Algarkick, which written notice may nevertheless be

left as aforesaid at any time after the expiration of the first seven days of the twenty-eight days aforesaid.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Algarkirk shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him grant, convey, and annex to the said benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, or to the said benefice of Saint Andrew, Great Grimsby, any part or parts of the rectorial endowments belonging to the said benefice of Algarkirk which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Lincoln for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for either of the said yearly charges hereby proposed to be created as afcresaid then the same annual sum or yearly charge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Lincoln.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five; duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth, situate; within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, and of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, as such Bishop, with the consents of Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard-street, in the city of London. Banker, of the Reverend Thomas Graham, of the Vicarage, Southborough, in the county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, of Frank Sellwood, of Cullompton, in the said county of Devon, Gentleman, of the Reverend William Edward Burroughs, of Saint Andrew's Vicarage, Plymouth, Clerk in Holy Orders, and of the Reverend David James Stather Hunt, of the Holy Trinity Vicarage, Tunbridge Wells, in the said county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, and with the consent of the Reverend John Percy Baker, Vicar or Incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Charles, Plymouth, in the said county of Devon, and as such Vicar or Incumbent the Patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, and of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Uhapelry of Saint Gabriel, Peverell Park, Plymouth.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The consolidated chapelry of Saint Gabriel,

Peverell Park, Plymouth, comprising:—
"1. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Pancras, Penny-cross, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon part of the north-west by the parish of Stoke Damerel, upon the south-west by the new parish of Saint Barnabas, Devonport, upon the south-east and upon

the east by the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, from the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, at the point where the grounds belonging to the houses called Thornhill, Mount View, and Mount House, all meet, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line (thereby passing to the south of Mount House) for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the fences which divide the closes numbered 42, 41, and 25 upon the ordnance map of Pennycross, published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this representation all meet, and extending thence south-westward along the fences which divide the said closes numbered 42 and 41 and the close numbered 40 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 25 and the close numbered 26 upon the said maps for a distance of thirteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 40 from the said close numbered 26 reaches the eastern side of Mutley-lane, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of Mutley-lane for a distance of two chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with Ganna Park-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Ganna Parkroad for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Peverell Parkroad, and extending thence south-westward in the same direction and in a straight line (thereby following in part the course of the proposed continuation of Ganna Park-road) for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, from the said parish of Stoke Damerel.

"2. And also all that contiguous portion of the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, which is bounded upon the north-westby the above described portion of the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennycross, upon the south-west by the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Devonport, upon the south by the new parish of Saint Matthias, Plymouth, upon a small part of the east by the consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, both in the said county and diocese, and upon, the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the east and upon the north-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said consolidated chapelry of Saint Augustine, Plymouth, from the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, at the junction of the street called Mutley Plain with Belgrave-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Mutley Plain for a distance of nine chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wilderness-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Wilderness-road for a distance of one chain and three-quarters or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries such road across the stream called Plymouth Leat, and extending thence first northwestward and then northward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of eleven chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Emmanuel, Compton Gifford, from the said new parish of Saint Pancras, Pennyeross."

And whereas the said representation has been

far as possible, undergo all the Courses:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorize the payment of the allowances now granted to Flag Officers undergoing the War Course being extended to those undergoing Courses of Instruction in Gunnery, Torpedo and Signalling, the number of Flug Officers allowed to attend each of these Courses being limited to twelve a year.

"We would further submit that this arrangement may take effect from the twenty-second day of August, one thousand nine hundred and

ten.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have expressed their concurrence in these proposals."

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by. Your Order in Council to sanction the follow-

ing:—
"1. A consolidated allowance of one hundred and fifty pounds a year to be paid to Officers studying in Japan in lieu of the present Lodging and Provision Allowances.

"2. The gratuity for those who study for two years and who pass the Examination successfully

to be two hundred pounds.
"3. The gratuity for those who study for one

year only to be one hundred pounds.

"4. The gratuity to be paid in instalments of fifty pounds at the end of the first and second six months subject to the candidate passing the test on each occasion, the additional one hundred pounds for those who remain for two years being

paid on finally passing the Higher Standard.

"5. These proposals to be retrospective so far as concerns Officers at present studying in Japan

who remain for a second year.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

Restriction on Movement of Bushes in Scheduled District.

1. No bushes shall be moved from any premises in the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District") to any other premises whether within the Scheduled District or not, except in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and where any premises in the same occupation are divided by a highway the several parts shall for the purposes of this Order be treated as separate premises.

Licences Necessary for Movement of Bushes.
