“And whereas we are of opinion that a similar allowance should be granted to the Officer in Charge of the Signal Instruction in Your Majesty's Naval Training Establishment at Shotley :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction an allowance of two shillings and sixpence a day being granted accordingly.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed; and the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the seventeenth day of September, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by section three of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pension, and other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by His late Majesty's Orders in Council bearing date the seventh day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, and the seventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and five, provision was made for the pay and allowances of Naval and Marine Officers studying in Japan, and for the grant of gratuities on passing :

“And whereas by His late Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and eight, authority was obtained to allow Officers to study the language for two years in cases where it is of advantage that they should do so :

“And whereas we are of opinion that the conditions governing the grant of the allowances

and gratuities to Officers studying in Japan require revision :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following :—

“1. A consolidated allowance of one hundred and fifty pounds a year to be paid to Officers studying in Japan in lieu of the present Lodging and Provision Allowances.

“2. The gratuity for those who study for two years and who pass the Examination successfully to be two hundred pounds.

“3. The gratuity for those who study for one year only to be one hundred pounds.

“4. The gratuity to be paid in instalments of fifty pounds at the end of the first and second six months subject to the candidate passing the test on each occasion, the additional one hundred pounds for those who remain for two years being paid on finally passing the Higher Standard.

“5. These proposals to be retrospective so far as concerns Officers at present studying in Japan who remain for a second year.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“And whereas by Order in Council of the fourth day of March, 1884, authority was given for the payment of an allowance of £91 5s. 0d. a year to the Paymaster at Malta for performing duties in connection with the Reserve :

“And whereas we are of opinion that, owing to changes which have taken place at Malta, this allowance should be apportioned between the Accountant Officer of the Receiving Ship and the Accountant Officer of the Depot Ship for Torpedo Boat Destroyers and Torpedo Boats at Malta :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that, on the supersession of the present Accountant Officer of the Receiving Ship at Malta, the above mentioned allowance be discontinued, and to authorize in lieu allowances of two shillings and sixpence a day each being paid respectively to the Accountant Officer of the Receiving Ship and the Accountant Officer of the Depot Ship for Torpedo Boat Destroyers and Torpedo Boats :
