Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the University of London Act, 1898, that the following amendment of Statute 129 of the Statutes of the University of London has been made by the Senate, and that copies can be obtained on application to the Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W.

To repeal Statute 129 of the Statutes of the University, and to substitute therefor the following :—

“ 129. Any Graduate of the University who shall have taken a degree either as an Internal or as an External Student may be admitted as an Internal Student to the Examination for a higher degree within the purview of any Faculty, except Theology or Medicine, other than that in which he has graduated, on completing a prescribed course of study in a School or Schools or under a Teacher or Teachers of the University, or may in place of the whole or any part of such Examination submit the results of study or research, subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained.

Any Graduate of the University who shall have taken a degree as an External Student may be admitted as an Internal Student to the Examination for a higher degree within the purview of the same Faculty, on completing a prescribed course of study in a School or Schools or under a Teacher or Teachers of the University, or may in place of the whole or any part of such Examination submit the results of study or research, subject to the provisions hereinbefore contained.
