TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's
Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will
be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the
Bank of England, on Thursday, the 10th instant,
at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued
under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and

£3,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000,
£5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the
15th November, 1910, and will be payable at

February, 1911.

for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be
made through a London Banker.*

Bank of England.

11th instant, and payment in full of the amounts
of the accepted Tenders must be made to the
Bank of England not later than three o'clock
on Tuesday, the 15th November, 1910.
