For appointing a Day for the Celebration of the Solemnity of the Coronation of Their Majesties.

GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS by Our Royal Proclamation V bearing date the nineteenth day of July last, We did (amongst other things) publish and declare Our Royal intention to celebrate the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation and of the Coronation of Our dearly beloved Consort the Queen, upon a day of June next to be thereafter determined, at Our Palace at Westminster; and whereas We have resolved by the favour and blessing of Almighty God to celebrate the said Solemnity upon Thursday the twenty-second day of June next, We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, give notice thereof, and We do hereby strictly charge and command all Our loving subjects whom it may concern that all persons, of what rank or quality soever they be, who either upon Our Letters to them directed, or by reason of their offices and tenures, or otherwise, are to do any service at the time of Our Coronation, do duly give their attendance at the said Solemnity on Thursday the twenty-second day of June next, in all respects furnished and appointed as to so great a Solemnity appertaineth and answerable to the dignities and places which every one of them respectively holdeth and enjoyeth, and of this they or any of them are not to fail, as they will answer the contrary at their perils, unless upon special reasons by Ourself under Our hand to be allowed, We shall dispense with any of their services or attendances:

Provided always, and We do further by this Our Royal Proclamation signify and declare, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to change or alter Our Royal determination as more fully declared in Our Royal Proclamation bearing date the nineteenth day of July last, whereby We did signify it to be Our Royal Will and Pleasure upon the occasion of this Our Coronation to dispense with that part of the Ceremonial which in times past took place in Westminster Hall, and that part thereof which consisted of the Procession.

W E, considering that it is desirable that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, should be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout those parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Wales, and Ireland, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act aforesaid, appoint Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next as a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout England and Wales, and Ireland, and every part thereof, under and in accordance with the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

HE King's Most Excellent Majesty having been pleased to command me, as Earl Marshal of England, forthwith to prepare and countersign letters to be passed under the Royal Sign Manual, requiring the attendance of the Peers and Peeresses of Great Britain at the solemnity of the Royal Coronation of His Majesty and of Her Majesty the Queen, and the King having been further pleased to command me to prepare such letters also for those Peers of that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, called Ireland, whose right to vote at the election of a representative Peer for Ireland has, on claim made on their behalf, been admitted by the House of Lords of the United Kingdom, and who are not now Members of the House of Commons of the United Kingdom, I do hereby request that all those Peers who, in conformity to the above regulations, are entitled to assist at the solemnity of the Royal Coronation of Their Majesties, will be pleased to transmit their respective addresses to me, at this office, and that the Dowager-Peeresses and Peeresses who may claim to attend at the said Coronation, will be also pleased to transmit their respective Christian names and addresses to me, in order that their letters of summons may be prepared without delay.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peers at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King George the Fifth and Queen Mary.

These are to give notice to all Peers who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robe or mantle of the Peers be of

crimson velvet, edged with miniver, the cape furred with miniver pure, and powdered with bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur), according to their degree, viz.:—

Barons, two rows.

Viscounts, two rows and a half.

Earls, three rows.

Marquesses, three rows and a half.

Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top; and no jewels or precious stones are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeit pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have on the circle or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the

circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquis to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle,

eight gold strawberry leaves.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peeresses at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King George the Fifth and Queen Mary.

These are to give notice to all Peeresses who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robes or mantles appertaining to their respective ranks are to be worn over the usual

full Court dress.

That the robe or mantle of a Baroness be of crimson velvet, the cape whereof to be furred with miniver pure, and powdered with two bars or rows of ermine (i.e., narrow pieces of black fur); the said mantle to be edged round with miniver pure two inches in breadth, and the train to be three feet on the ground; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz.:—a rim or circle with six pearls (represented by silver balls) upon the same, not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, only the cape powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches as before, and the train a yard and a quarter; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz.:—a rim or circle with pearls (represented by silver balls) thereon, sixteen in number, and not raised

upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half; the coronet to be composed of eight pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points or rays, with small strawberry leaves between, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three quarters; the coronet to be composed of four strawberry leaves and four pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points of the same height as the leaves, alternately, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, only the cape powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards; the coronet to be composed of eight strawberry leaves, all of equal height,

above the rim.

And that the caps of all the said coronets be of crimson velvet, turned up with ermine, with a tassel of gold on the top.

Note.—Only those Peers and Peeresses who reply to the above intimation before the first day of January, 1911, will receive the Royal Command to attend the Ceremony of the Coronation.

It is to be understood that the above Orders refer to all English, Scottish and Irish Peers (except Peers who are minors, and Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons), Peeresses in their own right, the widows of Peers, and the wives of living Peers, including the wives of Irish Peers who have seats in the House of Commons.

With respect to such widows of Peers who have remarried under the rank of the Peerage, they, according to former precedent, are considered as not entitled to such summons.

As to widows of Peers who have remarried with a Peer of lower degree, their precedence, according to precedent, is that of their last husband.

Peers and Peeresses in their own right whose highest dignity is in the Peerage of Scotland or Ireland will wear robes and coronet of such dignity, as also the wife or widow of such Peer.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the new parish (sometime district) of Manningham, and partly out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Philip, Girlington, both in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon.

diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Manningham and the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of Manningham and of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for

the purposes of Divine Worship.

"And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed separate district there have been contributed a sum of four thousand seven hundred and thirty-seven pounds thirteen shillings and ninepence Midland Railway two pounds ten shillings per centum per annum debenture stock and a sum of four hundred pounds London and South Western Railway three pounds per centum per annum debenture stock and the same have been transferred into our name to be held by us towards the endowment of the said proposed district and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said new parish and towards the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sums of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sums of stock and to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of one hundred and thirty

pounds eight shillings and ninepence.

"And whereas the said sums of stock have been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of seven hundred pounds sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said proposed district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of twenty-one pounds.

"And whereas the said grant of seven hundred pounds sterling will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme be made and secured by an instrument to be executed by us, the said Commissioners, under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her said late Majesty,

chapter one hundred and eleven.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Henry Edmund, Viscount Mountgarret, has contributed a sum of three thousand pounds towards the cost of providing a permanent church within and for the said proposed separate district, and this contribution has been made upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas the said Henry Edmund, Viscount Mountgarret, has nominated as the person or persons, to whom he desires that the first turn of the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall be assigned, himself, the said Henry Edmund, Viscount Mountgarret, or in case of his death before the exercise of such first turn of patronage the Reverend George Body, Doctor in Divinity and Canon Residentiary of the Cathedral Church of Durham, George Ackroyd, of Harden Hall, near Bingley, in the county of York, wool comber, Herbert James Jeffery, of Bradford, in the county of York, solicitor, and the Reverend Charles Wynne Mosse, of the College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders, or the

survivors or survivor of them, and has also nominated the Warden, Council, and Scholars of Keble College, Oxford, as the College to which he desires that, with the exception of the. said first turn of patronage, the whole right of the patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall be assigned.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend William Boyd, Bishop of Ripon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Manningham, and of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, portions together which with boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'the district of

Saint Chad, Manningham.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof, with the exception of one nomination, namely the first, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Warden, Council, and Scholars of Keble College, Oxford, and their successors for ever, and that the said first nomination of the said minister or incumbent shall be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said Henry Edmund, Viscount Mount-garret, or in case of his death before the exercise of the said first nomination by the said George Body, George Ackroyd, Herbert James Jeffery, and Charles Wynne Mosse, or the survivors or survivor of them.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or any other

Act of Parliament."
"The Schedule to which the foregoing scheme has reference.

"The district of Saint Chad, Manningham, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district) of Manningham, and of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Philip, Girlington, both in the county of York and in the diocese of Ripon, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south by the new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford, upon the south-east by the new parish of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bradford, upon part of the north-east by the new parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the north-east, upon the

north, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, from the said new parish of Manning-ham, at the junction of Whetley-lane with Toller-lane, and extending thence north-west-ward along the middle of Toller-lane for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Farcliffe-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Farclifferoad for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lilycroft-road, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Manningham, from the new parish of Saint Luke, Manningham, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence along south-westward \mathbf{the} last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Lilycroft-road) for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Lilycroft-road with Toller-lane and Upper Woodlands-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Upper Woodlands-road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Manningham from the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington), for a distance of thirty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Whetley-lane, and extending thence first southwestward and then southward along the middle of Whetley-lane for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Thornton-road and with Ingleby-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Ingleby-road for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the vicarage of the said new parish of Manningham and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girlington, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

REGULATIONS respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Female Typist in the General Post Office, London.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 30. If an Examination begins in one of the first four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the second four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time, not exceeding five years, which

they may have spent in such service.

- 2. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.
- 3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—
 - (a) That they are unmarried, or widows.
 - (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
 - (c) That they are natural-born or naturalized British subjects.
- 4. Candidates must be at least five feet in height.
- 5. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition.
- 6. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 7. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

 - 1. Writing.
 - 2. Spelling.
 - English Composition.
 Copying Manuscript.
 - 5. Arithmetic (first four rules, simple and compound, including English weights and measures, and reduction).
 - 6. Typewriting.

No Candidate will be regarded as qualified who does not pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in each of the

above-mentioned subjects.

The Civil Service Commissioners may, at their discretion, restrict the Examination in Typewriting to such a number of Candidates at the head of the list resulting from the marks awarded for the work in the other subjects as they may think fit. The marks awarded for Typewriting to the Candidates examined in that subject will be added to the marks awarded to those same Candidates for their work in the five other subjects. The Examination in Typewriting, as well as the Examination in the other subjects, will be held at such times and places as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

- 9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 10. A fee of 1s. will be required from every Candidate attending the Examination.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 4TH NOVEMBER 1910.)

DISEASES OF ANIMALS (EDINBURGH AND MID-LOTHIAN) ORDER OF 1910.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Power to make Regulations for Notification of the death of Cattle in certain cases.

- 1. The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make regulations—
 - (1.) For prescribing and regulating the notice to be given to or by any person or authority in the case of illness of any head of cattle where the animal has died from the illness or been slaughtered on account thereof, and for supplementing or varying for those purposes any of the provisions of Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894; and
 - (2.) For regulating the burial or disposal of the carcase of any head of cattle to which any such notice relates.

Limitation of Regulations.

- 2. (1.) Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall require notice to be given in the case of death consequent on accident, or calving.
- (2.) Nothing in any regulations made under this Order shall affect the provisions of any Order of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries relating to cattle-plague, pleuropneumonia, foot-and-mouth disease, or anthrax.

Confirmation of Regulations.

- 3. (1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply:—
 - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District two weeks at least before the making of the application.
 - (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application a copy of the regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
 - (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such rate-payer furnish him with a copy of the proposed regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the regulations, without further or other proof.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the DISEASES OF ANIMALS (EDINBURGH AND MID-LOTHIAN) ORDER OF 1910.
