

north, and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Mark, Manningham, from the said new parish of Manningham, at the junction of Whetley-lane with Toller-lane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Toller-lane for a distance of seventeen chains or thereabouts to its junction with Farcliffe-road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Farcliffe-road for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lilycroft-road, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Manningham, from the new parish of Saint Luke, Manningham, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence south-westward along the last-mentioned boundary (thereby following the middle of Lilycroft-road) for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the junction of Lilycroft-road with Toller-lane and Upper Woodlands-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Upper Woodlands-road (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said new parish of Manningham from the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girington), for a distance of thirty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Whetley-lane, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of Whetley-lane for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Thornton-road and with Ingleby-road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Ingleby-road for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girington, from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Bradford."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the vicarage of the said new parish of Manningham and of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Philip, Girington, out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.
