WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the twenty-seventh day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following; that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, sections six and eight, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property formerly belonging to the archdeaconry of Brecon in the cathedral church of Saint David's and now vested in us.

"Whereas under the Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868, and by virtue of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council made under the provisions of the same Act, bearing date the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and duly published in the *London Gazette* of the tenth day of the same month all the lands, tithes, and other hereditaments theretofore annexed to and then forming part of the said archdeaconry (except any right of patronage) became absolutely vested in us for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the said lands, tithes and other hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid are now in our possession and are not subject to any outstanding lease or grant, but on account of the character or situation of the property the said lands, tithes and other hereditaments are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed.

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the said lands, tithes and other hereditaments or of the proceeds thereof for the ultimate improvement of our common fund it is expedient that the said lands, tithes and other hereditaments or such parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be

empowered to dispose of our interests therein or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now therefore we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments in writing duly executed according to law from time to time to sell and dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty's reign all or any of the said lands, tithes and other hereditaments heretofore belonging to the said archdeaconry of Brecon and so vested in us as aforesaid with their appurtenances and all our estate, right, title and interest therein or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same and his, her or their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns or otherwise as he, she or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall upon due calculation and inquiry appear to us to be just and reasonable it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time as occasion may arise, in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments or of some estate or interest therein, convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the *London Gazette* pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of *St. Davids*.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for

England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the eleventh day of August in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four and published in the London Gazette on the fifteenth day of the same month, part of the parish of Caterham, in the said county of Surrey and at that time in the diocese of Rochester, but now in the said diocese of Southwark, was assigned as a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint John the Evangelist, situate in the Caterham Valley, in the said parish of Caterham, and the said district chapelry was named 'The district chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley.'

"And whereas the said district chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said diocese of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, shall be altered so that all that portion of the parish of Tandridge, in the said county of Surrey, and in the said diocese of Southwark, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis-severed from such parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing scheme or representation has reference.

"The territory to be dis-severed from the parish of Tandridge, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark, and to be annexed to the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, in the said county and diocese, being:—All that detached portion of the said parish of Tandridge, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the west by the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Caterham Valley, upon the north-east by the parish of Warlingham, and upon the east and upon the south by the parish of Godstone, both in the said county and diocese."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the patrons and to the incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation, and such patrons and incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty Queen Victoria's reign (shortly entitled "The Judicial Committee Act, 1844"), it was enacted that it should be competent to Her Majesty by any Order or Orders in Council to provide for the admission of Appeals to Her Majesty in Council from any judgments, sentences, decrees, or orders of any Court of Justice within any British Colony or Possession abroad, although such Court should not be a Court of Errors or Appeal within such Colony or Possession, and to make provision for the instituting and prosecuting of such Appeals and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as Her Majesty in Council should pronounce thereon:

And whereas by a Charter of Justice dated the 4th day of March, 1831, a Supreme Court of Van Diemen's Land was established and Rules were laid down for the conduct of Appeals from that Court to His Majesty King William the Fourth his heirs and successors in Council:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council of the 21st day of July, 1855, Her Majesty was pleased to order that in respect of the Colony of Van Diemen's Land the name of Tasmania should be substituted for that of Van Diemen's Land:

And whereas the Colony of Tasmania is now a State of the Commonwealth of Australia constituted by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the sixty-third and sixty-fourth years of Her late Majesty's reign and entitled "An Act to constitute the Commonwealth of Australia":

And whereas it is expedient with a view to equalizing as far as may be the conditions under which His Majesty's subjects in the British Dominions beyond the Seas shall have a right of Appeal to His Majesty in Council, and to promoting uniformity in the practice and procedure in all such Appeals, that the provisions as to Appeals contained in the said Charter of Justice should be revoked and new provisions made for Appeals from the said Supreme Court to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said provisions be and the same are hereby revoked and that instead thereof the Rules hereunder set out shall regulate all Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the said State of Tasmania.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence, or decision;

"Court" means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Supreme Court of Tasmania exercising the powers of the Full Court;

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal;

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie—

(a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £1,000 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of £500 sterling or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

3. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the judges, the final judgment may be entered *pro forma* on the application of any party to

such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Chief Justice or, in his absence, of the senior puisne Judge of the Court, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an Appeal therefrom, and not for any other purpose.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance—

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500, for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant's not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

6. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just. And in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

9. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party never-

theless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in Tasmania or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in Tasmania or in England.

11. Where the Record is printed in Tasmania the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal of the Court.

12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

13. Where part of the Record is printed in Tasmania and part is to be printed in England, Rules 11 and 12 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in Tasmania and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

14. The reasons given by the judge, or any of the judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such judge or judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

16. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

17. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

18. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may inquire whether notice, or sufficient notice, of the application has been

given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and, if not satisfied as to the notices given, may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter, as in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

19. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

20. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the despatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the despatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a Certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a Certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such Certificate, to stand dismissed for non prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

22. Where at any time between the order granting final leave to appeal and the despatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died, or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

23. Where the Record subsequently to its despatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record, in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

24. The Case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in Tasmania or in England, and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at

the hearing of the Appeal, or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

25. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, either of his own motion, or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

26. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in Tasmania, such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

27. The Court shall conform with, and execute any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

II. The size of the paper used shall be such that the sheet when folded and trimmed, will be 11 inches in height and 8½ inches in width.

III. The type to be used in the text shall be Pica type, but Long Primer shall be used in printing accounts, tabular matter, and notes.

IV. The number of lines in each page of Pica type shall be 47 or thereabouts, and every tenth line shall be numbered in the margin.

Appeal within such Colony or Possession, and to make provision for the instituting and prosecuting of such Appeals and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as Her Majesty in Council should pronounce thereon:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 27th day of November, 1852, provision was made for regulating Appeals from the Supreme Court of the Province of New Brunswick to Her Majesty in Council:

And whereas it is expedient, with a view to equalizing as far as may be the conditions under which His Majesty's subjects in the British Dominions beyond the Seas shall have a right of appeal to His Majesty in Council, and to promoting uniformity in the practice and procedure in all such Appeals, that the said Order in Council of the 27th day of November, 1852, should be revoked and that new provisions should be made for regulating Appeals from the said Supreme Court to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council of the 27th day of November, 1852, be and the same is hereby revoked and that the Rules herein set out shall regulate all Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the said Province of New Brunswick.

RULES.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence, or decision;

"Court" means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick according as the matter in question is one which, under the Rules and Practice of the Supreme Court, properly appertains to the Full Court or to a single Judge;

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal;

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie—

(a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £300 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of £300 sterling or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

3. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in conse-

quence of a difference of opinion between the judges, the final judgment may be entered *pro forma* on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Chief Justice or, in his absence, of the senior puisne Judge of the Court, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an Appeal therefrom, and not for any other purpose.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the Applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance—

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500, for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant's not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the Record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

6. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court shall seem just, and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal Agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and, generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

9. Where in the course of the preparation of

a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in Canada or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in Canada or in England.

11. Where the Record is printed in Canada, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal, if any, of the Court.

12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

13. Where part of the Record is printed in Canada and part is to be printed in England, Rules 11 and 12 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in Canada and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

14. The reasons given by the judge, or any of the judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such judge or judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

16. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

17. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the conditions imposed by such order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as,

in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

18. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may inquire whether notice, or sufficient notice, of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and, if not satisfied as to the notices given, may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

19. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

20. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the despatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the despatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court sees fit to grant such a certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

22. Where at any time between the order granting final leave to appeal and the despatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died, or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

23. Where the Record subsequently to its despatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record, in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

24. The case of each party to the Appeal

may be printed either in Canada or in England and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

25. The case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the Case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

26. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in New Brunswick, such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

27. The Court shall conform with, and execute, any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of West Walton, in the county of Norfolk, the parish of Upavon, in the county of Wilts, and the parish of Saint Issey, in the county of Cornwall, respectively, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, made Representations to His Majesty in Council, stating that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground

in the civil parishes of West Walton, Upavon, and Saint Issey aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

WEST WALTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary, in the parish of West Walton, in the county of Norfolk; and, after the 31st of December, 1910, in the churchyard with the following exceptions, that is to say :—

In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place within the period of fourteen years prior to the date of this Order, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Jane Smith, Elizabeth Hudson, George Stanton Webb, Martha Webb, Mary Johnson, Joseph Herbert, and Elizabeth Pratt, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

UPAVON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. Mary, in the parish of Upavon, in the county of Wilts; and in the churchyard attached thereto with the following exceptions, that is to say :—

(a) In the vaults or walled graves now existing in the said churchyard, and belonging or reputed to belong to the Rawdon, Pearce and Potter families, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vaults or graves be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In the said churchyard, in any grave space not within fifteen feet of a dwelling house and in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of Mrs. Alexander at her decease, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

SAINT ISSEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Issey, in the county of Cornwall; and in the churchyard, with the following exceptions, that is to say :—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 13th day of December next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the

London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such Representations one month before the said 13th day of December.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peers at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King George the Fifth and Queen Mary.

These are to give notice to all Peers who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robe or mantle of the Peers be of crimson velvet, edged with miniver, the cape furred with miniver pure, and powdered with bars or rows of ermine (*i.e.*, narrow pieces of black fur), according to their degree, viz. :—

- Barons, two rows.
- Viscounts, two rows and a half.
- Earls, three rows.
- Marquesses, three rows and a half.
- Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top; and no jewels or precious stones are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeit pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have on the circle or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquis to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

THE Earl Marshal's Order concerning the Robes, Coronets, &c., which are to be worn by the Peeresses at the Coronation of Their Most Sacred Majesties King George the Fifth and Queen Mary.

These are to give notice to all Peeresses who attend at the Coronation of Their Majesties, that the robes or mantles appertaining to their respective ranks are to be worn over the usual full Court dress.

That the robe or mantle of a Baroness be of crimson velvet, the cape whereof to be furred with miniver pure, and powdered with two bars or rows of ermine (*i.e.*, narrow pieces of black fur); the said mantle to be edged round with miniver pure two inches in breadth, and the train to be three feet on the ground; the coronet to be according to her degree, *viz.*:—a rim or circle with six pearls (represented by silver balls) upon the same, not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, only the cape powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches as before, and the train a yard and a quarter; the coronet to be according to her degree, *viz.*:—a rim or circle with pearls (represented by silver balls) thereon, sixteen in number, and not raised upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half; the coronet to be composed of eight pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points or rays, with small strawberry leaves between, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three quarters; the coronet to be composed of four strawberry leaves and four pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points of the same height as the leaves, alternately, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, only the cape powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards; the coronet to be composed of eight strawberry leaves, all of equal height, above the rim.

And that the caps of all the said coronets be of crimson velvet, turned up with ermine, with a tassel of gold on the top.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, the following translations of five Circulars, issued

by the Imperial and Royal Marine Board at Trieste on dates from October 6 to 12:—

Owing to cases of cholera having been verified in Southern Italy and Russia, the importation and transit of the following goods and articles from Bari and Foggia, in Italy, and from Russia, is, by Ordinance of the 28th September, 1910 (B.L.J. No. 172 & 173), of the Ministries of the Interior, Commerce, and Finance, in accord with the Royal Hungarian Government, prohibited:—

(1) Used body-linen, old and worn clothes (personal effects), used bed-linen.

Whenever such articles are forwarded as luggage, or owing to change of domicile, they will be subjected, on crossing the frontier, to the special regulations prescribed by the sanitary police for their examination and treatment.

(2) Shreds and rags (Stracci e cenci), with exception of those hydraulically pressed, imported for wholesale commerce.

The importation of fresh shreddings from spinning, weaving, clothing, and bleaching manufactories, artificial wool, shoddy, and cuttings from new paper is, however, permitted.

The transit of the aforesaid goods is allowed when they are packed in such manner as to preclude all danger of contamination during the journey. The present Ordinance enters into force on the day of its receipt by the relative custom-houses and port and maritime offices.

The above is participated for instruction and guidance, with the observation that the aforesaid goods, in common with those suspected which may be imported into the Austrian Monarchy during the time the present Ordinance remains in force, will be removed to the nearest Lazaretto at the expense of the parties concerned, and there subjected to disinfection or destruction—as the Authorities may decide—at the expense of such parties. No account will be taken of the depreciation the goods may suffer, neither will any claim for compensation be allowed.

In partial modification of the Circular d.d. of September 30 last, No. 2451 2, which entered into effect by telegraphic order of the Imperial and Royal Ministry of Commerce d.d. of October 6 inst. No. 29810, it is ordained as follows:—

Passengers proceeding from towns or places in Hungary infected with Cholera shall be subjected at place of arrival to a sanitary surveillance of five days. To this end passengers from towns or places in Hungary infected with Cholera will have to submit to a medical visit at port of arrival.

The following towns or places shall be considered as being infected with Cholera:—
Pressburg, town, Comitatus *Bacs-Bodrog*: Ada, Bacsszentiván, Obecse, Temerin; *Baranya*: Csuza, Kisköszeg, Vörösmart, Lányosök, Mohacs; *Esztergom* (Gran): *Fejér* (Stunlweissenburg): Nagyperkata, Raczalmás; *Győr* (Raab): Györgyö Nagybajes, Zamoly; *Komárom* (Komorn): Acz, Bagota, Duna Almás, Kiskessi, Szöny; *Post-Pilis-Solt-Hiskum*: Békásmegyör, Ercsi, Kalocsa, Dunnegyháza, Dunavecse, Harta, Tökö, Kunszentmiklos; *Possony* (Pressburg): Doborgar, Pénteksür, Püspöki, Ujnelyjoka; Tolna: Duna

Földvar, Duna Könöld, Szegzard, *Torontal*, Crepaja Torontalmäs; Zala: Múrahely.

Against Fiume, which is not to be considered as being infected with Cholera, no measure will be taken except in the case that the master of a vessel proceeding from that port reports that on board there are passengers from the above-mentioned towns or places. In such case a medical visit will take place on the port of entry and a sanitary surveillance of five days at the place of arrival.

Owing to the appearance of Cholera in Hungary, the Ministry of the Interior, in accord with the Ministry of Commerce and of Agriculture, has thought it proper to prohibit—until further notice—the entry and transit from Hungary of the following goods:—

(1) Used body-linen: old and worn clothes (personal effects), used bed-linen.

Whenever such articles are forwarded as luggage, or owing to change of domicile, they will be subjected on crossing the frontier to the special regulations prescribed by the sanitary police for their examination and treatment.

(2) Shreds and rags:—

From this prohibition are excepted:—

(a) Shreds and rags hydraulically pressed, shipped for wholesale commerce in iron-hooped bales.

(b) New shreddings proceeding directly from spinning, weaving, clothing and bleaching factories, artificial wool (*shoddy*) and cuttings from new paper.

The transit of the goods mentioned in 1 and 2 is, however, allowed if packed in such manner as to preclude all danger of contamination during the journey.

(3) Fresh fruits and vegetables, as also milk, cannot be detained at the frontier if it be shown, by means of certificates of origin issued by the proper Royal Hungarian Authorities, that they do not proceed from places infected with Cholera.

REGULATIONS AS TO PLAGUE.

DESTRUCTION OF RATS.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons of the City of London ;—

To the Councils of the several Metropolitan Boroughs ;—

To the Councils of the several Municipal Boroughs and other Urban Districts ;—

To the Councils of the several Rural Districts ;—

To the several Port Sanitary Authorities ;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas we, the Local Government Board, are empowered by the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended to London by the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and as amended by the Public Health Act, 1896, from time to time to make, alter and revoke such Regulations as to us may seem fit, with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, or any other epidemic, endemic, or infectious disease, and preventing the spread of Cholera and such other diseases, as well on the seas, rivers and waters of the United Kingdom, and on the high seas within three miles of the coasts thereof, as on land, and for guarding against the spread of disease; and may provide for the enforcement and execution of such Regulations:

Now therefore, we, the Local Government Board, do, by this our Order, and in the exercise

of the powers conferred on us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, and the Public Health Act, 1896, and every other power enabling us in that behalf, make the following Regulations, and declare that the said Regulations shall apply and have effect throughout England and Wales, and shall be enforced and executed by the Authorities, officers and servants herein-after mentioned :—

ARTICLE I.—In this Order—

The expression "Local Authority" means the Common Council of the City of London, the Council of each Metropolitan Borough, the Council of each Municipal Borough or other Urban District, the Council of each Rural District and each Port Sanitary Authority ;

The expression "District" means the District of a Local Authority.

ARTICLE II.—In any district in which a representation is made to the Local Authority that rats in the district are infected or threatened with plague, or that there is an unusual mortality among rats in the district, the Local Authority shall report the matter to us, and shall take measures (a) for the destruction of all rats in the district and (b) for preventing the entrance of rats into buildings and other premises in the district.

ARTICLE III.—For the purposes of these Regulations the Local Authority may appoint such additional officers or servants as they may deem necessary, and may delegate to such officers or servants any powers under these Regulations.

ARTICLE IV.—The expenses incurred by a Local Authority in the execution of these Regulations shall be defrayed in the case of a Local Authority which is a Sanitary Authority for the execution of the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, as part of their expenses in the execution of that Act, and in the case of any other Local Authority as part of their general expenses in the execution of the Public Health Acts.
