For Dissolving the present Parliament, and declaring the Calling of another.

GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to dissolve this present Parliament which stands prorogued to Thursday, the fifteenth day of December next: We do, for that End, publish this Our Royal Proclamation, and do hereby dissolve the said Parliament accordingly: and the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs, of the House of Commons, are discharged from their Meeting and Attendance on the said Thursday, the fifteenth day of December next: and We being desirous and resolved, as soon as may be, to meet Our People, and to have their Advice in Parliament, do hereby make known to all Our loving Subjects Our Royal Will and Pleasure to call a new Parliament: and do hereby further declare that, with the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have given Order that Our Chancellor of that Part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain and Our Chancellor of Ireland do respectively, upon Notice thereof, forthwith issue out Writs,

in due form and according to Law, for calling a new Parliament: and We do hereby also, by this Our Royal Proclamation under Our Great Seal of Our United Kingdom, require Writs forthwith to be issued accordingly by Our said Chancellors respectively, for causing the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons who are to serve in the said Parliament to be duly returned to, and give their Attendance in, Our said Parliament on Tuesday, the thirty-first day of January next, which Writs are to be returnable in due course of Law.

In order to the Electing and Summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland.

GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS We have in Our Council thought fit to declare Our pleasure for summoning and holding a Parliament of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and

Ireland on Tuesday, the thirty-first day of January next ensuing the date hereof: In order, therefore, to the electing and summoning the Sixteen Peers of Scotland who are to sit in the House of Peers in the said Parliament, We do, by the Advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland to assemble and meet at Holyrood House, in Edinburgh, on Thursday, the fifteenth day of December next, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to nominate and choose the Sixteen Peers to sit and vote in the House of Peers in the said ensuing Parliament by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall be then present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing a mandate in writing duly signed before witnesses, and both the con-stituent and proxy being qualified according to law); and the Lord Clerk Register and the two Principal Clerks of the Session appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to take the votes of the said Peers, and immediately after such election made and duly examined to certify the names of the sixteen Peers so elected, and to sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into Our High Court of Chancery of Great Britain: And We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, strictly command and require the Lord Provost of Edinburgh, and all other the Magistrates of the said City, to take especial care to preserve the peace thereof during the time of the said election, and to prevent all manner of riots, tumults, disorders, and violence whatsoever: And We strictly charge and command that this Our Royal Proclamation be duly published at the Market Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, ten days at least before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed to such election.

For a Public Holiday.

HEREAS We did, by Our Royal Proclamation, dated the seventh day of November instant, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Bank Holidays Act, 1871," command that Tuesday, the twenty-seventh day of December next, be observed as a Bank Holiday throughout those parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Wales, and Ireland, and every part thereof: And whereas We consider it desirable that the said twenty-seventh day of December next should be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the said parts of Our United Kingdom: Now, therefore, We do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of "The Holidays Extension Act, 1875," and "The Customs Consolidation Act, 1876," appoint Tuesday, the

twenty-seventh day of December next as a special day to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the said parts of Our United Kingdom called England and Wales, and Ireland, and every part thereof, and We do by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly.

A PROCLAMATION

Determining New Designs for Gold and Bronze Coins.

GEORGE R.I.

HEREAS under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, from time to time by proclamation to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the gold and bronze coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the

Coinage Act, 1870:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1. The designs for the said gold and bronze

coins shall be as follows:-

GOLD Coins.

(1) Five-Pound Piece.—Every five-pound piece shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS V DEI GRA: BRITT: OMN: REX FID: DEF: IND: IMP:" and for the reverse the image of Saint George armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year, with a graining upon the edge.

(2) Two-Pound Piece.—Every two-pound piece shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the

edge.

(3) Sovereign.—Every sovereign shall have for the obverse impression the aforesaid effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS V D.G. BRITT: OMN: REX F. D. IND: IMP: "and for the reverse the same impression in all respects as the five-pound piece, with a graining upon the edge.

pound piece, with a graining upon the edge.

(4) Half-Sovereign.—Every half-sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the sovereign, with a graining upon the edge.

Bronze Coins.

(1) Penny.—Every penny shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS V DEI GRA: BRITT: OMN: REX FID: DEF: IND: IMP: "and for the reverse impression the figure of Britannia seated on a rock surrounded by the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock,

while in her left hand she grasps a trident, and the inscription "one penny," with the date of

the year and a plain edge.

(2) Half-penny.—Every half-penny shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated as described for the penny, and the inscription "HALF-PENNY," with the date of the year and a plain edge.

date of the year and a plain edge.

(3) Farthing.—Every farthing shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the figure of Britannia seated as described for the penny, and the inscription "FARTHING," with the date of the year and a plain edge.

2. This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January, one thousand nine

hundred and eleven.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Molash, in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Molash is vested for an estate in fee simple in possession free from incumbrances in certain trustees upon trust in the first place for

Charles Stewart Hardy of Chilham Castle in the said county of Kent, esquire, during his life, and the said Charles Stewart Hardy is therefore the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant.

"And whereas the said Charles Stewart Hardy is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Molash should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury, in

right of his See.

And whereas the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

" And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Molash which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say in the

parish of Molash.

" Now therefore, with the consent of the said Charles Stewart Hardy, being the person whose consent as patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and six (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this and with the consent of the said scheme) Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Molash as aforesaid shall be transferred to the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors in the same Archbishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and by his successors in the same Archbishoprick for

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Canterbury.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, in the county

of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark.
"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the twenty-second day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight and being under our common seal and under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson, then Bishop of Rochester, a certain part of the parish of Nutfield, in the said county of Surrey, and at that time in the diocese of Rochester but now in the said diocese of Southwark, was assigned as a particular district to the consecrated church called Christ Church, situate at Lower Nutfield, in the said parish of Nutfield, and such particular district was called the particular district of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield.'

And whereas the said particular district of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, has under the provisions of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, become a new parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, and by the above-mentioned Act of the thirtysecond and thirty-third years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-four.

And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of

Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed | and sealed this scheme or representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said parish of Nutfield, which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the herein-before mentioned Acts or of any of them or of

any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the parish of Nutfield, in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Southwark, and to be annexed to the new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, in the same county and diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said parish of Nutfield, which is bounded upon the south and upon part of the west by the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west, upon the north, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield, from the said parish of Nutfield, at the point where the footpath leading from Sandylane joins Mid-street, and extending thence first north-eastward and then northward along the middle of Mid-street for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the southern side of Little Cormongers Farm to Porter's Barn, and extending thence generally eastward along the middle of the last-mentioned footpath for a distance of thirteen chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the fence forming the eastern boundary of the close numbered 244 upon the Ordnance Map of the civil parish of Nutfield published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this scheme or representation, and extending thence first south-westward, then south-eastward, and then again south-westward, along the fences forming the eastern and southern boundaries of the said close for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Nutfield from the said new parish of Christ Church, Lower Nutfield.''

And whereas drafts of the said scheme or representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such scheme or representation,

and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Southwark.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Matthew, Highfield, situate within the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Pemberton, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Pemberton and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint James, Wigan, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new

parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Pemberton, and of the said new parish of Saint James, Wigan, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Matthew, Highfield, situate as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Francis James, Bishop of Liverpool, as such Bishop, with the consent of the Reverend Roland George Matthew,

Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Liverpool, rector or incumbent of the rectory of the parish of Wigan in the said county and diocese, and, as such rector or incumbent, the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Pemberton, and with the consent of James Carlton Eckersley, of Carlton Manor, Yeadon, Leeds, esquire, as the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint James, Wigan (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those continguous portions of the said new parish of Pemberton and of the said new parish of Saint James, Wigan, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Matthew, Highfield, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Matthew, Highfield.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall

"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Pemberton, in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon part of the north and upon the north-east by the new parish of Saint Mark, Newtown, Pemberton, upon the east by the new parish (sometime district) of Saint James, Wigan, upon the south by the parish of Ashton in Makerfield, upon the west partly by the new parish of Billinge and partly by the new parish of Upholland, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the northwest and upon the remaining part of the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said new parish of Upholland from the said new parish of Pemberton crosses the middle of the Liverpool, Bolton, and Bury line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the footpath leading from Highfield into Smethurst-lane across the said line of railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of eleven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Smethurst-lane, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Smethurstlane and of Sandon-street (which runs in continuation thereof) for a distance in all of twenty-five chains or thereabouts to the junction of Sandon-street with Ormskirk-road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Ormskirk-road for a distance of thirteen chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said new parish of Pemberton from the said new parish of Saint Mark, Newtown, Pemberton.

Earls, three rows.
Marquesses, three rows and a half.
Dukes, four rows.

The said mantles or robes to be worn over full Court dress, uniform, or regimentals.

The coronets to be of silver gilt; the caps of crimson velvet turned up with ermine, with a gold tassel on the top; and no jewels or precious stones are to be set or used in the coronets, or counterfeit pearls instead of silver balls.

The coronet of a Baron to have on the circle or rim, six silver balls at equal distances.

The coronet of a Viscount to have, on the circle, sixteen silver balls.

The coronet of an Earl to have, on the circle, eight silver balls, raised upon points, with gold strawberry leaves between the points.

The coronet of a Marquis to have, on the circle, four gold strawberry leaves and four silver balls alternately, the latter a little raised on points above the rim.

The coronet of a Duke to have, on the circle, eight gold strawberry leaves.

That the robe or mantle of a Viscountess be like that of a Baroness, only the cape powdered with two rows and a half of ermine, the edging of the mantle two inches as before, and the train a yard and a quarter; the coronet to be according to her degree, viz.:—a rim or circle with pearls (represented by silver balls) thereon, sixteen in number, and not raised

upon points.

That the robe or mantle of a Countess be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows of ermine, the edging three inches in breadth, and the train a yard and a half; the coronet to be composed of eight pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points or rays, with small strawberry leaves between, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Marchioness be as before, only the cape powdered with three rows and a half of ermine, the edging four inches in breadth, the train a yard and three quarters; the coronet to be composed of four strawberry leaves and four pearls (represented by silver balls) raised upon points of the same height as the leaves, alternately, above the rim.

That the robe or mantle of a Duchess be as before, only the cape powdered with four rows of ermine, the edging five inches broad, the train two yards; the coronet to be composed of eight strawberry leaves, all of equal height, above the rim.

And that the caps of all the said coronets be of crimson velvet, turned up with ermine, with a tassel of gold on the top.

PORT OF LONDON.

Any rats caught on board the vessel shall be killed, then placed in a bucket of strong disinfecting solution, and afterwards burnt in the vessel's furnace. rats, alive or dead, shall be removed from the vessel. For any breach of this bye-law the master of the vessel shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

3. When the discharge of cargo or the landing or embarking of passengers is not proceeding one gangway only shall be permitted to afford means of communication between any vessel and the shore. The end of the gangway near the vessel shall be whitened for a length of 10 feet. For any breach of this bye-law the master of the vessel shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.




