WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of *Callow*, in the county of *Hereford*, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the *Burial Act, 1853*, made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of *Callow* aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz. :—

CALLOW.—Forthwith and entirely in the church of *Saint Mary*, in the parish of *Callow*, in the county of *Hereford*; and in the churchyard, with the following exceptions, that is to say :—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented :

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave :

(c) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave :

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the fourth day of *January* next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the

parishes affected by such representation one month before the said fourth day of January.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty chapter one hundred and fourteen, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the thirteenth day of October, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirty-third and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirty-nine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice') of Thorney Abbey, in the county of Cambridge, and in the diocese of Ely.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Thorney Abbey is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in certain trustees upon trust in the first place for Herbrand, eleventh Duke of Bedford, a Knight of the Most Noble Order of the Garter (hereinafter called the said Duke of Bedford), for his life, and the said Duke of Bedford is therefore the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said benefice in case the same were now vacant.

"And whereas the said Duke of Bedford is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Thorney Abbey should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, now Bishop of Ely, in right of his See.

"And whereas the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese, which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, has executed this scheme as hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Thorney Abbey which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the parish of Thorney Abbey.

"Now therefore with the consent of the said Duke of Bedford, being the person whose consent as patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the first and second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Thorney Abbey shall be transferred to the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, and by his successors in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a rectory) of Welby, in the county of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln, between that benefice and four other benefices, namely, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Alford with Rigsby, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Caistor with Clixby and Holton le Moor, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint John the Evangelist, Glamford Bridge, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Swineshead, all of which said last named benefices are situate in the said county of Lincoln and in the said Diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas the Bishop of the said Diocese of Lincoln is the patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Welby and also of the said four benefices of Alford with Rigsby, Caistor with Clixby and Holton le Moor, Saint John the Evangelist, Glamford Bridge, and Swineshead.

"And whereas the present endowments of the said benefice of Welby comprise amongst other things the sum of twenty-one thousand five hundred and eighty-eight pounds thirteen shillings and four pence Metropolitan three pounds per centum per annum Stock held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the rector or incumbent of the said benefice of Welby and as part of the endowments of the same benefice.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said four benefices of Alford with Rigsby, Caistor with Clixby and Holton le Moor, Saint John the Evangelist, Glamford Bridge, and Swineshead are at present insufficiently endowed, and that after the transfer to or for the benefit of the vicars or incumbents of the said four benefices of such portions of the said sum of Metropolitan three pounds per centum per annum Stock as are hereinafter mentioned, the said benefice of Welby will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lincoln, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the parish of Alford with Rigsby, the parish of Caistor with Clixby and Holton le Moor, the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Glamford Bridge, and the parish of Swineshead, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Welby which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Welby is now full.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said five benefices are situate (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archi-

episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lincoln, acting as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of each of the said five benefices as aforesaid (in testimony of which consent he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said benefice of Welby shall from whatsoever cause be next avoided a sum of five thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence Metropolitan three pounds per centum per annum Stock (being part of the said sum of twenty-one thousand five hundred and eighty-eight pounds thirteen shillings and four pence Metropolitan three pounds per centum per annum Stock) shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said benefice of Welby and shall be divided into four equal parts and one such part, namely, a sum of one thousand three hundred and thirty-three pounds six shillings and eight pence Metropolitan three pounds per centum per annum Stock, shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for and for the benefit of the vicar or incumbent of each of the said benefices of Alford with Rigsby, Caistor with Clixby and Holton le Moor, Saint John the Evangelist, Glamford Bridge, and Swineshead, and as part of the endowments of that benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth

and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for authorizing the sale and disposal of certain property in the parish of Southfleet, in the county of Kent, now vested in us.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an indenture bearing date the thirty-first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and one, and made or expressed to be made between Clarence Filmer Collard and Mabel, the wife of Dick Harrison, of the one part, and us, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, of the other part, the lands and hereditaments described in the schedule hereto annexed became with their appurtenances and are now vested in us in fee simple for the purposes and subject to the provisions applicable to other hereditaments vested in us.

"And whereas the lands and hereditaments aforesaid are not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but are now in our possession, but some portions thereof on account of their character or situation are unsuitable or inconvenient to be held or applied for the purposes for which estates vested in us are applicable under the Acts by which our proceedings are governed;

"And whereas with a view to the advantageous appropriation of the same or of the proceeds thereof, for the ultimate improvement of our common fund, it is expedient that the said lands and hereditaments, or such part or parts thereof as we shall at any time and from time to time think fit, should be sold or disposed of, and accordingly that we should be empowered to sell or dispose of our interest in such lands and hereditaments or in any part or parts thereof in such manner as shall appear to us advisable.

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose that we may be authorized and empowered by instrument or instruments, in writing, duly executed according to law, from time to time to sell or dispose of and duly to convey according to the provisions of the said Act, all or any part of the said lands, tenements, and hereditaments so vested in us as aforesaid, with their appurtenances, and all our estate right, title, and interest therein, or in any part or parts thereof unto and to the use of any person or persons desirous or willing to purchase the same, and his, her, or their heirs, executors, administrators, or assigns, or otherwise, as he or they shall direct or appoint and for such consideration as shall, upon due calculation and inquiry, appear to us to be just and reasonable, it being our intention to invest the proceeds of such sale from time to time, as occasion may arise, in the purchase of other lands, tithes, rent-charges, tenements, or hereditaments, or of some estate or interest therein convenient to be held by us for the purposes of the Acts by which our proceedings are governed as aforesaid, and in the meantime to invest the said proceeds in some Government or Parliamentary Stock or other public securities in England.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference:—

"All those pieces or parcels of land containing together fifty-two acres three roods and twenty-one perches or thereabouts more or less, together with the messuage or tenement and cottages and buildings erected and being thereon situate in the parish of Southfleet, in the county of Kent, more particularly delineated and coloured red on the plan drawn in the margin of the said indenture."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria's reign (shortly entitled "The Judicial Committee Act, 1844"), it was enacted that it should be competent to Her Majesty by any Order or Orders in Council to provide for the admission of Appeals to Her Majesty in Council from any judgment, sentences, decrees, or orders of any Court of Justice within any British Colony or Possession abroad, although such Court should not be a Court of Errors or Appeal within such Colony or Possession, and to make provision for the instituting and prosecuting of such Appeals and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as Her Majesty in Council should pronounce thereon:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 26th day of November, 1892, provision was made for the prosecution and regulation of Appeals from the Court of Queen's Bench of the Province of Manitoba in the Dominion of Canada to Her Majesty in Council:

And whereas by an Act of the said Province of Manitoba passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King Edward VII, and being Chapter 18, entitled "An Act respecting a Court of Appeal for Manitoba and to amend the King's Bench Act" there was enacted and now exists a Court of Appeal for Manitoba called "The Court of Appeal" consisting of a Chief Justice styled Chief Justice of Manitoba, and three other judges called Judges of Appeal, which Act provided that after the coming into force thereof the said Court of Appeal should be vested with and should exercise all the rights, power, and duties theretofore held, exercised, and enjoyed under and by virtue of "The King's Bench Act" or any other statute of the said Province or of the Dominion of Canada by the Court of King's

Bench sitting *en banc* and as a Court of Appeal from the judgment, decision, order, or decree of a single Judge, or verdict of a jury or of a County Court Judge, or verdict of a County Court jury, and that the said Court of King's Bench should cease to have or exercise any appellate jurisdiction, and that thereafter all applications for new trials and all Appeals of the nature of those which had theretofore been heard and disposed of by or before the Court of King's Bench sitting *en banc* should be brought before and heard and disposed of by the Court of Appeal created by said Act:

And whereas no provision has yet been made for the prosecution and regulation of Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the said Court of Appeal:

And whereas it is expedient with a view to equalizing as far as may be the conditions under which His Majesty's subjects beyond the Seas shall have a right of appeal to His Majesty in Council, and to promoting uniformity in the practice and procedure in all such Appeals, that the said Order in Council dated the 26th day of November, 1892, should be revoked and that provision should be made for Appeals from the Court of Appeal of Manitoba to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council dated the 26th day of November, 1892, be, and the same is hereby revoked, and that the Rules hereunder set out shall regulate all Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the Court of Appeal of the Province of Manitoba.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:—

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty in Council;

"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

"Judgment" includes decree, order, sentence or decision;

"Court" means either the Full Court or a single Judge of the Court of Appeal for Manitoba, according as the matter in question is one which, under the Rules and Practice of the said Court, properly appertains to the full Court or to a single Judge;

"Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal;

"Registrar" means the Registrar or other proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie—

(a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £1,000 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of £1,000 sterling or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise,

ought to be submitted to His Majesty in Council for decision.

3. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the judges, the final judgment may be entered *pro forma* on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Chief Justice or, in his absence, of the senior puisne Judge of the Court, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an Appeal therefrom, and not for any other purpose.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance—

(a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500, for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and for the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant's not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of his Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and

(b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reasonable to impose.

6. When the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal upon such terms as to the Court shall seem just, and in case the Court shall direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.

7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may require.

8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care to avoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other

merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.

9. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the Record, as finally printed (whether in Canada or in England), shall with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule hereto. It may be so printed either in Canada or in England.

11. Where the Record is printed in Canada the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal, if any, of the Court.

12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

13. Where part of the Record is printed in Canada and part is to be printed in England, Rules 11 and 12 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in Canada and such as are to be printed in England respectively.

14. The reasons given by the judge, or any of the judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such judge or judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the same time when the Record is transmitted.

15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single order.

16. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and otherwise as the Court may direct.

17. Where an Appellant, having obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal, and having complied with the conditions imposed on him by such order, fails thereafter to apply with due diligence to the Court for an order granting him final leave to appeal, the Court may, on an application in that behalf made by the Respondent, rescind the order granting conditional leave to appeal, notwithstanding the Appellant's compliance with the

conditions imposed by such order, and may give such directions as to the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant as the Court shall think fit, or make such further or other order in the premises as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

18. On an application for final leave to appeal, the Court may inquire whether notice, or sufficient notice, of the application has been given by the Appellant to all parties concerned, and if not satisfied as to the notices given may defer the granting of the final leave to appeal, or may give such other directions in the matter as, in the opinion of the Court, the justice of the case requires.

19. An Appellant who has obtained final leave to appeal shall prosecute his Appeal in accordance with the Rules for the time being regulating the general practice and procedure in Appeals to His Majesty in Council.

20. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, desires, prior to the despatch of the Record to England, to withdraw his Appeal, the Court may, upon an application in that behalf made by the Appellant, grant him a certificate to the effect that the Appeal has been withdrawn, and the Appeal shall thereupon be deemed, as from the date of such certificate, to stand dismissed without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

21. Where an Appellant, having obtained final leave to appeal, fails to show due diligence in taking all necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the despatch of the Record to England, the Respondent may, after giving the Appellant due notice of his intended application, apply to the Court for a Certificate that the Appeal has not been effectually prosecuted by the Appellant, and if the Court see fit to grant such a Certificate, the Appeal shall be deemed, as from the date of such Certificate, to stand dismissed for non-prosecution without express Order of His Majesty in Council, and the costs of the Appeal and the security entered into by the Appellant shall be dealt with in such manner as the Court may think fit to direct.

22. Where at any time between the date of the order granting final leave to appeal and the despatch of the Record to England the Record becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court may, notwithstanding the order granting final leave to appeal, on an application in that behalf made by any person interested, grant a certificate showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper person to be substituted or entered on the Record in place of, or in addition to, the party who has died, or undergone a change of status, and the name of such person shall thereupon be deemed to be so substituted or entered on the Record as aforesaid without express Order of His Majesty in Council.

23. Where the Record subsequently to its despatch to England becomes defective by reason of the death, or change of status, of a party to the Appeal, the Court shall, upon an application in that behalf made by any person interested, cause a certificate to be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council showing who, in the opinion of the Court, is the proper

person to be substituted, or entered, on the Record, in the place of, or in addition to, the party who has died or undergone a change of status.

24. The Case of each party to the Appeal may be printed either in Canada or in England and shall, in either event, be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule hereto, every tenth line thereof being numbered in the margin, and shall be signed by at least one of the Counsel who attends at the hearing of the Appeal, or who attended at the hearing before the Court of Appeal for Manitoba, or by the party himself if he conducts his Appeal in person.

25. The Case shall consist of paragraphs numbered consecutively and shall state, as concisely as possible, the circumstances out of which the Appeal arises, the contentions to be urged by the party lodging the same, and the reasons of appeal. References by page and line to the relevant portions of the Record as printed shall, as far as practicable, be printed in the margin, and care shall be taken to avoid, as far as possible, the reprinting in the case of long extracts from the Record. The taxing officer, in taxing the costs of the Appeal, shall, either of his own motion, or at the instance of the opposite party, inquire into any unnecessary prolixity in the Case, and shall disallow the costs occasioned thereby.

26. Where the Judicial Committee directs a party to bear the costs of an Appeal incurred in Manitoba, such costs shall be taxed by the proper officer of the Court in accordance with the rules for the time being regulating taxation in the Court.

27. The Court shall conform with, and execute any Order which His Majesty in Council may think fit to make on an Appeal from a judgment of the Court in like manner as any original judgment of the Court should or might have been executed.

28. Nothing in these Rules contained shall be deemed to interfere with the right of His Majesty, upon the humble Petition of any person aggrieved by any judgment of the Court, to admit his Appeal therefrom upon such conditions as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to impose.

WHEREAS by Section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the Pluralities Act, 1850, it is, amongst other

things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the First day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:

"That the Right Reverend Herbert Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester as Bishop of the diocese within which are situate the rectory of Mottison with the vicarage of Shorwell and the rectory of Kingston both in the county of Hants having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed fifteen hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice, We enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and that Francis Hervey commonly called Lord Francis Hervey, Hugh Richard Heathcote Cecil commonly called Lord Hugh Cecil, and Sidney Graves Hamilton being the patrons or persons

entitled to present to the said Benefice of Mottiston with Shorwell in case the same were now vacant and also to the said benefice of Kingston, the same being now vacant, have consented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he or she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no sufficient cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Winchester, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consents in writing of the said Lord Francis Hervey, Lord Hugh Cecil and Sidney Graves Hamilton as patrons of both the said benefices and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consents aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice for cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

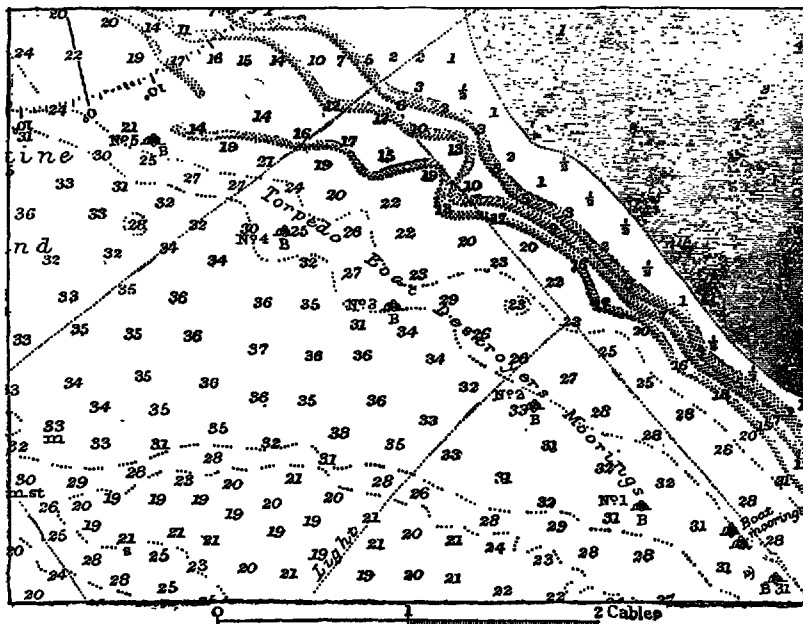
