"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of All Saints, Sydenham, is vested in

the Bishop of Southwark in right of his See.
"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bell Green, Lower Sydenham, is vested in the vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Bartholomew, Sydenham, in the said county of Kent and in the said diocese of Southwark; as such vicar or incumbent.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the new parish of Upton, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Upton is a cure wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said new parish of Upton, which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas William Lavers, deceased, late of Upton Leigh, Torquay, in the county of Devon, did by his will dated the twenty-seventh day of August, in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and proved in the Principal Registry of the Probate Division of the High Court of Justice on the tenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, bequeath to the executors and trustees of the said will, such a sum as will produce an income of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum, such income to be applied for or towards the endowment of the church which is proposed to be erected upon a certain piece of land in the Upton Valley, and to be known as the church of Saint James when the locality shall have been constituted a

separate parish under the hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said piece of land is about to be conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for the said intended church, and it is our intention that such church when duly consecrated shall become the church of the separate district which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, which district will thereupon become a separate parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas John Williams Matthews, of Frankfort Chambers, Plymouth, solicitor, and Henry Cooke, of No. 1, Copthall Buildings, in the city of London, solicitor, the present trustees of the said will, have transferred the sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds Great Western Railway four pounds per centum per annum debenture stock into our names to be held in trust by us as and for a permanent endowment for the minister of the said proposed district and when the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act then for the incumbent of the said new parish, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed according to the hereinbefore mentioned Act.

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of stock and to be receivable by the said minister or incumbent for the time being will amount to not less than the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand seven hundred and fifty pounds Great Western Railway four pounds per centum per annum debenture stock has been so transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas by an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice, dated the sixth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and eight, it was declared that the perpetual presentation to the parish proposed to be created in accordance with the said will is vested in the Church Patronage Trustees.

"And whereas in pursuance of and for the purpose of effectuating the said Order, the said John Williams Matthews and the said Henry Cooke have nominated the present Church Patronage Trustees as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed separate district shall be assigned, that is to say, Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard-street, in the city of London, Esquire, John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin-lane, in the city of London, banker, the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, of Kersal Rectory, Manchester, clerk in Holy Orders, the Reverend Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, of Holy Trinity Vicarage, Cambridge, clerk in Holy Orders, and the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of Holy Trinity Vicarage, Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex, clerk in Holy Orders.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Archibald, now Bishop of Exeter (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said new parish of Upton, which is more particularly described in the schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint James, Upton, Torquay.'

quay.' him we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Church Patronage Trustees, that is to say, the said Francis Augustus Bevan, John Francis William Deacon, Ernest Newton Sharpe, Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, and Edward Grose Hodge, being the said Church Patronage Trustees, and their heirs

and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Act or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint James, Upton, Torquay, being: all that part of the new parish (sometime district) of Upton, in the county of Devon and in the diocese of Exeter, which is bounded upon the west and upon the northwest by the parish of Tormoham, upon the north-east by the parish of Saint Mary Church, upon the south-east by the new parish of Ellacombe, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Ellacombe from the said new parish of Upton at the junction of Saint Mary Church-road, Bronshill-road and the road called Mudge's Hill, and extending thence first south-westward then north-westward and then again south-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lymington-road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Lymingtonroad for a distance of six chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading across the Upton Valley Pleasure Ground into Upton-road, and extending thence northwestward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upton-road, and extending thence north-eastward along the

middle of Upton-road for a distance of two chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Tor Vale, and extending thence first north-westward and then southwestward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of eight chains or thereabouts to its junction with Teignmouthroad upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Upton from the said parish of Tormoham."

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of November, 1910, in the words following, viz.:

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions and other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by His late Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the twelfth day of August, 1907, provision is made for an increase of the retired pay of Naval Officers who are placed on the Retired List whilst serving on the staff of the Inspection and Experimental Departments or in posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments:

"And whereas we are of opinion that rules should be framed to govern the employment in such appointments of Officers of Your Majesty's Corps of Royal Marines:

We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the follow-

ing regulations:

"(a) Officers of the Royal Marines to be eligible equally with Officers of the Royal Navy for appointment to posts in the Inspection and Experimental Departments, and to posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments:

(b) Royal Marine Officers so appointed to be seconded for such duties under the same conditions as apply to Officers seconded for duty in the Army Ordnance Department, and if retained permanently to remain seconded until they reach the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel, when they should become supernumerary, being subject to the same rules as regards qualification for promotion and retirement for age in any rank as other Officers of the Royal Marines:

"(c) Royal Marine Officers so employed to be retired, in any event, on completing six years' service as Lieutenant-Colonel:

"(d) Royal Marine Officers permanently

Les Autorités Sanitaires ont pris sans retard toutes les mesures nécessaires pour empêcher la propagation de l'épidémie. L'auberge où les décès se sont produits a été de suite évacué et toutes les personnes, au nombre de 27, qui s'y trouvaient ont été isolées et mis en surveillance à l'hôpital de la ville. Parmi ces personnes on a constaté, dans la nuit du 5 au 6 Novembre, un troisième cas de choléra. Le malade qui a été mis en traitement à l'hôpital de l'Etat, à Varna, se trouve actuellement en bonne voie de guérison.

Depuis le 6 novembre aucun nouveau cas de choléra n'a été signalé et les voyageurs de l l'auberge qui ont été isolés se trouvent en bonne

santé.

Etant donné les mesures très rigoureuses qui ont été prises en temps voulu, la Direction du Service Sanitaire est convaincu que l'épidémie ne se propagera pas et aura totalement disparu dans le bref délai.

PARISH OF SAINT MARY ABBOTS, KENSINGTON.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington:-

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS, by a General Order, dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of out-door relief to poor persons in the said Parish;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Parish:

THEREFORE, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows;

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Parish of Saint Mary Abbots, Kensington, may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolu-

ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the Workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse.

- (2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the Workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the Workhouse, shall not be absent from the Workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.
- (3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the Workhouse without any contravention of sub-division (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the Workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the Thirtieth day of April, One thousand nine hundred and eleven.


