#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. Four Courts will be held between May 7th and June 22nd next. No Courts will be held before May 7th.
- 2. Ladies who have been presented and who wish to be summoned to one of these Courts are requested to make a written application to The Lord Chamberlain, St. James's Palace, S.W., as soon as possible after the 2nd January Next, but not before that date.
- 3. A lady attending a Court may present one lady, for whom she must be responsible, in addition to her daughter on daughter-in-law. The names of ladies to be presented should be forwarded by the lady who wishes to make the presentation when she sends in her own name.
- 4. A lady presented for the first time can only present her daughter or daughter-in-law at the Court at which she is presented.
- 5. No applications can be received from ladies who wish to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the ladies who wish to make the presentations.

- 6. Ladies may be accompanied to Court by their husbands if the latter have been presented, but gentlemen do not pass before the King and Queen. Ladies are requested to forward the names of their husbands at the same time as their own in order that they may be submitted together, as, once the summons has been issued, the amending of a summons card in order to include a lady's husband can only be permitted under the most exceptional circumstances.
- 7. Summonses are issued about three weeks before the date of each Court, and should it not be convenient for a lady to attend the particular Court to which she is summoned, it will be open to her to make her excuses to the Lord Chamberlain in writing, when her name can, if desired, and if possible, be transferred to another list.
- 8. Ladies who have been presented at Drawing Rooms held during the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and at Courts held during the reign of His late Majesty King Edward VII., will not require to be again presented to Their Majesties the King and Queen.
- 9. The Dress Regulations are:—Ladies: Full Court Dress with feathers and trains. Gentlemen: Full Court Dress.

## CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

#### COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July last), and of fees to be received for the same, met for the first time at the Council Office, Whitehall, on Friday, 16th day of December instant.

On the motion of the Lord President it was agreed that the Lord Chancellor do preside at this and all other meetings of the Court.

The Lord Chancellor took his seat accordingly.

The Registrar of the Privy Council having proclaimed silence in the usual terms, the Clerk of the Crown read His Majesty's Commission appointing the Court.

Strangers having been required to withdraw, the Commissioners deliberated with closed

doors.

On the Court being reopened the Registrar announced the Petitions which had been presented, with the names of the Claimants and the nature of the Claims.

The Lord Chancellor announced that the Commissioners would take the Petitions into consideration in due course.

His Lordship further announced that the Commissioners had resolved as follows:—

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear

in person unless summoned.

3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel,

Solicitors, or Agents.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2 all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the

forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the List.

- 6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.
- 7. Petitioners to be requested to present their Claims on or before the 14th January, 1911.

His Lordship further announced that the Court stood adjourned to some day in the month of January next, of which notice would be given in the London Gazette.
