## CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES. COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July last), and of fees to be received for the same, at their last meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 16th day of December last, resolved as follows:—

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the

Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned.

3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel, Solicitors, or Agents.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the list.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

7. Petitioners to be requested to present their Claims on or before the 14th January, 1911.

The Court stands adjourned till 11 a.m. on Friday, the 27th day of January next.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such Claims as may be submitted to them in respect of rights or services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

#### WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Great Yarmouth) Order, 1911.

Dated 5th January, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the County Borough of Great Yarmouth, I hereby make the following Order:—

#### *Title.*

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Great Yarmouth) Order, 1911."

#### BIRDS.

#### *Close Time extended.*

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall be extended throughout the County Borough of Great Yarmouth, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in any year, so far as regards all Birds mentioned in the schedule to that Act as amended by the Act of 1881, or added thereto by Clause III of this Order, except Woodcock, the close time for which shall be extended so as to be between the 1st day of February and the 13th day of August in any year, and Snipe, Teal, and all species of Wild Duck, the close time for which will remain as fixed by the Act of 1880, namely, between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of August in any year.

#### *Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.*

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Great Yarmouth to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the schedule to the Act:—

Great Bustard, Crossbill, Sand Martin, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant).

#### *Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.*

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as varied by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of the Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Owl (all species), and Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Great Yarmouth.

#### *All Birds protected on Sundays.*

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Act of 1880, and by Clause II of this Order, does not extend, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited within the County Borough of Great Yarmouth.

#### Eggs.

#### *Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough.*

VI. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is pro-

hibited throughout the County Borough of Great Yarmouth:—Bittern, Little Bittern, Great Bustard, Crossbill, Stone Curlew (Norfolk Plover, Thick-Knee), Great Crested Grebe or Loon, Kingfisher, Sand Martin, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher (Sea Pie), Ringed Plover (Ringed Dotterel, Stone Runner), Ruff or Reeve, Terns, Sea Swallows, Pearls, or Dip Ears (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wild Duck and Teal (all species); Woodcock.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 3rd January, from His Majesty's Representative at The Hague, forwarding the following translation of a decree, dated 31st December, respecting the importation and transit of rags, &c., from Salonika:—

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance.

Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 10, 1910:

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after the 2nd January, 1911, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Salonika shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from Salonika, but which can be shown to have come originally from elsewhere, and which are packed in such a manner and have been so transported as to render it impossible that they should have been in contact with infected objects.

II. As regards transit:

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or treatment on the way.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 21st December, from His Majesty's Representative at Constantinople, stating that the following decisions were taken at the meeting of the Constantinople Board of Health, held on 20th December:—

(1) All measures in force against Odessa and Sevastopol, as also against the coast between Bartine and Aktche-Shehir (in the Zunguldak neighbourhood) are suppressed.

(2) The measures in force against Muscat are reduced to medical visit.

(3) Disinfection and application of the Rat Destruction Circular have been added to the medical visit imposed against Batoum.

(4) Passengers by the Anatolian Railway will be subjected to medical visit and disinfection at Touzla.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

assembled in the Town Hall, Albert Square, in the City of Manchester, on the fourth day of January, 1911, in exercise of the powers vested in us in and by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Manchester Corporation Tramways Act, 1900, and all other powers us hereunto enabling, do hereby revoke the following provision of Bye-law No. 1 of the series of bye-laws made by us on the 5th day of April, 1905, in pursuance of the said Acts, namely:—

"(a) In the Central area hereinafter described, the distance at which a carriage shall follow a preceding carriage using the same tramway shall be such as may be directed by the police. Any driver who shall fail to obey such directions shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this bye-law. The Central area above referred to is as follows:—The area bounded by Swan Street, Miller Street, Ducie Bridge, New Bridge Street, Great Ducie Street, Victoria Street, Deansgate, Whitworth Street West, Whitworth Street, Store Street, Great Ancoats Street, and Swan Street, and such area shall include the above named streets or portions thereof bounding the same";

And in lieu thereof we in exercise of the said powers do hereby make and adopt the following bye-laws, and declare that the same shall have effect as if they had been inserted in and formed part of the aforesaid Bye-law No. 1, namely:—

(a) In the Central area the distance at which a carriage shall follow a preceding carriage using the same tramway shall be not less than ten yards, with the following exceptions, viz.:—

(1) When a carriage is stopped at a stopping place or tramway terminus, or by direction of any police officer, or in case of accident or emergency, each of the carriages following the stationary carriage and using the same tramway may stop within a distance which shall not be less than two yards from the stationary carriage immediately in front of them respectively;

(2) When a carriage is re-started after having been stopped as hereinbefore mentioned, it may, for the space of 40 yards from the place where it was stopped, follow a preceding carriage using the same tramway at a distance of not less than two yards;

(3) In the portion of Piccadilly between Portland Street and Mosley Street a carriage using the same tramway may follow a preceding carriage at a distance of not less than two yards.

In these bye-laws the following expressions have the meanings hereinafter mentioned, namely:—

"The Central area" means the area bounded by Swan Street, Miller Street, Ducie Bridge, New Bridge Street, Great Ducie Street, Victoria Street, Deansgate, Whitworth Street West, Whitworth Street, Store Street, Great Ancoats Street and Swan Street, and includes the above-named streets or portions thereof bounding the same;

"Stopping place" means a stopping place indicated by either of the signs "All Cars Stop Here" and "Cars Stop Here by Request."
