HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eighty-four, duly pre-pared and laid before His Majesty in Council a

scheme bearing date the fifteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is

to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and thirteen, and of the Act of the seventeenth and eighteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter eight-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for apportioning the income of the benefice (being a vicarage) of Hillingdon, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London, between that benefice and a certain other benefice, namely, the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint John, Uxbridge Moor, which said last named benefice is situate in the said county of Middlesex and in the said diocese of London.

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diocese of London, is the patron in right of his See of the said benefice of Hillingdon and also of the said benefice of Saint John, Uxbridge

Moor.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said benefice of Saint John, Uxbridge Moor, is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said benefice of Hillingdon has endowments of such an amount as that

after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said benefice of Hillingdon will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the new parish of Saint John, Uxbridge Moor, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said benefice of Hillingdon which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas the said benefice of Hillingdon is now full of a clerk the incumbent thereof being the Reverend Charles Musgrave Harvey, Clerk in Holy Orders.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the province within which each of the said two benefices is situate (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his archiepiscopal seal) and with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said diocese of London, acting as such Bishop and also as the patron in right of his See of each of the said two benefices as aforesaid (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal) and also with the consent of the said Charles Musgrave Harvey, acting as the incumbent of the said benefice of Hillingdon (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date on which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall have been published in the London Gazette and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, all that piece of land containing one acre one rood and fifteen perches or thereabouts, situate in the said new parish of Saint John, Uxbridge Moor, and now or lately used as allotment gardens with the two cottages, stable and wheelwright's shop erected thereon, which said piece of land under the terms of an award dated the eighteenth day of April in the year one thousand nine hundred and four and made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, was allotted to the incumbent of the said benefice of Hillingdon for the time being in exchange for a portion of the glebe land belonging to the said benefice of Hillingdon, shall be transferred from the said benefice of Hillingdon and shall be annexed to and shall in future belong to the said benefice of Saint John, Uxbridge Moor.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette, pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the thirtythird and thirty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-nine, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the third and fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, the Act of the fourth and fifth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter thirtynine, and the Act of the thirty-first and thirtysecond years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and fourteen, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the church and cure (hereinafter called 'the said benefice ') of Holy Trinity, Llanybri, in the county of Carmarthen and in the diocese of Saint David's.

"Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Holy Trinity, Llanybri, is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in the Reverend David Williams, of the Vicarage, Llanybri, in the county of Carmarthen, Clerk in Holy Orders.

"And whereas the said David Williams is desirous that the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Holy Trinity, Llanybri, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend John, now Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's, and his successors Bishops of the same diocese.

"And whereas the said John, Bishop of Saint David's, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said John, Bishop of Saint

David's, has executed this scheme as herein-

after mentioned.
"And whereas the transfer of the patronage of the said benefice of Holy Trinity, Llanybri, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the new parish of the Holy Trinity,

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said David Williams (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) and with the consent of the said John, Bishop of Saint David's (in testimony whereof he has signed this scheme and sealed the same with his episcopal seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presenta-tion to the said benefice of Holy Trinity, Llanybri, now vested in him the said David Williams as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said John, Bishop of Saint David's, and his successors in the same bishoprick, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John, Bishop of Saint David's, and by his successors

in the same bishoprick for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas the said scheme has been ap-

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of December, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Ewood, within the new parish (some-time consolidated chapelry) of Saint Audrew, Livesey, in the county of Lancaster, and in the diocese of Manchester.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, in the county and diocese aforesaid, and of the new parish (some-time district) of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, also in the county and diocese aforesaid, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, of the said new parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, and of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Bartholomew,

situate at Ewood as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edmund Arbuthnott, Bishop of Manchester, as such Bishop, and also as the patron in right of his See, of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, as well as of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, and with the consents of Adam Dugdale, of Griffin Lodge, Blackburn, Esquire, of James Hawley Gilbert Feilden, of Witton Park, Blackburn a Captain in Your Majesty's Army Blackburn, a Captain in Your Majesty's Army, of Sir William Henry Hornby, of Pleasington Hall, Blackburn, Baronet, of the Right Reverend Samuel Thornton, sometime Bishop of Ballarat, and of the Reverend James Pickop, of Winston Hall, East Park Road, Blackburn, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Manchester, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, of the said new parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, and of the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the

boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Bartholomew, situate at Ewood as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood.'
"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your

Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall

seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Bartholomew, Ewood, comprising: -All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime consolidated chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Livesey, of the new parish (sometime particular district) of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, all in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Manchester, which, taken together, are bounded upon the northeast partly by the new parish of Saint James, Lower Darwen, partly by the new parish of Christ Church, Blackburn, and partly by the new parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides—that is to say, upon the north-west, upon the west, and upon the south—by an imaginary line commencing at the point near the western side of the River Darwen where the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Nova Scotia, Blackburn, from the said new parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, crosses the middle of the Liverpool, Blackburn and Accrington Line of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across Albert Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Albert Street for a distance of eleven chains and a half or thereabouts to its present southern end, continuing thence south-eastward in same direction and in precisely the straight line (thereby crossing at the middle of the Leeds and Liverpool Canal the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Francis, Feniscliffe, from the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey) for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the goit running between the said canal and Albion Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said goit for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the northern side of Albion Road, and extending thence first southward to the middle of Albion Road, and then first south-westward and southward along \mathbf{the} middle Albion Road for a distance in all of seven chains or thereabouts to its junction with Livesey Branch Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Livesey Branch Road for a distance of ten yards or thereabouts to its junction with Fernhurst Street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Fernhurst Street for a distance of seven chains or thereabouts to its present southern end, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the boundary which

divides the said new parish of Saint Andrew, Livesey, from the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen) for a distance of fortyseven chains or thereabouts to the southern corner of the close which contains the house known as Craven's Farm and which is numbered 1125 upon the Ordnance Map of the borough of Blackburn published in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this representation, and extending thence eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the road called Craven's Brow and Scotshaw Brook) for a distance of thirty-three chains or thereabouts to the junction of Cross Street with Sandy Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Sandy Lane for a distance of seven chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the said lane across the River Darwen upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Cuthbert, Darwen, from the said new parish of Saint James, Lower Darwen."

And whereas the said Representation has

been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament held in the seventh and eighth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria's reign (shortly entitled "The Judicial Committee Act, 1844"), it was enacted that it should be competent to Her Majesty by any Order or Orders in Council to provide for the admission of Appeals to Her Majesty in Council from any judgment, sentences, decrees, or orders of any Court of Justice within any British Colony or Possession abroad, although such Court should not be a Court of Error or Appeal within such Colony or Possession, and to make provision for the instituting and prosecuting of such Appeals and for carrying into effect any such decisions or sentences as Her Majesty in Council should pronounce thereon:

And whereas by an Order of Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the 12th day of July, 1887, provision was made to enable parties to appeal from the decisions of the Supreme Court of British Columbia to Her

Majesty in Council:

And whereas by an Act passed by the Legislature of British Columbia in the seventh year of the reign of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, entitled "An Act constituting a Court of Appeal and declaring its jurisdiction," provision was made for the constitution of a Court of Appeal for the Province of British Columbia:

And whereas it is expedient, with a view to equalizing as far as may be the conditions under which His Majesty's subjects in the British Dominions beyond the Seas shall have a right of appeal to His Majesty in Council, and to promoting uniformity in the practice and procedure in all such Appeals, that the rules regarding Appeals from the said Supreme Court contained in the said Order in Council should be revoked and provision should be made for Appeals from the said Court of Appeal to His Majesty in Council:

It is hereby ordered by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Order in Council shall be and the same is hereby revoked, and that the Rules hereunder set out shall regulate all Appeals to His Majesty in Council from the Court of Appeal of British

Columbia.

1. In these Rules, unless the context otherwise requires:

"Appeal" means Appeal to His Majesty

in Council;
"His Majesty" includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;
"Judgment" includes decree, order, sen-

tence, or decision; "Court " means the "Court of Appeal"

for British Columbia; "Record" means the aggregate of papers relating to an Appeal (including the pleadings, proceedings, evidence and judgments) proper to be laid before His Majesty in Council on the hearing of the Appeal; "Registrar" means the Registrar or other

proper officer having the custody of the Records in the Court appealed from;

"Month" means calendar month;

Words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

- 2. Subject to the provisions of these Rules, an Appeal shall lie-
 - (a) as of right, from any final judgment of the Court, where the matter in dispute on the Appeal amounts to or is of the value of £500 sterling or upwards, or where the Appeal involves, directly or indirectly, some claim or question to or respecting property or some civil right amounting to or of the value of £500 sterling or upwards; and

(b) at the discretion of the Court, from any other judgment of the Court, whether final or interlocutory, if, in the opinion of the Court, the question involved in the Appeal is one which, by reason of its great general or public importance or otherwise, ought to be submitted to His Majesty in

Council for decision.

3. Where in any action or other proceeding no final judgment can be duly given in consequence of a difference of opinion between the judges, the final judgment may be entered pro forma on the application of any party to such action or other proceeding according to the opinion of the Chief Justice or, in his absence, of the senior puisne Judge of the Court, but such judgment shall only be deemed final for purposes of an Appeal therefrom, and not for

any other purpose.

4. Applications to the Court for leave to appeal shall be made by motion or petition within 21 days from the date of the judgment to be appealed from, and the applicant shall give the opposite party notice of his intended application.

5. Leave to appeal under Rule 2 shall only be granted by the Court in the first instance-

- (a) upon condition of the Appellant, within a period to be fixed by the Court, but not exceeding three months from the date of the hearing of the application for leave to appeal, entering into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, in a sum not exceeding £500, for the due prosecution of the Appeal, and the payment of all such costs as may become payable to the Respondent in the event of the Appellant's not obtaining an order granting him final leave to appeal, or of the Appeal being dismissed for non-prosecution, or of His Majesty in Council ordering the Appellant to pay the Respondent's costs of the Appeal (as the case may be); and
- (b) upon such other conditions (if any) as to the time or times within which the Appellant shall take the necessary steps for the purpose of procuring the preparation of the record and the despatch thereof to England as the Court, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, may think it reason-

able to impose.

- 6. Where the judgment appealed from requires the Appellant to pay money or perform a duty, the Court shall have power, when granting leave to appeal, either to direct that the said judgment shall be carried into execution or that the execution thereof shall be suspended pending the Appeal, as to the Court And in case the Court shall shall seem just. direct the said judgment to be carried into execution, the person in whose favour it was given shall, before the execution thereof, enter into good and sufficient security, to the satisfaction of the Court, for the due performance of such Order as His Majesty in Council shall think fit to make thereon.
- 7. The preparation of the Record shall be subject to the supervision of the Court, and the parties may submit any disputed question arising in connection therewith to the decision of the Court, and the Court shall give such directions thereon as the justice of the case may
- 8. The Registrar, as well as the parties and their legal agents, shall endeavour to exclude from the Record all documents (more particularly such as are merely formal) that are not relevant to the subject-matter of the Appeal, and generally, to reduce the bulk of the Record as far as practicable, taking special care toavoid the duplication of documents and the unnecessary repetition of headings and other merely formal parts of documents; but the documents omitted to be copied or printed shall . be enumerated in a list to be placed after the index or at the end of the Record.
- 9. Where in the course of the preparation of a Record one party objects to the inclusion of a document on the ground that it is unnecessary or irrelevant, and the other party nevertheless insists upon its being included, the

Record, as finally printed (whether in British Columbia or in England), shall, with a view to the subsequent adjustment of the costs of and incidental to such document, indicate in the index of papers, or otherwise, the fact that, and the party by whom, the inclusion of the document was objected to.

10. The Record shall be printed in accordance with the Rules set forth in the Schedule It may be so printed either in British

Columbia or in England.

11. Where the Record is printed in British Columbia the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council 40 copies of such Record, one of which copies he shall certify to be correct by signing his name on, or initialling, every eighth page thereof and by affixing thereto the seal,

if any, of the Court.
12. Where the Record is to be printed in England, the Registrar shall, at the expense of the Appellant, transmit to the Registrar of the Privy Council one certified copy of such Record, together with an index of all the papers and exhibits in the case. No other certified copies of the Record shall be transmitted to the Agents in England by or on behalf of the parties to the Appeal.

13. Where part of the Record is printed in British Columbia and part is to be printed in England, Rules 11 and 12 shall, as far as practicable, apply to such parts as are printed in British Columbia, and such as are to be printed

in England respectively.
14. The reasons given by the judge, or any of the judges, for or against any judgment pronounced in the course of the proceedings out of which the Appeal arises shall by such judge or judges be communicated in writing to the Registrar, and shall by him be transmitted to the Registrar of the Privy Council at the time when the Record is transmitted.

15. Where there are two or more applications for leave to appeal arising out of the same matter, and the Court is of opinion that it would be for the convenience of the Lords of the Judicial Committee and all parties concerned that the Appeals should be consolidated, the Court may direct the Appeals to be consolidated and grant leave to appeal by a single

16. An Appellant who has obtained an order granting him conditional leave to appeal may at any time prior to the making of an order granting him final leave to appeal withdraw his Appeal on such terms as to costs and other-

wise as the Court may direct.

17. Caracas in Venezuela is now regarded as free from plague.

With cholera:

The Island of Madeira; the Russian Governments of Podolia, Kieff, Ekaterinoslav, Perm, and Orenburg; the Kingdom of Hungary; the Italian Provinces of Rome, Caserta, Salerno, Lecce, and Palermo; the towns of Constantinople and Salonica in Turkey, Trebizond and Smyrna in Asia Minor, and Tripoli in North Africa.

With plague:

The town of Odessa and the Government of Astrachan in Russia, Arabia, the town of Bagdad in Mesopotamia, Persia, India, Burmah, China, Japan, Manilla, Formosa, Siam and Tonquin, Egypt, Madagascar, the Islands of Réunion and Mauritius, the town of Cape Coast Castle and the other towns on the Gold Coast in Africa, the ports in Brazil and Chili, Uruguay, Peru, the town of Guayaquil in Equator in South America, the towns of Brisbane, Maryborough, Perth, Freemantle, Geraldton, and Sydney in Australia.

Vessels with cholera or plague patients on board and bound for Norwegian ports should be directed by the pilots to the quarantine station on Odderoen, near Christiansand.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and calling at ports in Nordland, Tromso, and Finmarken Prefectures, or using the inner channel between Honningsvaag and Lodingen, are to be directed to the provisional cholera lazaret at Tromso. Vessels arriving at Hammerfest, Vardo, or Vadso with single cases of cholera on board will, however, until further notice, be able to expect that these patients will be received for treatment on shore under the further regulations of the local Boards of Health.
