NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the parts of roads within the Urban District of Beckenham which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These regulations shall come into operation on the sixth day of February, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

SCHEDULE.

So much of High Street as extends from its junction with Croydon Road to a point 25 yards north of its junction with Manor Road; and

So much of Scott's Lane as extends from its junction with Bromley Road to its junction with Oakwood Avenue.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH JANUARY 1911.)

ROMFORD MARKETS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF
1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Restriction of Sales of Swine.

1.—(1.) From and after the commencement of this Order no market or sale of swine shall be held, and no swine shall be exposed for sale, in the Urban District described in the Schedule hereto except in a market or saleyard.

(2.) The movement of swine from a market or saleyard in the Urban District shall be subject to the conditions as to licences marking and movement which apply to the movement of swine from a market or saleyard specially authorised under Article 5 of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and for such purpose the market or saleyard shall be deemed to be so specially authorised.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title, &c.

4. This Order may be cited as the ROMFORD MARKETS (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER of 1911, and shall be read with the SWINE-FEVER (REGULATION OF MOVEMENT) ORDER of 1908.
