The KING's Most Excellent Majesty,

Lord President, Lord Chamberlain, Lord Pentland, Sir W. S. Robson.

W HEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means His Majesty the King has power, jurisdiction, and authority within the territory known as Swaziland:

And whereas on the 21st day of December, 1908, His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to issue an Order known as "The Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Order in Council, 1908":

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers by "The Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890," or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. The definition of the expression "Crown Mineral Rights" contained in paragraph (2)

of Article I. of the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Order in Council, 1908, is hereby revoked and the following definition is substituted therefor:

"(2) The expression 'Crown Mineral Rights' shall mean any rights to precious or base metals, precious stones, minerals, or mineral products in respect of any land in Swaziland (a) which have not been disposed of by any concession or grant made by the Paramount Chief of Swaziland and confirmed by the Chief Court constituted under Section 4 of the Swaziland (Organic) Proclamation, 1890, or by the High Commissioner under Proclamation No. 63 of 1908; or (b) which, having been so disposed of, have been or may hereafter be lawfully cancelled or abandoned, and are not subject to, or included in any later dated concession confirmed as aforesaid; or (c) which have been or may hereafter be lawfully transferred to, or expropriated by, the High Commissioner in exercise of such powers as aforesaid."

II. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the High Commissioner for South Africa, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation, and the High Commissioner shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such a manner and for such time or times as he thinks

proper for giving due publicity thereto within Swaziland.

III. This Order may be cited for all purposes as "The Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Amendment Order in Council, 1910."

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Derby) Order, 1911.

Dated 1st February, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Derby, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Derby) Order, 1911.

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall, except as regards Wild Duck, Snipe and Plover, be extended, so far as concerns the area comprised within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby, so as to be between the last day of February and the 13th day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply throughout the area comprised

within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Bull-finch, Black-headed Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Great Bustard, Little Bustard, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chaffingh, Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiffchaff, Spotted Crake, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Rock Dove, Turtle Dove, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Har-rier, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, Kestrel, Martin, Martin, Merlin, House Sand Nuthatch, Osprey, Ring Ouzel, Water Ouzel, Meadow Pipit, Richard's Pipit, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Water Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpoll, Mealy Redpoll, Redstart, Robin, Shrike (all species), Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Missel Thrush, Song Thrush, Bearded Tit, Blue Tit, Coal Tit, Crested Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Wagtail (all species), Aquatic Warbler, Blackcap Warbler, Dartford Warbler, Garden Warbler, Mars-Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Grassnoppel Warbler, Reed Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Waxwing, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Wren, Whitethroat, Fire-crested Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Gertain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby:—

All Birds protected on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday within certain Areas.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sunday, Christmas Day and Good Friday is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Derby, except in the boroughs of Chesterfield, Glossop and Ilkeston.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds, also the Eggs of the Birds added by Clause III of this Order to the Schedule to the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as amended by the Act of 1881 (except the Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), is prohibited throughout the area comprised within the boundaries of the Administrative County of Derby:—

Auk, Avocet, Bee-Eater, Bittern, Little Bittern, Cornish Chough, Corn Crake (Landrail), Cuckoo, Curlew, Black-throated Diver, Red-throated Diver, Dotterel, Eider Duck, Pintail Duck, Shoveller Duck, Tufted Duck, Dunlin (Ox-bird, Ploverspage, Parre or Sea-Lark), Fulmar, Gadwall, Godwit, Goldfinch, Solan Goose (Gannet), Grey Lag Goose, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe (Dabchick), Greenshank, Guillemot (Marrot, Murre, Scout or Willock), Gull or Seamew (except Blackbacked Gull), Hawfinch, Common Heron, Hoopoe, Kingfisher, Kittiwake or Tarrock, Sky Lark, Wood Lark, Loon, Merganser, Nightingale, Nightjar (Night Hawk, Fern Owl, Goat Sucker), Golden Oriole, Owl (all species), Oyster Catcher, Petrel, Phalarope, Plover (except Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover), Pochard or Dunbird, Puffin (Coulternet or Sea Parrot), Razorbill, Redshank, Roller, Ruff, or Reeve, Sanderling, Sandpiper (Summer Snipe), Shearwater, Sheldrake, Shoveller, Skua or Bonxie, Smew, Snipe, Spoonbill, Stint, Stone Curlew or Thick-knee, Stonehatch (Ringed Plover), Teal, Tern or Sea Swallow (all species), Tystey, Whimbrel, Widgeon, Swift, Woodcock, Woodpecker (all species), Wryneck, and (after April 15th in each year) Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover.

Repeal of former Order.

VII. The Order of the 20th July, 1904, is hereby repealed.
