The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter thirty-seven, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and partly out of the parish of Clee, both in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and the said parish of Clee are cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of the said parish of Clee, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purpose of Divine worship.

"And whereas by a certain indenture bearing date on or about the nineteenth day of January in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven and made or expressed to be made under the authority of the 'New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856,' or some or one of them, between the Reverend Felix Milburn Blakiston, vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, of the first part, the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, as the patron in right of his See, and also as the Ordinary of the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, of the second part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the third part (which indenture is intended to be

enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice), the said Felix Milburn Blakiston did with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, as such Bishop and also as such patron as aforesaid, grant and confirm unto the minister (so soon as a minister shall have been licensed) of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted and to his successors and when such district shall have become a new parish then to the vicar or incumbent of such new parish and to his successors one perpetual clear yearly rent charge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds to be payable half yearly on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year, a propor-tionate part of the first of such half yearly payments to be made on such one of those days as shall first happen next after a minister shall have been licensed to the said intended district, free from and clear of all deductions, taxes, charges, rates, assessments and outgoings whatsoever (except on account of the tax on income or property, if any), and to be for ever issuing and payable out of and charged upon all that the said vicarage of the new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and the glebe lands, tithes or tithe commutation rent charges, hereditaments, and all other the endowments and emoluments to the said

vicarage belonging.
"And whereas the said yearly rent charge or net annual sum of one hundred and fifty pounds has been granted as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned in the

manner hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas the said Felix Milburn Blakiston has nominated the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, as the person to whom and to whose successors he desires that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district

shall be assigned.

" Now therefore with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, and of the said parish of Clee, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan o hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named

The District of Saint Stephen, Grimsby."
"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish then of such new parish and of the nomination of an incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to

time be exercised by the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, and his successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measure relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Stephen, Grimsby,

comprising:—
"I. All that portion of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln, which is bounded upon the south-west by the new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, upon the south by the parish of Clee, upon the east by the new parish of Saint Aidan, New Cleethorpes, all in the said county and diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the northeast and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Aidan, New Cleethorpes, from the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, at the junction of Park-street with Tunnard-street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Tunnard-street for a distance of twenty-four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Weelsby-street, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Weelsby-street for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to its junction with Eleanor-street, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Eleanorstreet for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to the centre of the culvert which carries Eleanor-street over the Weelsby Drain, upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, from the said new parish of All Saints,

"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said parish of Clee which is bounded upon the north by the above described portion of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, upon the north-west and upon the south-west by the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of All Saints, Grimsby, from the said parish of Clee, at the centre of the culvert which carries Welholme-road across the Weelsby Drain, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Welholme-road for a distance of twenty chains or thereabouts to the point where such road crosses the middle of the Humberstone Drain, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to the point in the middle of Carr-lane where the boundary of the municipal borough of Great Grimsby diverges eastward from Carrlane, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Carr-lane (thereby following the said municipal borough boundary) for a distance of twenty-three chains or thereabouts to the point near its junction with Dur-ban-road and Wellington-street, where the boundaries of the said parish of Clee, of the said new parish of Saint Aidan, New Cleethorpes, and of the said new parish of Saint John the Evangelist, New Clee, all meet."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbents of the cures out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

And whereas the said scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

HEREAS by section 16 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, as amended by the es Act, 1850, it is amongst other Pluralities Act, 1850, it is amongst other things enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the archbishop of the province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the bishop of any diocese, or by the bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said archbishop of the province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said arch-bishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand, or hands, to the said archbishop, against

such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for his Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the 28th day of September, 1910, in the words and figures following, that is to

say:-

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of All England and Metropolitan do hereby in pursuance of the Pluralities Act 1838 certify to Your Majesty in Council that it having appeared to us that the benefice of Waldershare and the benefice of Coldred both in the county of Kent and our diocese of Canterbury might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice for ecclesiastical purposes only We inquired into the circumstances of the case and on such inquiry it appeared
"That the benefices are contiguous to each

other and when united will not be of incon-

venient extent.

"That the aggregate population of the parishes of Waldershare and Coldred (according to the last Census) does not exceed five hundred persons the population of the said parish of Waldershare being two hundred and forty-three or thereabouts and that of Coldred being one hundred and forty or thereabouts.
"That there is a church belonging to each

of the said benefices with sufficient accommodation for the inhabitants thereof. The churches are distant about one mile and a half from each

other.

"That there is a sufficient house of residence belonging to Waldershare but there is no house of residence belonging to Coldred.

"That the nett yearly value of the said benefice of Waldershare is one hundred and fortyone pounds or thereabouts and the nett yearly value of Coldred is one hundred and thirty-six pounds or thereabouts.

"That the patronage of both the said benefices of Waldershare and Coldred belongs to us by virtue of our Archbishopric and we consent as such patron to the union of the said two benefices.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such inquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a statement in writing of the facts to be affixed to the principal outer door of the parish church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The copies of the statement of facts and notice referred to and our consent as patron before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the inquiry consent and matters aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the rectory of Waldershare, situate in the county of Kent and diocese of Canterbury, and the rectory of Coldred, situate in the same county and diocese, shall be united into one benefice with the cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; And the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Herbert Edward, then the Lord Bishop of Winchester, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Herbert Edward Bishop of Winchester, hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in my diocese of Winchester and

the county of Hants the benefice of Hound.

"There is also in the same diocese and county the benefice of Bursledon, the benefice of Hamble le Rice and the benefice of St. Mary Extra, Southampton, all of which are contiguous to the said benefice of Hound.

"The population of Hound is 2,429 or thereabouts with church accommodation for 450, that of Bursledon 610 or thereabouts with church accommodation for 250, that of Hamble le Rice 400 or thereabouts with church accommodation for 200, and that of St. Mary Extra, Southampton, 3,000 or thereabouts with church accommodation for 586.

"The Warden and Scholars Clerks of St. Mary College of Winchester, near Winchester, are the Patrons of the benefices of Hound and Hamble le Rice, and I, by virtue of my Bishopric, am the patron of the benefices of Bursledon and St. Mary Extra, Southampton

"The Reverend William Alfred Cramer Chevalier is the Incumbent of Hound, the Reverend William Shirley is the Incumbent of Bursledon, the Reverend Alexander Mackintosh is the Incumbent of Hamble le Rice, and the Reverend Thomas Lewis Owen Davies is the Incumbent of St. Mary Extra, Southampton. All the before mentioned patrons and Incumbents of the several benefices consent to the scheme hereinafter set out.

"The nett annual value of Hound is one

"The nett annual value of Hound is one hundred and ninety-six pounds or thereabouts, that of Bursledon is two hundred pounds or thereabouts, that of Hamble le Rice is eighty-three pounds or thereabouts, and that of St. Mary Extra, Southampton, is three hundred and fifty pounds or thereabouts.

"It is desirable that the Civil and Ecclesiastical boundaries of Bursledon and Hamble le Rice respectively shall be made to coincide.

"(1) It is proposed to separate two portions of the parish of Hound with a population of 368 persons or thereabouts and to annex the same to the contiguous parish of Bursledon, from the church of which parish it is half a mile to a mile distant.

"(2) To separate a further portion of Hound with a population of 350 persons or thereabouts and to annex it to the contiguous parish of Hamble le Rice, from the church of which parish it is half a mile to a mile distant.

parish it is half a mile to a mile distant.

"(3) To separate a further portion of Hound with a population of 420 or thereabouts and to annex it to the contiguous parish of St. Mary Extra, Southampton, from the church of which parish it is half a mile to a mile distant.

"All the several before mentioned portions

"All the several before mentioned portions of Hound so to be separated are more particularly hereinafter described in the Scheme hereto annexed and are delineated on the map or plan attached to such Scheme.

or plan attached to such Scheme.

'It therefore appears to me that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, the

several portions of Hound hereinbefore mentioned may be advantageously separated therefrom and be respectively annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said several before-mentioned parishes to which they are contiguous, and in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have prepared the following Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights of pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace with the consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents of the said benefices respectively to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents of the patrons and Incumbents of the said benefices respectively are as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"That there shall be separated from the parish of Hound and annexed to the contiguous parish of Bursledon All that part (being two portions) of the said parish of Hound which is bounded by the Hamble River on the east and the road from Bursledon Common past Windhover and Bursledon Towers and the footpath through Pilands Wood to the footbridge into Hungerford Bottom on the west and coloured pink on the said plan.

"That there shall also be separated from the said parish of Hound and annexed to the contiguous parish of Hamble le Rice that part of the said parish which is bounded on the east by the River Hamble on the south by the said parish of Hamble le Rice on the west and north by the new and present boundary between the civil parishes of Hamble le Rice and Hound and coloured green on the said

"And that there shall also be separated from the said parish of Hound and annexed to the contiguous parish of Saint Mary Extra, Southampton All that detached part of the said parish which is bounded on the east by the parish of Sholing and on all other sides by the said parish of Saint Mary Extra Southampton and coloured brown on the said plan.

That the several Incumbents of the said parishes of Bursledon, Hamble le Rice and Saint Mary Extra Southampton shall respectively have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portions so separated from Hound and annexed to their respective parishes as

aforesaid.

That the inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the churches of the parishes to which they shall be respectively annexed but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Hound except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Hound who may not be

willing to relinquish and give up the same.
"That the inhabitants of such portions so separated as aforesaid shall have the right of

churchings in the churches of the parishes to which they shall respectively be annexed and all fees, dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments in respect of the performance of such services arising from and out of such portions so separated as aforesaid shall hereafter belong to the Incumbent of the parish to which such portion has been severally annexed.
"That no alteration shall be made in respect

of the tithe rent charges or other endowments of the said benefices or any or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or any or either of them.

" CONSENTS.

"We the Warden and Scholars Clerks of St. Mary College of Winchester near Winchester being the patrons or person entitled to present or nominate to both the benefices of Hound and Hamble le Rice in the county of Hants in case the same or either of them were now vacant Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, by virtue of our Bishopric, being the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to both the benefices of Bursledon and St. Mary Extra, Southampton, in case the same or either of them were now vacant, the Reverend William Alfred Cramer Chevalier, Incumbent of Hound aforesaid, the Reverend William Shirley, Incumbent of Bursledon aforesaid, the Reverend Alexander Mackin-Incumbent \mathbf{of} Hamble le $_{
m the}$ \mathbf{and} Reverend Thomas aforesaid Lewis Owen Davies, the Incumbent of St. Mary Extra Southampton do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and to every matter and thing therein contained.

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report dated the 5th day of August, 1910, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Herbert Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester has represented unto us amongst other things

"That there is in the county of Hants and his diocese of Winchester the benefice of Hound separated as aforesaid shall have the right of containing a population of 2,429 or therethe solemnization of marriages, baptisms and abouts.

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the benefice of Bursledon with a population of 610 or thereabouts, the benefice of Hamble-le-Rice with a population of 400 or thereabouts and the benefice of St. Mary Extra Southampton with a population of 3,000 or thereabouts all which benefices are contiguous to the said benefice of Hound.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that firstly two portions of the parish of Hound (described in the scheme annexed hereto and coloured pink on the plan attached to such Scheme) may under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, be advantageously separated therefrom and annexed to the parish of Bursledon that secondly that part of the said parish (described in the said scheme and coloured green on the said plan) may be likewise separated therefrom and annexed to the parish of Hamble-le-Rice and that thirdly that part of the said parish (described in the said scheme and coloured brown on the said plan) may be also likewise separated and annexed to the parish of St. Mary Extra Southampton.

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which Scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the Warden and Scholars Clerks of St. Mary College of Winchester near Winchester as patrons of both the benefices of Hound and Hamble le Rice (in case the same or either of them were now vacant) the said Lord Bishop as patron by virtue of his Bishopric of both the benefices of Bursledon and St. Mary Extra Southampton (in case the same or either of them were now vacant) the Reverend William Alfred Cramer Chevalier the Incumbent of Hound aforesaid the Reverend William Shirley the Incumbent of Bursledon aforesaid the Reverend Alexander Mackintosh the Incumbent of Hamble le Rice aforesaid and the Reverend Thomas Lewis Owen Davies Incumbent of St. Mary Extra aforesaid has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration.

"The representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that, "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the archbishop of the province, or when the bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes: And the said archbishop or bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such bishop to be transmitted to the said archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said archbishop may approve, and the said archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Lord Bishop of Llandaff, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"We Joshua Pritchard Bishop of Llandaff in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act 1838 do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the county of Monmouth and diocese of Llandaff the benefice or rectory of Llanhilleth the parish whereof contains a population of eight thousand five hundred or thereabouts. The net annual value of the said benefice of Llanhilleth arising from all sources is

four hundred and seventy-five pounds or there-

"There is in the same county of Monmouth and diocese of Llandaff the benefice or perpetual curacy of Penmaen the parish or district whereof contains a population of fourteen thousand or thereabouts. The net annual value of the said benefice of Penmaen arising from all sources is two hundred and sixtyeight pounds or thereabouts.

'There is also in the same county of Monmouth and diocese of Llandaff the benefice or perpetual curacy of St. Michael Abertillery the parish or district whereof contains a population of twenty-one thousand or thereabouts. The net annual value of the said benefice of St. Michael Abertillery arising from all sources is two hundred and fifty pounds or thereabouts.

A certain part coloured green on the plan hereto annexed of the district called Crumlin which is situate within the said parish of Llanhilleth and which contains a population of about one thousand persons which lies contiguous to the said parish of Penmaen (the other portion of such district of Crumlin being already in the same parish of Penmaen) may from its geographical position as well as the fact that these mountain villages are sometimes included in two and sometimes three parishes be with great advantage to the religious interests of the population resident there separated from the said parish of Llanhilleth and annexed to the said parish of Penmaen.

"That a certain district called Aberbeeg with a population containing about one thousand persons is situate in the said parishes of Llanhilleth Penmaen and Abertillery.

"Those portions thereof which lie within the said parishes of Abertillery and Penmaen being coloured respectively blue and red upon the said plan Such district of Aberbeeg is situated between the two hamlets called Six Bells and Llanhilleth and is about two miles from Abertillery the latter being a compact town with a population of about twenty-one thousand persons higher up the valley and is also about three miles distant from the parish church of Penmaen but only about half a mile distant from the parish church of Llanhilleth and therefore such portions of the district of Aberbeeg could with great advantage to the religious interests of the population resident within such portions of the said district of Aberbeeg be separated from the said parishes of Abertillery and Penmaen and annexed to

the said parish of Llanhilleth.
"It appears to us the said Bishop of Llandaff and we do hereby represent to your Grace that under the provisions of the Pluralities Acts the several places or districts hereinbefore referred to may be advantageously separated from the parishes to which the same now severally belong and be severally annexed to the parishes as follows:—

"(a) That portion or district of the parish of Llanhilleth hereinbefore distinguished and called by the name of Crumlin (coloured green on the plan) to be annexed to the

parish of Penmaen.
"(b) The portions of the parishes of Abertillery and Penmaen hereinbefore described as forming part of the district of Aberbeeg (and coloured respectively blue and red on the plan) to be annexed to the parish of Llanhilleth.
"The Most Honourable the Marquess of

Abergavenny K.G. is the patron of the benefice

of Llanhilleth. The Crown and we the said Bishop of Llandaff alternately are the patrons of the benefice of Penmaen and the Reverend Henry Charles Penoyre Belcher, clerk, rector of Aberystruth in the said county of Monmouth is the patron of the benefice of St. Michael Abertillery.
"The Reverend Daniel Felix, clerk, is the

present incumbent of the benefice or rectory of Llanhilleth, the Reverend David Gower, clerk, is the present incumbent of the benefice or perpetual curacy of Penmaen, and the Reverend Hiram Smyth Rees, clerk, is the present incumbent of the benefice or perpetual

curacy of St. Michael Abertillery.

"Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the Pluralities Act 1838 we the said Bishop of Llandaff have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the respective districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the respective parishes of Llanhilleth and Penmaen and the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the necessary consents in writing of the Most Honourable the Marquess of Abergavenny K.G. the patron of the benefice or rectory of Llanhilleth, of the First Lord of the Treasury on behalf of the Crown and us the said Bishop of Llandaff the patrons alternately of the benefice or perpetual curacy of Penmaen and of the Reverend Henry Charles Penoyre Belcher, clerk, rector of Aberystruth aforesaid the patron of the benefice or perpetual curacy of St. Michael Abertillery. And in case you shall upon full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith we request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents aforesaid by your report to His Majesty in Council.

"The incumbent of St. Michael Abertillery being now ready to consent together with all other necessary parties to the proposed scheme it can now be carried into effect but as the final clause of the Order of fifteenth January one thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven rendered that Order inoperative unless and until a vacancy should occur in the benefice of St. Michael Abertillery it becomes necessary to repeat the scheme as a whole and obtain an

entirely new Order in Council."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop is as follows:-

"SCHEME.

"It is proposed to separate from the parish of Llanhilleth all that portion of the said parish which is coloured green upon the plan annexed hereto and which lies to the southwest of an imaginary boundary line between the parishes of Penmaen and Llanhilleth four hundred and forty yards to the south-west of a public house known as the Royal Oak situate on Craig Swffryd and runs thence in a southeast direction in a straight line to Swffrydgarol and thence to Pontbren Cottage and from this place along the present boundary line between the parishes of Llanhilleth and Mynyddyslloyn. "It is proposed to separate from the said

parishes or ecclesiastical districts of Abertillery

and Penmaen and to annex to the parish of Llanhilleth that portion of the district commonly called and known by the name of Aberbeeg which lies within the said parishes or ecclesiastical districts and is coloured blue and red respectively on the said plan and which is included within a boundary running from Six Bells along the parish road to the main road between Aberbeeg and Abertillery thence along the farm lane to Arrail Farm from Arrail Farm it takes a straight line to the River Ebbw then along the present boundary between the ecclesiastical district of Penmaen and Bedwellty to Pengfan Farm along the road to Pentrefpiod and Pentwyn to Llanerch-uchaf when it takes a straight line to a point on the present boundary between the parishes of Penmaen and Llanhilleth which is four hundred and forty yards to the south-west of the said public house known as the Royal Oak situate on Craig Swffryd.

"The incumbent of the parish or ecclesiastical district of Penmaen shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said hereinbefore described district of Crumlin so proposed to be separated from the parish of Llan-hilleth and annexed to the parish of Penmaen and which shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish of Penmaen and all the fees from churchings, marriages and burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized or performed at the church or churchyard of the parish of Penmaen in respect of the inhabitants of the district so proposed to be annexed thereto shall belong to and continue to be received by the present incumbent of Llanhilleth during his incumbency but shall afterwards belong to and be received by the incumbent of Penmaen for the time being.

"The incumbent of the parish of Llanhilleth shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the said hereinbefore described district of Aberbeeg so proposed to be separated from the parish or ecclesiastical districts of Abertillery and Penmaen respectively and annexed to the parish of Llanhilleth which shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said parish of Llanhilleth and all the fees for churchings, marriages and burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized or performed at the church or churchyard of the parish of Llanhilleth in respect of the inhabitants of the district so proposed to be annexed thereto shall belong to and continue to be received by the present incumbents of Abertillery and Penmaen during the period of their respective incumbencies but shall afterwards belong to and be received by the incumbent of Llanbilleth for the time being.

" Nothing in this scheme is to prejudice the right of the present incumbents of the said three parishes legally entitled to fees in either or any of the districts affected by such scheme except with the consent of such incumbents."

"1. That there is in the county of Anglesey and within my diocese of Bangor the benefice or vicarage of Bodedern which comprises the district which is hereinafter called the 'said district' and is more particularly described in the schedule hereto.

Nhowyn annexed containing according to the last census a total population of 816. That both chapelries have churches situated two miles and one and half miles respectively from the said district in which baptisms churchings marriages and burials have been performed from time immemorial.

That the patronage of or right of collation to the said vicarage of Bodedern belongs to me in right of my See of Bangor and I hereby signify my consent as such patron and the Reverend James Evans is the incumbent thereof; that the Bishop of Llandaff is the present patron and the Reverend John Alfred Rees is the present incumbent of the said benefice of Rhoscolyn with the ancient chapelries of Llanfairyn-Neubwll and Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn annexed.

"7. That there is a considerable hamlet or village known as Cae'r-geiliog situate partly within the said district and partly within the said chapelries adjacent to and contiguous to the said district and that it is now proposed to erect a church or churchroom on a site voluntarily given and situate within the said district for the convenience and accommodation of the inhabitants of the said hamlet.

"8. That it appears to me that the said district may under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838, be advantageously separated from the said vicarage and parish of Bodedern and be annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said benefice of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries aforenamed thereto annexed and to be and become part of the said chapelry of Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the said Act of Parliament I the said bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing appended hereto describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations can best be effected and how the changes in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested.

"And I do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with my consent thereto in writing as patron of the said benefice of Bodedern and that of the Bishop of Llandaff as patron of the benefice of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries aforesaid annexed And also the consents in writing of the incumbents of the said benefices to the intent that if your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council.

"That the portion of the said parish of Bodedern mentioned and described in the above schedule and more particularly delineated in the annexed plan be separated from the said parish and be united for ecclesiastical purposes to the said parish or benefice of Rhoscolyn and be and become part of the said chapelry of Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn and that such portion shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefice and That the inhabitants of the said district of the parish of Bodedern shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the said parish church of Bodedern and shall be exonerated from all liability if any to repair the said parish church but shall be entitled to accommodation in the church of Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn and shall be liable subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868, to the repairs of the church of Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn.

"That the incumbent of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries of Llanfairyn-Neubwll and Llanfangelyn-Nhowyn annexed shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the above described portion or district of the parish of

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of any of the benefices affected by the scheme nor shall the endowments of any such benefices be in anywise affected except as stated in the next succeeding clause.

in the next succeeding clause.

"That all ecclesiastical dues offerings and other emoluments other than tithes arising from or in respect of the said portion or district of Bodedern and usually payable to the incumbent of a benefice shall belong and be paid to the incumbent of Rhoscolyn with Llanfairyn-Neubwll and Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn."

And whereas the said bishop, as patron of the said vicarage of Bodedern, has consented in writing to the said scheme, and the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard, Lord Bishop of Llandaff, as patron and the Reverend John Alfred Rees as incumbent of the said rectory of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries of Llanfairyn-Neubwll and Llanfihangelyn-Nhowyn annexed, and the Reverend James Evans, as incumbent of the said vicarage of Bodedern, have signed the consents following:—

"That there is in the county of Anglesey and diocese of Bangor the benefice or vicarage of Bodedern within which is comprised a certain district situated two miles from the parish church of Bodedern (and more particularly described in the schedule to the scheme annexed hereto and verged red in the plan attached to such scheme).

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the benefice or rectory of Rhoscolyn with the ancient chapelries of Llanfair-yn-Neubwll and Llanfihangel-yn-Nhowyn yn-Neubwll and Llanfihangel-yn-Nhowyn annexed which chapelries both have churches situate two miles and one and a half miles

respectively from the said district.
"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 the said district may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Bodedern and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said benefice of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries aforenamed annexed, and be and become part of the said chapelry of Llanfihangel-

yn-Nhowyn to which it is contiguous.
"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act of Parliament the said bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme together with the consent thereto in writing of the said Bishop as the patron or person entitled, in right of his see, to present to the said vicarage of Bodedern (if the same were now vacant) and of the Reverend James Evans the incumbent of the same benefice and the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard Lord Bishop of Llandaff the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries of Llanfair-yn-Neubwll and Llanfihangel-yn-Nhowyn annexed (if the same were now vacant) and of the Reverend John Alfred Rees the incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop

for our consideration.
"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred

to are hereunto annexed.

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"And we the said archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Oider for carrying the said scheme into effect.

CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES. COURT OF CLAIMS.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on

the List.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of Rights or Services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

McNab is an assistant foreman fitter in their factory of Messrs. Nobel's Explosives Company at Ardeer, in Ayrshire. On the 11th of November, 1910, a man named Richard Morgan was repairing an electric wire on the top floor of a four-storey building when he was overcome by poisonous fumes given off by au

overflow of acid on the ground floor. fumes, which were dense and suffocating, soon filled the building, and McNab and two other workmen went up an outside staircase, provided for cases of emergency, in search of Morgan; but, receiving no reply to their shouts, descended. McNab then, learning from other workmen that Morgan was on the roof, went up the staircase again, but without success. The sound of breaking glass and shouts were heard from the top floor, and McNab went up for the third time, and succeeded in entering the room where Morgan was. Crawling in on his hands and knees, he managed to grasp Morgan's hand and drag him out to the landing, where he obtained assistance in carrying Morgan downstairs. McNab showed presence of mind and persistent bravery in face of danger, though his efforts to save Morgan's life were unfortunately unavailing, as Morgan succumbed after some hours to the effects of the poisonous fumes.
