several portions of Hound hereinbefore mentioned may be advantageously separated therefrom and be respectively annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said several before-mentioned parishes to which they are contiguous, and in pursuance of the twenty-sixth section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have prepared the following Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights of pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace with the consents in writing of the said patrons and Incumbents of the said benefices respectively to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and inquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents to His Majesty in

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents of the patrons and Incumbents of the said benefices respectively are as follows:-

## "SCHEME.

"That there shall be separated from the parish of Hound and annexed to the contiguous parish of Bursledon All that part (being two portions) of the said parish of Hound which is bounded by the Hamble River on the east and the road from Bursledon Common past Windhover and Bursledon Towers and the footpath through Pilands Wood to the footbridge into Hungerford Bottom on the west and coloured pink on the said plan.

"That there shall also be separated from the said parish of Hound and annexed to the contiguous parish of Hamble le Rice that part of the said parish which is bounded on the east by the River Hamble on the south by the said parish of Hamble le Rice on the west and north by the new and present boundary between the civil parishes of Hamble le Rice and Hound and coloured green on the said

"And that there shall also be separated from the said parish of Hound and annexed to the contiguous parish of Saint Mary Extra, Southampton All that detached part of the said parish which is bounded on the east by the parish of Sholing and on all other sides by the said parish of Saint Mary Extra Southampton and coloured brown on the said plan.

That the several Incumbents of the said parishes of Bursledon, Hamble le Rice and Saint Mary Extra Southampton shall respectively have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portions so separated from Hound and annexed to their respective parishes as

aforesaid.

That the inhabitants of such portions shall be entitled to accommodation in the churches of the parishes to which they shall be respectively annexed but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the parish church of Hound except nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Hound who may not be

willing to relinquish and give up the same.
"That the inhabitants of such portions so separated as aforesaid shall have the right of

churchings in the churches of the parishes to which they shall respectively be annexed and all fees, dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments in respect of the performance of such services arising from and out of such portions so separated as aforesaid shall hereafter belong to the Incumbent of the parish to which such portion has been severally annexed.
"That no alteration shall be made in respect

of the tithe rent charges or other endowments of the said benefices or any or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage of the said benefices or any or either of them.

## " CONSENTS.

"We the Warden and Scholars Clerks of St. Mary College of Winchester near Winchester being the patrons or person entitled to present or nominate to both the benefices of Hound and Hamble le Rice in the county of Hants in case the same or either of them were now vacant Herbert Edward, Bishop of Winchester, by virtue of our Bishopric, being the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to both the benefices of Bursledon and St. Mary Extra, Southampton, in case the same or either of them were now vacant, the Reverend William Alfred Cramer Chevalier, Incumbent of Hound aforesaid, the Reverend William Shirley, Incumbent of Bursledon aforesaid, the Reverend Alexander Mackin-Incumbent  $\mathbf{of}$ Hamble le  $_{
m the}$  $\mathbf{and}$ Reverend Thomas aforesaid Lewis Owen Davies, the Incumbent of St. Mary Extra Southampton do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Herbert Edward Lord Bishop of Winchester has represented unto us amongst other things

"That there is in the county of Hants and his diocese of Winchester the benefice of Hound separated as aforesaid shall have the right of containing a population of 2,429 or therethe solemnization of marriages, baptisms and abouts.
