the county of Anglesey and diocese of Bangor hereby signify to your Grace my consent to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand this eleventh day of February one thousand nine hundred and ten.

bishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report, dated the fourth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and ten:-

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do

hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:
"That the Right Reverend Watkin Herbert Lord Bishop of Bangor has represented unto us amongst other things:--

"That there is in the county of Anglesey and diocese of Bangor the benefice or vicarage of Bodedern within which is comprised a certain district situated two miles from the parish church of Bodedern (and more particularly described in the schedule to the scheme annexed hereto and verged red in the plan attached to such scheme).

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the benefice or rectory of Rhoscolyn with the ancient chapelries of Llanfair-yn-Neubwll and Llanfihangel-yn-Nhowyn yn-Neubwll and Llanfihangel-yn-Nhowyn annexed which chapelries both have churches situate two miles and one and a half miles

respectively from the said district.
"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 the said district may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Bodedern and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the said benefice of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries aforenamed annexed, and be and become part of the said chapelry of Llanfihangel-

yn-Nhowyn to which it is contiguous.
"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act of Parliament the said bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alterations in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme together with the consent thereto in writing of the said Bishop as the patron or person entitled, in right of his see, to present to the said vicarage of Bodedern (if the same were now vacant) and of the Reverend James Evans the incumbent of the same benefice and the consent of the Right Reverend Joshua Pritchard Lord Bishop of Llandaff the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Rhoscolyn with the chapelries of Llanfair-yn-Neubwll and Llanfihangel-yn-Nhowyn annexed (if the same were now vacant) and of the Reverend John Alfred Rees the incumbent of the same benefice has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop

for our consideration.
"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

.

"And we the said archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Oider for carrying the said scheme into effect.
