CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES. COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July, 1910), and of fees to be received for the same, hereby require all persons who may still be desirous of exhibiting Petitions and Claims concerning such Services to make their Petitions or Claims on or before Saturday, the 4th day of March next.

The said Commissioners, at their Meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 16th day of December, 1910, resolved as follows:---

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned. 3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel, Solicitors, or Agents.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the List.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of Rights or Services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey. In compliance with the Royal Order in Council of June 16th, 1905, the Royal Swedish Board of Trade declare Manchuria and the town of Tientsin, in China, *infected* with plague; the Government of Cherson and town of Odessa, in Russia, and the towns of Osaka and Kobe, in Japan, free from plague; and, lastly, the provinces of Bari, Foggia and Girgenti, in Italy, and the parts of Russia in Europe that have hitherto been considered as infected with cholera with exception of the Governments of Podolia, Kiev, Ekaterinoslav, Kasan and Orenburg free from the last named disease.

In accordance with the notices issued the following districts and places are considered as infected:

Egypt; Peru; Valparaiso, Antofagasta and Pisagua, in Chile; the provinces of Hedschas and Yemen, in Arabia; the Ural and Transcaspian districts, in Asia; Afghanistan; the ports of Schat-el-Arab; British East India; Rangoon, in British Burma; Manila on Luzon; the island of Formosa; Hanoi, in Tonkin; Amoy and Tientsin, in China; Manchuria; Sydney, Perth, Fremantle and Geraldton, in Australia; and

With cholera:

The provinces of Lecce and Palermo, in Italy; the Governments of *Podolia*, *Kiev*, *Ekaterinoslav*, *Kasan* and *Orenburg*, in Russia; the ports of the Red Sea; the ports of British East India; Cochinchina; Tonkin; China; Morocco and Madeira.

The station of observation and quarantine is, until further notice, located at Känsö, near Gothenburg. A station of observation for cholera is arranged at Kalmar.


