GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

With reference to Government Notice No. 75, of 24th March, 1910, it is hereby notified that Algiers is no longer regarded as a place infected with typhus fever, within the meaning of Article 1 of the Regulations made under the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, 1908, and published on the 28th August, 1908, as amended by Government Notices Nos. 199, 214, 243, 290 and 324 of 1910.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of a Despatch, dated 9th February, from His Majesty's Minister at Athens, stating that, by a Royal Decree, dated the 20th January last, medical inspection has been imposed as a sanitary precaution against cholera on arrivals from Suez and Beyrouth, while pilgrims returning from Mecca will be prohibited from landing at any Greek ports where the vessels carrying them may happen to touch.

The Board of Trade have received, through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a copy of the following Notice, dated 6th February, issued by the Swedish Board of Trade:—

In compliance with the Royal Order in Council of June 16th, 1905, the Royal Swedish Board of Trade declare Manchuria and the town of Tientsin, in China, *infected* with plague; the Government of Cherson and town of Odessa, in Russia, and the towns of Osaka and Kobe, in Japan, free from plague; and, lastly, the provinces of Bari, Foggia and Girgenti, in Italy, and the parts of Russia in Europe that have hitherto been considered as infected with cholera with exception of the Governments of Podolia, Kiev, Ekaterinoslav, Kasan and Orenburg free from the last named disease.

In accordance with the notices issued the following districts and places are considered as infected:

With plague:

Egypt; Peru; Valparaiso, Antofagasta and Pisagua, in Chile; the provinces of Hedschas and Yemen, in Arabia; the Ural and Transcaspian districts, in Asia; Afghanistan; the ports of Schat-el-Arab; British East India; Rangoon, in British Burma; Manila on Luzon; the island of Formosa; Hanoi, in Tonkin; Amoy and Tientsin, in China; Manchuria; Sydney, Perth, Fremantle and Geraldton, in Australia; and

With cholera:

The provinces of Lecce and Palermo, in Italy; the Governments of *Podolia, Kiev, Ekaterinoslav, Kasan and Orenburg*, in Russia; the ports of the Red Sea; the ports of British East India; Cochinchina; Tonkin; China; Morocco and Madeira.

The station of observation and quarantine is, until further notice, located at Kånsö, near Gothenburg. A station of observation for cholera is arranged at Kalmar.
