FRANK DIAMOND.

On the 7th of June, 1910, Diamond saw one of the patients climbing a stack pipe at the Asylum, and, realising the man's danger, immediately followed him up the pipe. The man got on to the roof, at a height of about 37 feet, where Diamond reached him, and succeeded in supporting him until a rope and ladder were brought, and the patient was rescued unhurt.

MRS. FRANCES MAUDE WRIGHT.

On the 26th December, 1910, at about 1 a.m., Mrs. Wright had left her house to go to friends, when she saw a man running in her direction pursued by Police Constable Haytread. The man deliberately turned roundpausing to take aim-and fired at the constable; he then ran on, and again turned and fired a second shot. The constable was then close to his man, who fired a third time, before he was seized and a struggle ensued. Haytread called to Mrs. Wright to help and asked her to blow his whistle; she came up without hesitation, well aware of the risk, and got hold of the man's collar and struck him in the face with her fist. She then broke the police whistle off its chain and blew it. A severe struggle now ensued between the officer and the burglar, through which Mrs. Wright still retained her hold on the latter. He, however, got his arm free and again fired; locked with the constable he then fell to the ground and pressed the revolver against Haytread's head and pulled the trigger, but the weapon providentially missed fire. Mrs. Wright had in the meantime struck the man in the face and in so doing injured her left hand; her cries for assistance were probably responsible for bringing Seaman Barber to the spot. The burglar still held the revolver, but with further assistance he was overpowered.

Mrs. Wright is the wife of a newsagent's carman and has six children. But for her fearless action, the consequences might have been serious, and a most dangerous criminal (for he had previously attempted to shoot a constable) would not improbably have escaped.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1911.

Dated 21st February, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as the Wild Birds Protection (North Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1911.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 1st day of September following, except with respect to the following birds:—

Mallard or Wild Duck, Golden Plover, Snipe, Teal, Widgeon, and Woodcock.

The time during which the killing or taking of the Birds so excepted is prohibited shall be extended so as to be between the last day of February in any year and the 12th day of August following.

The Owl Protected during the whole of the Year throughout the Administrative County.

III. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the Owl (all species) is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the North Riding of Yorkshire.

All Birds Protected during the whole of the Year within certain Areas.

IV. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited on the sands and sea shore to the limit of low-water mark

(a) Within, and adjacent to, the Borough of Scarborough, from a point known as White Nab on the south to Scalby Beck on the north.

(b) Within the limits of the Port of Whitby, which extends one mile and a half westward, and one mile eastward, from the existing Lighthouse on the northern extremity of the West Pier of the Harbour.

Repeal of former Order.

V. The Order of the 10th June, 1907, is hereby repealed.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (East Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1911.

Dated 22nd February, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, I hereby make the following Order:——

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (East Riding of Yorkshire) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The period during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act

of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, except as regards the Mallard (Wild Duck), Golden Plover, Snipe and Woodcock, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in each year.

As regards the Mallard (Wild Duck), Golden Plover, Snipe and Woodcock, the close time shall be altered so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough Legged Buzzard, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Common Heron, Hobby, Kite, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Raven, Bearded Tit or Reedling.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire:—

Fee Eater, Bittern, Little Bittern, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dotterel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Black-headed Gull, Kittiwake Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel or Windhover, Kingfisher, Kite, Linnet, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny or Brown Owl, White or Barn Owl, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Roller, Swallow, Swift, Tern (all species), Bearded Tit or Reedling, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

· All Birds protected within certain Areas.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited

- (a) On or from the piers or seashore of Bridlington.
- (b) On or from the sands and seashore between the south landing in the parish of Flamborough and the Skipsea Watch House, in the parish of Skipsea.

All Birds protected on Sundays within certain Areas.

VI. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Pro-

tection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the undermentioned Urban and Rural Districts, including the foreshore within the East Riding of Yorkshire; the estuary of the Humber, and the tidal portion of the River Hull:—

Urban Districts.—Beverley (except in the parish of St. Martin), Bridlington, Cotting-ham, Driffield, Filey, Hedon, Hessle, Hornsea, Norton, Pocklington, and Withernsea.

sea, Norton, Pocklington, and Withernsea.
Rural Districts.—Beverley, Bridlington,
Driffield, Escrick, Howden, Norton, Patrington, Pocklington, Riccall, Sculcoates,
Sherburn, and Skirlaugh.

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

VII. The Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Eccs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the East Riding.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

Bittern, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Stone Curlew, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dotterel, Wild Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe, Black-headed Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Nightingale, Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Owl (all species), Ringed Plover, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Snipe, Swallow, Swift, Tern (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Turtle Dovc, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Reed Warbler, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Eggs.

All Eggs protected within certain Areas.

IX. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order:—

(1) On the Promontory of Spurn, including Kilnsea Warren south of the line taken by the road leading from the Village of Kilnsea towards the site of the old Village of Kilnsea.

(2) On Hornsea Mere and the lands immediately adjoining, the boundary of which area (outlined in pink on an Ordnance map sealed with the Seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 22nd February, 1911, and deposited with the Clerk of the County Council) commences at a point on the Hornsea and Seaton-road 7 chains east of Mill Lane, and proceeds in a south-easterly direction along the road past the north-east side of "Great Wassand" for

a distance of about 51 chains, thence along a footpath on the south side of the Mere to Lelly Lane, thence north-easterly for 1½ chains along the north side of Lelly Lane, thence in a north-westerly direction along the boundary fence dividing property belonging to Mr. William Bethell and Mr. Constable to the Mere, thence along the edge of the water of the Mere to and along a stream passing the west front of Ventnor House, to the Hornsea and Seaton Road, and then along the south side of the said road to the above-mentioned point 7 chains east of Mill Lane.

Repeal of former Order.

X. The Order of the 29th January, 1906, is hereby repealed.
