of 1880 shall be extended throughout the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire, except as regards the Mallard (Wild Duck), Golden Plover, Snipe and Woodcock, so as to be between the last day of February and the 1st day of September in each year.

As regards the Mallard (Wild Duck), Golden Plover, Snipe and Woodcock, the close time shall be altered so as to be between the last day of February and the 12th day of August in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:---

Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough Legged Buzzard, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Common Heron, Hobby, Kite, Merlin, Nuthatch, Osprey, Raven, Bearded Tit or Reedling.

Certain Birds Protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II. of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire:--

Eee Eater, Bittern, Little Bittern, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Rough-legged Buzzard, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dotterel, Golden Eagle, Sea Eagle, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Black-headed Gull, Kittiwake Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Hobby, Hoopoe, Kestrel or Windhover, Kingfisher, Kite, Linnet, Merlin, Nightingale, Nightjar (Goat Sucker, Night Hawk, or Fern Owl), Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Osprey, Long-eared Owl, Short-eared Owl, Tawny or Brown Owl, White or Barn Owl, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Roller, Swallow, Swift, Tern (all species), Bearded Tit or Reedling, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker.

· All Birds protected within certain Areas.

V. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited

(a) On or from the piers or seashore of Bridlington.

(b) On or from the sands and seashore between the south landing in the parish of Flamborough and the Skipsea Watch House, in the parish of Skipsea.

All Birds protected on Sundays within certain Areas.

VI. During those periods of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays is prohibited throughout the undermentioned Urban and Rural Districts, including the foreshore within the East Riding of Yorkshire; the estuary of the Humber, and the tidal portion of the River Hull:—

Urban Districts.—Beverley (except in the parish of St. Martin), Bridhogton, Cottingham, Driffield, Filey, Hedon, Hessle, Hornsea, Norton, Pocklington, and Witherusea

sea, Norton, Pocklington, and Withernsea. Rural Districts.—Beverley, Bridlington, Driffield, Escrick, Howden, Norton, Patrington, Pocklington, Riccall, Sculcoates, Sherburn, and Skirlaugh.

The House Sparrow deprived of protection.

VII. The Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire is hereby exempted from the operation of the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, so far as the House Sparrow is concerned.

Eccs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the East Riding.

VIII. The taking or destroying of the eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of the East Riding of Yorkshire for a period of five years from the date of this Order :---

Bittern, Blackheaded Bunting, Cirl Bunting, Corn Bunting, Reed Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Common Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Corn Crake (Land Rail), Stone Curlew, Dipper or Water Ouzel, Dotterel, Wild Duck, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Great Crested Grebe, Little Grebe, Black-headed Gull, Hen Harrier, Marsh Harrier, Montagu's Harrier, Heron, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Merlin, Nightjar (Fern Owl, Goat Sucker, Night Hawk), Nightingale, Nuthatch, Golden Oriole, Owl (all species), Ringed Plover, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Snipe, Swallow, Swift, Tern (all species), Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Turtle Dovc, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Reed Warbler, Woodcock, Green Woodpecker, Great Spotted Woodpecker, Lesser Spotted Woodpecker, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snakebird).

Eggs.

All Eggs protected within certain Areas.

IX. The taking or destroying of Wild Birds' Eggs is prohibited for a period of five years from the date of this Order:---

(1) On the Promontory of Spurn, including Kilnsea Warren south of the line taken by the road leading from the Village of Kilnsea towards the site of the old Village of Kilnsea.

(2) On Hornsea Mere and the lands immediately adjoining, the boundary of which area (outlined in pink on an Ordnance map sealed with the Seal of the Secretary of State, dated the 22nd February, 1911, and deposited with the Clerk of the County Council) commences at a point on the Hornsea and Seaton-road 7 chains east of Mill Lane, and proceeds in a south-easterly direction along the road past the north-east side of "Great Wassand" for
