## LEVÉE.

Applications from Irish Gentlemen (other than Naval, Military, and Royal Irish Constabulary Officers in the categories mentioned below) wishing to be summoned should be addressed to the Lord Chamberlain, St. James's Palace, London, not sooner than the 15th March next, and not later than the 15th April next. *Applications made other than between these two dates cannot be considered.*

Gentlemen who have already been presented at Levées held by The King, by The late King Edward VII, or by or on behalf of Queen Victoria, should notify the fact when making their applications. They should also state if they wish to make presentations at the Levée, and, if so, forward the names of the gentlemen they wish to present when they send in their own names.

Gentlemen who have not been previously presented should notify the fact in their applications.

All presentations of gentlemen (other than

Naval, Military, or Royal Irish Constabulary Officers) whose names are not forwarded by someone qualified to present them, will be made by His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant of Ireland.

Naval Officers and Officers of the Royal Marines on duty with the Fleet in Irish waters will be presented by, and should send in their applications to, the Senior Officer on the Coast of Ireland, Queenstown.

Officers of the Army and Territorial Force quartered in Ireland will be presented by, and should send in their applications to, the General Officer Commanding-in-Chief the Forces in Ireland, Royal Hospital, Dublin.

Officers of the Royal Irish Constabulary will be presented by, and should send in their applications to, the Inspector-General, Dublin Castle.

#### CORONATION OF THEIR MAJESTIES.

##### COURT OF CLAIMS.

The Right Honourable the Commissioners appointed by His Majesty to hear and determine all Claims of Services to be performed at the time of the ensuing Coronation (except those dispensed with by His Majesty's Royal Proclamation of the 19th day of July, 1910), and of fees to be received for the same, hereby require all persons who may still be desirous of exhibiting Petitions and Claims concerning

such Services to make their Petitions or Claims on or before Saturday, the 4th day of March next.

The said Commissioners, at their Meeting held at the Council Office, Whitehall, on the 16th day of December, 1910, resolved as follows:—

1. All Claims must be made by Petition. Petitions may be sent under cover to the Clerks of the Court of Claims, Privy Council Office, Downing Street, London, S.W.

2. Petitioners are not required to appear in person unless summoned.

3. Petitioners may appear by Counsel, Solicitors, or Agents.

4. If a Claim was admitted in 1901-2, all that is required from the Petitioner (or his present representative) is a short formal Petition (without Appearance) stating that he is the same Petitioner, or his representative (and if representative in what capacity), and that the Petition was allowed in 1901-2, in order that there may be a record.

5. No Claim excluded by the Court in 1901-2 as inappropriate to the Coronation by reason of the Royal Proclamation, and inappropriate for the same reason to the forthcoming Coronation, will be placed on the List.

6. Any Claim now made, which was referred by the Court in 1901-2 to the Executive Committee for the purposes of arrangements for the Coronation, shall be referred to the same Committee.

The Commissioners are required by the Proclamation to exclude from their consideration such claims as may be submitted to them in respect of Rights or Services connected with the parts of the Ceremonial heretofore performed in Westminster Hall and with the Procession, the Ceremony being confined to Westminster Abbey.

## ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH FEBRUARY 1911.)

MONMOUTHSHIRE (GLANDERS) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

### *Regulations for Prevention of Spread of Glanders.*

1. The Monmouthshire County Council may for the purpose of preventing the spread of glanders make Regulations applicable to their district or any part of their district for the following purposes:—

(a) For prohibiting the sale or disposal or removal from the colliery premises by the occupier of a colliery of any horse, ass or mule which has been used in or about the colliery, or of the carcase of any such horse, ass or mule or the burial or destruction of any such carcase except under the authority of a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority unless and until a reasonable opportunity has been given to the Council to ascertain by the application of the mallein test or otherwise as the Council shall direct whether the animal or carcase is affected with glanders; and

(b) for prescribing notice to the Council of any intended sale, disposal, removal, burial or destruction of any such horse, ass, mule or carcase.

### *Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.*

2. Horses, asses and mules shall be animals, and glanders (including farcy) shall be a disease, for the purposes of the following sections of the Act of 1894, namely:—

Section forty-three (*Police*).

Section forty-four (*General Administrative Provisions*), and of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections

and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

*Short Title.*

3. This Order may be cited as the **MONMOUTHSHIRE (GLANDERS) ORDER OF 1911.**
