\* For convenience Berwick-upon-Tweed is considered to be in Northumberland, Dudley in Worcestershire, Stockport in Cheshire, and the city of London in the county of London.

NOTE.—The term “administrative county” used in the following descriptions of Areas is the district for which a county council is elected under the Local Government Act, 1888, and includes all boroughs in it which are not county boroughs.

The following Areas are now “Infected Areas” for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 :—

**Forfarshire.**—An Area comprising the parishes of Ruthven, Airlie, Kirriemuir, Oathlaw, Careston, Brechin, Dun, Logie Pert, Montrose, Maryton, Farnell, Aberlemno, Rescobie, Forfar, Kinnettles, Glamis, Eassie and Nevay, Newtyle, Kettins, Lundie, Auchterhouse, Tealing, Inverarity, Dunnichen, Guthrie, Kinnell, Craig, Lunan, Inverkeilor, Kirkden, Carmyllie, Monikie, Murroes, Mains and Strathmartine, Liff and Benvie (Landward), Fowlis, Easter, Liff and Benvie (Burghal), Dundee, Monifieth, Barry, Panbride, Arbirlot, Arbroath and St. Vigeans, in the county of Forfar; and also comprising the city of Dundee and burghs of Arbroath, Brechin, Forfar and Montrose (16 February, 1911).

**Leicestershire.**—An Area in the administrative county of Leicester comprising the petty sessional divisions of Loughborough (including the borough of Loughborough), Ashby-de-la-Zouch, and Market Bosworth (except the parishes of Desford, Peckleton, Kirkby Mallory, Stapleton, Dadlington, Stoke Golding, Higham-on-the-Hill, Hinckley, Barwell, Knoll and Bassett House, Thurlaston,

Earl Shilton, Elmesthorpe, Potters Marston, Stoney Stanton, Sapcote, Sharnford, Aston Flamville, Burbage, and that portion of the parish of Ratby which falls within the petty sessional division of Market Bosworth); and also comprising the parishes of Markfield, Ratcliffe-on-the-Wreak, and Thrusington (16 December, 1910).

**Perthshire.**—An Area comprising the parishes of Coupar Angus, Cargill, Longforgan, Inchtute, Abernyte, Collace, Kinnaird, Errol, Kilspindie, St. Martins, Scone, Kinnoull, Kinfauns, St. Madoes, Abernethy, Rhynd, Dunbarney, Perth, Tibbermore, Redgorton, Moneydie, Methven, Madderty, Trinity Gask, Findo Gask, Auchterarder, Dunning, Forteviot, Aberdalgie, Forgan-denny, Dron, and Arngask, in the county of Perth; and also comprising the city of Perth (9 February, 1911).

**Wiltshire.**—An Area in the administrative county of Wilts, comprising the petty sessional division of Chippenham, and the parish of Bremhill (25 October, 1910).
