MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF BERKS.

Whereas by subsection 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of Berks have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said subsection, putting the above mentioned provisions of that subsection in force within the limits comprising the following roads or parts of roads at Old Windsor, in the county of Berks, that is to say:—

The main road from the county boundary near Runnymede House, for a distance of 280 yards to its junction with the district road near Ouseley Lodge; the district road from the last named point for a distance of 1,910 yards to its junction with the main road near the Tapestry Works; the main road from the last named junction for a distance of 313 yards to the motor caution post in Albert Road; and Albany Road, branching out of the district road aforesaid, and extending for a distance of 390 yards to its junction with Albert Road.

Notice is hereby further given, that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board, at their offices at Whitehall, London, on or before the twenty-first day of March, 1911.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council of Berks, Market Place, Reading.
