WHEREAS by the Statutes made for the University of London by the Commissioners appointed under the University of London Act, 1898, it is (amongst other things) provided that four members of the Senate of the said University shall be appointed by His Majesty in Council:

And whereas the four members of the said Senate so appointed under the said Statutes are at present Sir John Wolfe Wolfe-Barry, K.C.B., F.R.S.; the Honourable W. Pember Reeves; Francis Dyke Acland, Esquire; and Professor Arthur Schuster, F.R.S.

And whereas the term of office of the said Sir John Wolfe Wolfe-Barry, K.C.B., F.R.S., and the said Professor Arthur Schuster, F.R.S., will expire on the 9th day of May next:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to re-appoint the said Sir John Wolfe Wolfe-Barry, K.C.B., F.R.S., and the said Professor Arthur Schuster, F.R.S., to be members of the Senate of the said University of London.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme bearing date the nineteenth day of January, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter fifty, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an exchange of the patronage of the benefice (being a rectory) of Kirkby Underdale, situate in the county of York and in the diocese of York, for the patronage of the benefice

(being a vicarage) of Yalding, situate in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester.

“ Whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Kirkby Underdale is vested in Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors, and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

“ And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Yalding is vested in the Honourable Edward Frederick Lindley Wood, of Temple Newsam, near Leeds, in the West Riding of Yorkshire, a Member of Your Majesty's Commons House of Parliament.

“ And whereas the Right Honourable Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn, now Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and the said Edward Frederick Lindley Wood have respectively signified to us their desire that the patronage of the said two benefices of Kirkby Underdale and Yalding may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

“ And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two benefices and of the patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two benefices are as set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed.

“ And whereas the yearly value of the said benefice of Kirkby Underdale in Your Majesty's books is six pounds three shillings and four pence.

Now therefore with the consent of the said Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Frederick Lindley Wood (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Kirkby Underdale and the church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Edward Frederick Lindley Wood, his heirs and assigns for ever, and that in exchange for the same the whole advowson or perpetual right of patronage of and presentation to the said benefice of Yalding and the church thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Edward Frederick Lindley Wood and shall become and be absolutely vested in Your Majesty, Your heirs and successors for ever, and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Robert Threshie, Baron Loreburn, as Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other
