PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council from time to time, by Order in Council to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make Regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service.

And whereas the Harbour of Rosyth is a "Dockyard Port" within the meaning of the said Act.

And whereas it appears expedient to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service that the limits of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth should be defined.

And whereas the provisions of section one of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Preliminary.

1. This Order shall take effect from the date hereof.
2. The terms used in this Order shall have the same meaning as in the said Dockyard Ports Regulation Act.

Dockyard Port of Rosyth.

3. For the purposes of the said Act and of this Order the limits of the Dockyard Port shall be as follows:—

All the waters, bays, creeks, and rivers so far as the tide flows, excepting the Harbours of Charlestown, South Queensferry, Port Edgar and Inverkeithing, lying between the lines drawn as follows:—

On the East by a line drawn South (true) through the South Point of Carron Harbour in the County of Fife to the South Shore of the Forth.

On the West by a line drawn North (true) through Carriden House to the North Shore of the Forth.

Delineation of Limits.

4. On the Chart accompanying this Order are marked all the limits referred to therein.
5. The regulations contained in the Schedule appended hereto shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Rosyth.

SCHEDULE.

REGULATIONS for the PROTECTION of the DOCKYARD PORT of ROSYTH and of HIS MAJESTY'S PROPERTY therein, and for Anchoring, Berthing, Mooring, and Breathing in that Port.

Limits of the Dockyard Port of Rosyth.

1. The Dockyard Port of Rosyth shall be:—
 All the waters, bays, creeks, and rivers so far as the tide flows, excepting the Harbours of Charlestown, South Queensferry, Port Edgar and Inverkeithing, lying between the lines drawn as follows:—

On the East by a line drawn South (true) through the South Point of Carron Harbour in the County of Fife to the South Shore of the Forth.

On the West by a line drawn North (true) through Carriden House to the North Shore of the Forth.

2. All merchant or other private vessels shall be subject to the direction of the King's Harbour Master.

3. No merchant or other private vessel shall lie, or be moored, so as to impede the free approach to His Majesty's Dockyard at Rosyth.

4. No merchant or other private vessel shall, without licence in writing from the King's Harbour Master, be moored or fastened to any of the Forts, or to any Government moorings, buoys, breakwaters, jetties, piles, or vessels in the Dockyard Port.

5. Moorings for His Majesty's ships, mark buoys, and other aids to navigation, and such other buoys as may be required for any purpose in connection with naval operations, may be placed by the King's Harbour Master in such positions as he may from time to time consider the requirements of His Majesty's Service demand.

6. No merchant or other private vessel shall be anchored or moored within seventy-five fathoms from the centre of any Government moorings, nor in such a position as to be liable to foul any of His Majesty's ships at those moorings.

7. No person shall lay moorings for private vessels in the Dockyard Port, without the permission, in writing, of the King's Harbour Master, and all such moorings shall be in such positions as the King's Harbour Master shall deem fit, and shall be forthwith removed on the requisition of the King's Harbour Master to that effect.

8. If at any time the anchor of any merchant or other private vessel hooks any Government moorings, or any electric cables, or moorings of buoys, the master, or other person having the charge or command of such vessel shall not proceed to unhook the same, but shall forthwith give notice thereof to the King's Harbour Master, in order that aid may be given for clearing such moorings or cables without doing damage to the same.

9. No merchant or other private vessel shall make fast to, or lie at, any of the buoys mark-

ing the channels or shoals in the Dockyard Port.

10. Merchant and other private vessels moored, anchored or placed within the Dockyard Port shall, when directed to do so by the King's Harbour Master, remove to such position as he shall direct. If from having no crew on board or from any other cause the vessel does not remove as directed, the King's Harbour Master may remove the said vessel and recover the expense incurred in so doing from her owner.

11. No merchant or other private vessel shall be breamed in the port within two hundred yards from any of His Majesty's docks, dockyards, arsenals, wharves, or powder magazines.

12. No merchant or other private vessel shall anchor on the lines of any electric cable laid down in the Dockyard Port when such line is indicated by whitewashed posts or other discernible marks erected on shore, and a warning has been conveyed to mariners by notice issued by the Admiralty and published in the London Gazette.

13. No boats are to approach within 100 feet of His Majesty's Dockyard or other Government establishments unless proceeding to or from the same on duty or with permission from the King's Harbour Master.

14. Whenever it may be necessary for mining or gunnery operations or experiments, dredging operations, or other naval purposes to reserve any area for such operations or purposes, the area will be marked by buoys coloured green and white, or by posts coloured red; and after twenty-one days' warning notice has been issued by the Admiralty, and published in the London Gazette, no vessel shall anchor within or pass through the area so marked, unless compelled to do so by stress of weather, or to avoid accident; nor when such area is uncovered or nearly uncovered at low water, shall any person pass through it, or remain in it, unless by permission of, and under such arrangements as may be from time to time made by, the officer in charge of such operations.

Penalties.

15. The master of every merchant or other private vessel to which this Order relates shall observe and cause to be observed the provisions of this Order as far as it relates to his vessel, and if any master or other person acts in any respect in contravention of any of the foregoing provisions and regulations of this Order, he shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding the sum of ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the 582nd and 583rd sections of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, it is enacted that a Pilotage Authority may, by Bye-law made under Part X of that Act, do all or any of the things specified in section 582; but that a Bye-law so made shall not take effect until it is submitted to His Majesty in Council and confirmed by Order in Council:

And whereas the Humber Conservancy Board, being a Pilotage Authority, have made

and submitted for the confirmation of His Majesty in Council certain Bye-laws as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the proposed Bye-laws are proper and reasonable:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to approve of, and doth by this Order confirm, the said Bye-laws, as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed, and doth repeal all existing Orders in Council relating to Goole Pilotage except the Orders in Council dated respectively the 21st Day of December, 1908, and the 22nd day of April, 1910.

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order in Council refers.

The HUMBER CONSERVANCY BOARD, the Pilotage Authority for the rivers Humber, Ouse, and Trent, by virtue and in pursuance of the several powers contained in section 582 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and all other powers vested in them in that behalf, do make the following Bye-laws, that is to say:—

1. These Bye-laws shall be cited as "The Goole Pilotage Bye-laws, 1910."

2. The Pilot Master shall under the Sub-Commissioners of Pilotage for the Port of Goole and subject to the powers and authorities vested in the Humber Conservancy Board exercise supervision and control over the Goole Pilots and shall be responsible for the efficient working of the Goole Pilotage Service and for the carrying out of these Bye-laws and the orders of the said Board and Sub-Commissioners.

3. In pursuance of the provisions of section 613 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, each pilot shall be provided with a flag half red and half white in horizontal stripes, the uppermost to be white, not less than three feet in length by two feet in breadth, which flag a pilot shall on all occasions when he shall be sent to take charge of a vessel either inward or outward bound, take with him and cause to be hoisted in some conspicuous place on the vessel and continue to fly so long as he remains in charge of such vessel. The cost of such flag shall be paid out of the pilots' earnings.

4. Pilots shall be put on board of vessels whether inward or outward bound in rotation so that every pilot shall have a fair proportion of duty.

5. Pilots shall without delay deliver their pilotage notes duly signed by the Masters of the vessels piloted to the Goole Office of the said Board. Pilots shall satisfy themselves that the exact drafts of the vessels piloted (neither more nor less) are inserted in such pilotage notes.

6. Every pilot who is not invalidated shall attend daily as follows, viz.:—

If on duty at Hull at the Goole Pilot's Office not less than four hours before high water and until high water at Hull.

If on duty at Goole at the Pilot Office at the making of the flood tide and shall immediately upon coming on duty sign the day books at those respective places stating the exact time of signature on pain of being fined in default five shillings for the first offence and a sum not exceeding twenty

shillings nor less than five shillings for each subsequent offence.

7. The senior pilot on duty at Hull shall see that the day book is duly signed each tide as required by Bye-law 6 hereof, and he shall promptly report to the Pilot Master any omission so to do or other irregularity.

8. The senior pilot on duty at Hull and the Pilot Master at Goole shall inspect the respective day books each tide, and shall by initialling the same certify as to the correctness of the signatures and the other particulars given.

9. If the Pilot Master is absent on leave or in consequence of illness the day book at Goole shall be inspected daily by or on behalf of the Secretary to the said Sub-Commissioners, and be initialled and certified by him as to the correctness of the signatures and the other particulars given.

10. In order to avoid the detention in Hull Roads of vessels bound to Goole, it shall be the duty of the Goole Pilots residing at Hull to make arrangements in accordance with the instructions of the Pilot Master to notify him each tide as to the expected number of inward bound vessels requiring the services of pilots in sufficient time to enable him to arrange for the provision of such further pilots as may appear to be requisite.

11. No pilot shall be absent from duty at any time without leave having been first obtained from the said Sub-Commissioners.

12. No pilots (except those actually in charge of vessels concerned in litigation) shall make any statement or statements whatsoever with reference to a collision or other casualty occurring within the limits of the Goole Pilots without having first obtained the permission of the said Sub-Commissioners, and a copy of each statement when made shall be forwarded without delay to the Secretary to the aforesaid Sub-Commissioners.

13. Every pilot shall use his utmost care and diligence in piloting the vessel under his charge, and shall within twenty-four hours of his discharge from such vessel deposit at or despatch by post to the Office of the said Sub-Commissioners a report in writing of any accident having occurred to such vessel whilst under his charge.

14. Every pilot when in charge of any vessel shall insist on the use of the sounding appliances when necessary.

15. Pilots shall take charge of vessels and proceed with them at any time when in the opinion of the Pilot Master they can do so with safety.

16. Pilots shall go on board of outward bound vessels in dock in sufficient time to ascertain if they are ready to proceed.

17. Pilots who are on duty at Hull shall go on board vessels lying in Hull Roads and requiring Goole Pilots not less than three hours before high water at Hull, and shall proceed immediately it is possible for them to do so with safety.

18. Pilots proceeding to or from vessels at Hull shall on every occasion, unless prevented by unavoidable circumstances, use the services of the Pilot launch or other vessel provided by the aforesaid Board for that purpose.

19. Pilots when on duty either ashore or afloat shall wear the appointed cap and badge of the Service on pain of being fined five shillings for each omission so to do.

20. A pilot shall not, except in cases of emer-

gency, lay any vessel aground without an order from the Owner or Master of such vessel.

21. No pilot shall leave the vessel of which he has charge until she is moored in one of the docks or safely anchored in the river, nor then without permission from the officer in command or on being relieved by a qualified pilot.

22. Pilots shall conduct themselves with strict sobriety and with due respect to the owners, masters and officers of the vessels under their charge.

23. Pilots shall obey all orders received from the said Sub-Commissioners and the Pilot Master.

24. Whenever a pilot has information that any buoy, beacon or light vessel has been driven away, broken down, damaged, or is out of position, he shall at once, by telegram if necessary, inform the said Board at their Offices at Hull or Goole as may be most convenient. He shall also without delay report in writing any alterations he may observe in any of the banks or channels in the rivers.

25. Pilots shall immediately notify any change in their places of residence to the Secretary to the said Sub-Commissioners and to the Pilot Master.

26. Every pilot who is unable through sickness to discharge his duties shall immediately inform the Pilot Master or cause him to be informed, and shall furnish to the Secretary to the said Sub-Commissioners a medical certificate by a duly registered medical practitioner approved by the Sub-Commissioners or by the said Board who has actually seen the patient, stating the nature of his illness, which certificate shall be endorsed or renewed every fourteen days until such pilot shall return to his duties.

27. Pilots shall (subject to the approval of the said Sub-Commissioners) receive during temporary absence through sickness or accident the same share of pilotage to which they would have been entitled if they had been in the full discharge of their duties, but if a pilot is frequently absent from duty on account of sickness the said Sub-Commissioners shall order a special medical examination of such pilot to be made at the cost of such pilot and shall decide as to his fitness to remain in the Service.

28. In case any pilot shall in the opinion of the said Sub-Commissioners feign illness or be prevented from attending to his duty by illness brought on through his own misconduct such pilot shall be reported to the said Board.

29. So long as the pilotage earnings shall be placed in a common fund and be divided equally amongst the pilots it shall be the duty of every pilot to account for and pay into the Goole Pilots' Superannuation Fund any sum of money he may receive during absence from duty for attendance as a witness in any court except sums received solely in respect of hotel or travelling expenses.

30. The said Sub-Commissioners may (with the consent and concurrence of the said Board) from time to time fix the remuneration and expenses to be received by pilots absent from their duty for the purpose of giving evidence in any court.

31. If any pilot shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Bye-laws for which breach no pecuniary penalty is hereinbefore provided or shall be guilty of any misconduct in any matter relating to the Pilotage Service for which misconduct no punishment is hereinbefore provided he shall be liable to a penalty

not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

32. The preceding Bye-laws shall commence and take effect from the date of the publication in the London Gazette of the Order of His Majesty in Council confirming the same, as from which date all previous Bye-laws and Regulations relating to Goole pilotage, except the Bye-laws confirmed by Order in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1908, fixing the rates of pilotage from Hull to Goole and *vice versa*, and the Goole Pilots' Superannuation Fund Bye-laws confirmed by Order in Council dated the 22nd day of April, 1910, shall be and are hereby revoked.

"And whereas by the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Naval Service Bandmen entered as Royal Marines are eligible for a Musical Proficiency Allowance of 1d. a day.

"And whereas we consider it desirable that this Allowance shall be extended to certain Band ratings serving in ships on the Mediterranean Station who are not entered as Royal Marines:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the extension of the Allowance to such ratings, provided they are certified to be musically proficient.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Admiralty, dated the 28th day of February, 1911, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 2nd February, 1884, the repayment from public funds of the travelling expenses of children not exceeding 15 years of age of Officers and Men serving in Your Majesty's Coast Guard is granted in certain circumstances and subject to certain conditions:

"And whereas similar provision in respect of the children of certain Naval ratings is made in Article 1484 (clause 8) of the King's Regulations and Admiralty Instructions, but a different definition is adopted in Article 1516 of those Regulations in regard to the children of Naval and Marine Officers:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 19th August, 1889, and the 12th January, 1891, the repayment from public funds of the travelling expenses of children, irrespective of age, of men who die in the Coast Guard service or are invalided therefrom, is granted in certain circumstances and subject to certain conditions:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the term 'children' should be accurately defined so as to ensure uniformity in dealing with all cases of a similar nature:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to direct that, in future, in all cases in which the repayment from public funds of the travelling expenses of children is granted under present Regulations to Officers and Men being or having been in Your Majesty's Naval and Coast Guard Forces, the term 'children' shall include sons under 16 years of age; unmarried daughters dependent on and residing with their fathers; and sons over 16 years of age who, by reason of physical or mental infirmity, are necessarily dependent on their parents.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is enacted that, in case it appear to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the

Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order that the same be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such parish:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the parish of Didsbury, Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf have made a representation that for the protection of public health the Orders of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council of the 11th day of June, 1863, and the 2nd day of March, 1881, relating to burials in the said parish of Didsbury, should be varied so as to provide that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint James, Didsbury, Manchester, and in the Churchyard attached thereto:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 23rd day of January last, to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 28th day of February, 1911, and that the said Order should be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof should be affixed in the manner required by the said first recited Act:

And whereas copies of the said Order have been so affixed accordingly:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the said Orders of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council of the 11th day of June, 1863, and the 2nd day of March, 1881, relating to burials in the parish of Didsbury, Manchester, in the county of Lancaster, be varied so as to provide that burials be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint James, Didsbury, Manchester, and in the churchyard attached thereto.

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (County Borough of Newport) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Close Time Extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited by the Act of 1880, shall be extended, so far as concerns the County Borough of Newport, so as to be between the 1st day of March and the 1st day of September in each year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the County Borough of Newport to the following species of Wild Birds as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Hobby, Kestrel, Kite, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Osprey, Shrikes, Swallow, Swift, Bearded Tit (Reedling or Reed Pheasant), Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

Certain Birds Protected during the Whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the County Borough of Newport:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow, Dunnock), Bittern, Blackbird, Buntings, Buzzard, Honey Buzzard, Chaffinch, Chiff Chaff, Goot, Corn Crake (Landrail), Cuckoo, Falcons, Flycatchers, Goldfinch, Greenfinch, Gulls, Hawfinch, Herons, Hobby, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Kite, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Larks, Linnets, Magpie, Martins, Merlin, Moorhen, Nightingale, Nightjar, Nuthatch, Osprey, Owls, Pipits, Redpoles, Redstart, Robin (or Redbreast), Shrikes, Siskin, Starling, Stonechat, Swallow, Wild Swan, Swift, Thrushes, Tits, Wagtails, Warblers, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat,

Woodpeckers, Wrens, Wryneck (Cuckoo's Mate or Snake Bird).

All Birds Protected on Sundays, Christmas Day and Bank Holidays.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act of 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of Wild Birds on Sundays, Christmas Day, and Bank Holidays is prohibited within the County Borough of Newport.

All Birds Protected in Certain Areas.

VI. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of all Wild Birds is prohibited in and upon those parts of the County Borough of Newport known as Beechwood Park, Belle Vue Park, Shaftesbury Park and the Cemetery, and also in, upon and above those parts of the rivers Usk and Ebbw and the banks thereof, which are included within the boundary of the said County Borough of Newport, which areas are shown in green on a map deposited with the Town Clerk, sealed with the Home Office seal, and dated the 8th March, 1911.

EGGS.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County Borough of Newport.

VII. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the Wild Birds named in Clause IV of this Order is prohibited within the County Borough of Newport.

All Eggs protected in certain Areas.

PROPOSED BYE-LAWS for the Prevention of an Outbreak of Plague amongst Rats at the Docks under the Jurisdiction of the Port of London Authority.

WHEREAS the Port of London Authority have caused the above-mentioned proposed bye-laws to be published in the London Gazette of the 29th day of November, 1910, and as an advertisement in the Times newspaper of the 29th day of November, 1910, and the 8th day of December, 1910, and also within seven days after the publication of the same in the London Gazette caused to be inserted in certain newspapers published and circulating in the various administrative county and county boroughs affected by the said proposed bye-laws a statement drawing attention to the fact of the said publication in the London Gazette.

And whereas the said Port Authority did during upwards of one month after such publication afford to all persons the opportunity of making, in writing or otherwise, objections to or representations respecting such proposed bye-laws.

And whereas no objections or representations have been made to the said Port Authority

with regard to the proposed bye-laws which are as follows:—

PORT OF LONDON AUTHORITY.

Bye-laws for the Prevention of an Outbreak of Plague Amongst Rats at the Docks.

1. All rope and mooring tackle for securing any vessel either to the shore or to mooring buoys shall be fitted with such effective guards as will prevent access of rats from the vessel to the shore. For any breach of this bye-law the master of the vessel shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

2. All possible means shall be adopted for catching and destroying rats during the stay of any vessel in dock. All empty cases and barrels shall be examined before being landed to ensure that no rats are contained therein. Any rats caught on board the vessel shall be killed, then placed in a bucket of strong disinfecting solution, and afterwards burnt in the vessel's furnace. No rats, alive or dead, shall be removed from the vessel. For any breach of this bye-law the master of the vessel shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

3. When the discharge of cargo or the landing or embarking of passengers is not proceeding one gangway only shall be permitted to afford means of communication between any vessel and the shore. The end of the gangway near the vessel shall be whitened for a length of 10 feet. For any breach of this bye-law the master of the vessel shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
