MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulation under Section 8.

COUNTY OF KENT.

Chislehurst and Footscray Urban Districts.

To the County Council of Kent;—
And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is provided that We, the Local Government Board, may, by Regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896, prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway, or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in Our opinion, be especially dangerous;

And whereas the County Council of Kent having applied to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the above-mentioned sections prohibiting the driving of motor cars on a certain highway known and hereinafter referred to as Church Lane, and situate within the urban districts of Chislehurst and Footscray, We directed a local inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and an inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

Now therefore, after consideration of the said Report and of all the circumstances of the case, We, the Local Government Board, in

pursuance of Our powers in that behalf, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—A person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding five miles per hour on so much of Church Lane aforesaid as extends from a point therein situate fifty yards south-east of the entrance gate to the Rectory to its junction with Hurst Lane.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the Twentieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF THE SOKE OF PETERBOROUGH.

Whereas by section 8 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1903"), it is enacted that the Local Government Board may by regulations made under section 6 of the Locomotives on Highways Act, 1896 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1896"), prohibit or restrict the driving of any motor cars, or of any special kind of motor cars, on any specified highway or part of a highway, which does not exceed sixteen feet in width, or on which ordinary motor car traffic would, in their opinion, be especially dangerous:

Notice is hereby given, that the County Council of the Soke of Peterborough have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made under section 6 of the Act of 1896 and section 8 of the Act of 1903, for restricting to five miles per hour the speed at which any motor car may be driven along the following parts of highways within the parish of Wansford, that is to say:—

So much of the road from London to Stamford and York as extends for a distance

of 572 yards from the centre of Wansford Bridge.

So much of the road from Wansford to Fotheringhay as extends for a distance of 160 yards from its junction with the road first above-mentioned;

So much of the road from Wansford to Leicester as extends for a distance of 110 yards from its junction with the road last above-mentioned; and

So much of the road from Wansford to Peterborough as extends for a distance of 170 yards from its junction with the road first above-mentioned.

Notice is hereby further given that objections to the making of any such regulation may be sent in writing to the Local Government Board at their offices in Whitehall, London, S.W., on or before the sixth day of April, 1911.

A copy of any such objection should be sent at the same time by the objector to the County Council of the Soke of Peterborough, Peterborough.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH MARCH 1911.)

KENT (PARASITIC MANGE) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from horses, asses and mules not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as to existence of Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Detention of Animals.

4.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass or mule which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—

(i.) The horse, ass or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

(ii.) No other horse, ass or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

(iii.) No horse, ass or mule shall be allowed to stray out of the stable, shed, field or other premises.

(2.) A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(3.) An Inspector shall with all practicable speed send a copy of any Notice served under this Article to the Local Authority and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:

(i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about any horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange;

(ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected;

(iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding-troughs, pens, hurdles, harness or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee or occupier;

(iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses or mules of litter used for or about any horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.

(2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.

(3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.

(4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (*Police*);

Section forty-four (*General Administrative Provisions*);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Offences.

9.—(1.) If a horse, ass or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of any Notice thereunder, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any horse, ass or mule is allowed to stray in contravention of this Order, or of any Notice thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the premises from which the animal is allowed to stray, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order—

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;

“Inspector” includes Veterinary Inspector;

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

11. This Order extends to the administrative county of Kent; and the county borough of Canterbury.

Revocation.

12. The Order described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby revoked.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT NO. I.

Movement of Animals into, out of, or within Scheduled District No. I.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. I) or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within that District.

PART II.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT NO. II.

Movement out of Scheduled District No. II, and Movement into or within such District.

2.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in

the Second Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. II).

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. II, except with a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under and in accordance with this Article.

(3.) A Movement Licence shall be granted only for the movement of an animal to a slaughter-house situate within Scheduled District No. II.

(4.) A Movement Licence under this Article shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement

- (i.) is necessary or expedient; and
- (ii.) will not involve movement into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. I.

(5.) An animal shall not be moved with a Movement Licence under this Article unless before the movement is commenced, it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.

PART III.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT NO. III.

Movement out of Scheduled District No. III, and Movement into or within such District.

3.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the Third Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. III), except into Scheduled District No. II, and then only in accordance with Part II of this Order.

(2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. III, except with a Movement Licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority under and in accordance with the subsequent provisions of this Order.

(3.) A Movement Licence under this Article

shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement

- (i.) is necessary or expedient; and
- (ii.) will not involve movement into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. I.

Markets, &c., of Animals for Slaughter in Scheduled District No. III.

4.—(1.) No market, fair, sale or exhibition of animals shall be held on any premises situate in Scheduled District No. III unless the market, fair, sale or exhibition is authorised by the Local Authority and the Local Authority are satisfied that the market, fair, sale or exhibition will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market, fair, sale, or exhibition authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

Provisions as to Licences in Scheduled District No. III.

5.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Licence under Part III of this Order is in respect of movement—

- (i.) on a particular occasion, for feeding purposes or otherwise; or
- (ii.) as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in Scheduled District No. III;

the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(2.) The Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(3.) Where animals are moved with a Movement Licence to a market, fair, sale, or exhibition, the animals shall be moved therefrom only if accompanied by a further Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held, and only to a slaughter-house situate in Scheduled Districts No. II or III.

(4.) A copy of a licence granted under this Article for movement from a market, fair, sale, or exhibition shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the slaughterhouse specified in the licence in any case in which the slaughterhouse is situate in another District.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

6. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

- (i.) movement of an animal which is affected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or

which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii.) movement into or out of a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place; or

(iii.) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Districts by Railway.

7. For the purposes of this Order, animals shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Scheduled District in any case where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

Provisions as to farms on borders of Scheduled Districts.

8. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the District, and where the farm extends to two Districts, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner District.

Local Authority for the purpose of granting Licences.

9. Except where it is otherwise expressly stated a Movement Licence under this Order shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

Licences.

10. A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

General Provisions as to Movement.

11. Animals, while being moved under this Order, shall be accompanied by the Licence authorising the movement and shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

12. Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith

after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the said movement.

Granting Movement Licences.

13. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

14. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

15.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

16.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any

animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4.) If a market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals is held in contravention of this Order, the person holding the same, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the purchaser thereof of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the market, fair, sale, or exhibition to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

17. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:

“Slaughter-house” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon-factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

18. The Surrey and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1911 and 1911 (No. 2) are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order, except as regards movement under a licence granted on or before that date.

Commencement.

19. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-third day of March, nineteen hundred and eleven.
