"Whereas at certain extremities of the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Matthew, Southborough, all in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such new parishes.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said new parish of Saint John,

Tunbridge Wells, of the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, of the said new parish of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, and of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Southborough, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Luke, Tunbridge Wells, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Reginald, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop, with the consents of Walter Plimpton, of Number 6, Crescent Road, South Norwood Park, in the county of Surrey, Esquire, of Henry William Hill, of Number 9, Bloomfield Terrace, Pimlico, in the county of London, Esquire, and of Guilbert Edward Wyndham Malet, of Number 52, Penywern Road, Earl's Court, in the said county of London, a Major in Your Majesty's Army, the Patronage Trustees of the Guild of All Souls, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, with the consent of the Reverend David James Stather Hunt, vicar or incumbent of the vicarage of the district parish of Tunbridge Wells, in the said county and diocese, and as such vicar or incumbent the patron of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, with the consents of the said David James Stather Hunt, of the Reverend Charles Gardiner Baskerville, of the Vicarage, Tonbridge, in the said county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, of John Francis William Deacon, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the city of London, Banker, of Francis Augustus Bevan, of Number 54, Lombard Street, in the city of London, Banker, and of William Graham Bradshaw, of Down Park, Crawley, in the county of Sussex, Solicitor, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and with the consents of the said David James Stather Hunt, of the said Charles Gardiner Baskerville, of the said John Francis William Deacon, of William Francis Courthope, of Number 20, Birchin Lane, in the city of London, Banker, and of the Reverend Thomas Graham, of the Vicarage, Southborough, in the said county of Kent, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Southborough (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, of the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, of the said new parish of St. James, Tunbridge Wells, and of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Southborough, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said church of Saint Luke, Tunbridge Wells, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Tunbridge Wells.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to

Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Luke, Tunbridge Wells, comprising:—All those contiguous portions of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, of the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Matthew, Southborough, all in the county of Kent and in the diocese of Rochester, which are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, from the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, at the centre of Grosvenor Bridge, which carries the roadway connecting Quarry Road with Upper Grosvenor Road and Dunstan Road across the Tunbridge Wells and Hastings Branch Line of the South-Eastern and Chatham Railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Grosvenor Road and Dunstan Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Dunstan Road for a distance of eight chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Queens Road and Upper Dunstan Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Upper Dunstan Road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stephen's Road, and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of Stephen's Road for a distance of sixteen chains and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Currie Road, and extending thence first in a straight line due west to the wall forming the eastern boundary of the grounds attached to Skinners' School and then northward along the said boundary wall for a distance in all of five chains and a quarter or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of Somerset Road, and extending thence first northward to and then south-westward along the middle of Somerset Road for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mereworth Road, and extending thence first north-westward and then north-eastward along the middle of Mereworth Road for a distance of twelve chains and a half or thereabouts to the wall or fence at its northern end, and extending thence northward in a straight line for a distance of fourteen yards or thereabouts to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 193 upon the ordnance map of the civil parish of Tunbridge Wells, published in the year one thousand nine hundred and nine, upon the scale of twenty-five inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this representation, and extending thence northward along the said fence for a distance of five chains and a half or thereabouts to its northern end on the southern side of the close numbered 113 upon the said maps, and extending thence in a straight line due north across the said close numbered 113 for a distance of eight chains and a half or thereabouts to the fence forming the northern boundary of such close upon the boundary which divides the said

new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, from the new parish of Saint Peter, Southborough, in the said county and diocese, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary meets the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Southborough, from the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of thirty-one chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such boundary crosses the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the house and premises known as number 143, Silverdale Road, and extending thence eastward along such boundary wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of Saint Luke's School for a distance in all of two chains or thereabouts to a point on the western side of Denbigh Road, and extending thence first eastward in a straight line across Denbigh Road and then first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the pathway running along the backs of the houses on the northern side of Silverdale Road for a distance in all of four chains and a quarter or thereabouts to a point opposite to the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as number 185, Silverdale Road, and situate at the angle formed by Silverdale Road and Dynevor Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of eighteen yards or thereabouts to a point on the south-western side of Dynevor Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of Dynevor Road for a distance of two chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Grosvenor Road upon the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Southborough, from the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following in part the middle of Upper Grosvenor Road) for a distance of nine chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where such boundary reaches the middle of the said Tunbridge Wells and Hastings Branch Line of the South-Eastern and Chatham Railway, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of thirty chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across the road leading past the gasometer which supplies Southborough, and extending thence first eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last described road for a distance of four chains and a half or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Matthew, Southborough, of the said new parish of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, and of the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, all meet, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, from the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells (thereby following in part the middle of the last mentioned road, in part the middle of the road leading past the house called The Poplars, and in part the middle of the road leading from Southborough Station past the

house called Hill Crest into Sandhurst Road) for a distance of fifty chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary diverges from the middle of the said road leading from Southborough Station into Sandhurst Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said road leading from Southborough Station for a distance of four chains and three-quarters or thereabouts to its junction with Sandhurst Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Sandhurst Road for a distance of five chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Sandhurst Park, and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Sandhurst Park for a distance of ten chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint James, Tunbridge Wells, from the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, and extending thence south-eastward along such boundary (thereby following the middle of the footpath leading towards Dorking Road) for a distance of four chains and a quarter or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such footpath across the stream which flows through the Grosvenor Recreation Ground, and extending thence first north-westward and then south-westward along the middle of such stream for a distance of twenty-one chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the Grosvenor Recreation Ground, and extending thence north-westward along such boundary fence for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence meets the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the said Tunbridge Wells and Hastings Branch Line of the South-Eastern and Chatham Railway, and extending thence first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby following the boundary which divides the said new parish of Saint Barnabas, Tunbridge Wells, from the said new parish of Saint John, Tunbridge Wells) for a distance of twenty-two chains and a half or thereabouts to the centre of Grosvenor Bridge which carries the roadway connecting Quarry Road with Upper Grosvenor Road and Dunstan Road over the said line of railway, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "whereas in some instances tithings, ham-

lets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the archbishop of the province, or when the bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such archbishop, or the diocese of such bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said archbishop or bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such bishop to be transmitted to the said archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rentcharges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said archbishop may approve, and the said archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner, Lord Bishop of Gloucester, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I Edgar Charles Sumner by Divine permission Bishop of Gloucester do in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act 1838 hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the county of Gloucester and my diocese of Gloucester the vicarage of Berkeley the parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about 5,000. The net annual value of this benefice arising from tithe rentcharge glebe land and income payable by Queen Anne's Bounty and fees and other sources is £297 or thereabouts.

"2. There is also in the same county and diocese the perpetual curacy of Stone the parish whereof contains an estimated present population of about 240. The net annual value of this benefice arising from glebe land income payable by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners

and Queen Anne's Bounty and fees and other sources is £195 or thereabouts.

"3. A certain district of the said parish of Berkeley known as the Woodford district lies at a distance of about three miles from the parish church of Berkeley but less than half a mile from the parish church of Stone.

"4. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act the Woodford district referred to in the preceding paragraph numbered 3 may advantageously be separated from the said parish of Berkeley and annexed to the said parish of Stone to which it is contiguous.

"5. The benefice of Berkeley is in the patronage of the Right Honourable Charles Paget Fitzhardinge Baron Fitzhardinge. The benefice of Stone is in the patronage of the vicar for the time being of the said parish of Berkeley.

"6. The Reverend Henry Cranford Armour is the present incumbent of the benefice of Berkeley. The Reverend Thomas Veal is the present incumbent of the benefice of Stone.

"7. Pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Pluralities Act I the said Bishop have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this representation describing the district so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the said parish of Stone and the mode in which it appears to me the alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and right to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said patrons and incumbents to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such scheme you may certify the same and such consents by your report to His Majesty in Council.

"Given under my hand this 29th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and ten."

And whereas the said scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the consents of the patrons and incumbents of the said benefices respectively are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That a district shall be separated from the said parish of Berkeley and annexed for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous parish of Stone. The said district is delineated and described in the plan hereunto annexed, and thereon surrounded with a red line and consists of the district known as the Woodford district.

"That the incumbent of the said parish of Stone to which such district shall be annexed shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within the said district.

"That the parishioners of the said district shall be entitled to accommodation in the church of the said parish of Stone but shall cease to be entitled to accommodation in the church of the said parish of Berkeley excepting nevertheless any person or persons possessing a legal right by faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said parish church of Berkeley and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That marriages baptisms churchings and burials shall be solemnized and performed for

the inhabitants of the Woodford district in the said parish church of Stone.

"That all fees dues ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said district shall belong to the incumbent of the said parish of Stone to which such district shall be annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made in the patronage or endowment (except as aforesaid) of the said benefices or either of them.

"CONSENTS.

"We the Right Honourable Charles Paget Fitzhardinge Baron Fitzhardinge being the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice of Berkeley in the county and diocese of Gloucester in case the same were now vacant the Reverend Henry Cranford Armour being the incumbent of the same benefice the said Henry Cranford Armour being the patron or person entitled to present (as vicar for the time being of the said parish of Berkeley) to the benefice of Stone in the county and diocese of Gloucester in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Thomas Veal the incumbent of the said benefice do hereby respectively signify to your Grace our several consents to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

"In testimony whereof we have hereunto set our hands this 29th day of July, one thousand nine hundred and ten.

And whereas the said scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration.

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said scheme, hath certified the same and the consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his report dated the 1st day of November, 1910, which said report is in the words and figures following:—

"We the undersigned Randall Thomas Archbishop of the province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council

"That the Right Reverend Edgar Charles Sumner Lord Bishop of Gloucester has represented unto us amongst other things

"That there is in the county of Gloucester and his diocese of Gloucester the vicarage of Berkeley with a population of 5,000 or thereabouts.

"That there is also in the same county and diocese the perpetual curacy of Stone with a population of 240 or thereabouts.

"That a certain district of the said parish of Berkeley known as the Woodford district lies at a distance of about three miles from the parish church of Berkeley but less than half a mile from the parish church of Stone.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act 1838 the said Woodford district (more particularly described in the scheme annexed hereto and verged with a red line on the plan attached to such scheme) may be advantageously separated from the said parish of Berkeley and annexed to the said parish of Stone to which it is contiguous.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th section of the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected and how the changes consequent on

such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, which scheme, together with the consents thereto in writing of the Right Honourable Charles Paget Fitzhardinge Baron Fitzhardinge the patron or person entitled to present to the said benefice of Berkeley in case the same were now vacant the Reverend Henry Cranford Armour, the incumbent of the same benefice, the said Henry Cranford Armour, the patron or person entitled to present (as vicar for the time being of the said parish of Berkeley) to the said benefice of Stone in case the same were now vacant and the Reverend Thomas Veal the incumbent of the same benefice, has been transmitted to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents above referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and enquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act 1838 certify the same and such consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

(Petition for Additional Provision to Authorize the Construction of an Additional Tramway to those Proposed to be Authorized by the Halifax Corporation Bill now pending in Parliament.)

1. To enable the Corporation to construct, lay down, and maintain, wholly in the West Riding of the county of York, the tramway hereinafter described and hereinafter referred to as "the proposed tramway," that is to say:—

Tramway No. 36, a single line 5.9 chains in length, wholly situate in the county borough of Halifax, commencing by a junction with the existing tramway in Northgate at a point 15 yards north of the north side of North Bridge-street, passing thence along Northgate and Park-street, and terminating in Park-street at the boundary wall of North Bridge Goods Station, at a point 97 yards east of the east side of Northgate.

At the following place it is intended to lay the proposed tramway so that a less space than 9 feet 6 inches will intervene between the outside of the footpath and the nearest rail, namely:—

In Park-street, on the north side thereof, between points 27 yards and 86 yards respectively east of the east side of Northgate, and on the south side thereof, between points

17 yards and 90 yards respectively east of the east side of Northgate.

2. The tramway is to be constructed on a gauge of 3 feet 6 inches. It is not intended to run thereon carriages or trucks adapted for use on railways. The motive power will be electrical power.

3. The provisions of the Bill, or some of them, will or may be made applicable to the proposed tramway as if such tramway had been included and described in the Bill and in the notices of the intended application for the Bill published in November last, and shown upon the deposited plans and sections.

4. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges inconsistent with or which would in any way interfere with the purposes of the Bill or of the Additional Provision, and to confer other rights and privileges.
