#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of March, 1911, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 7th March, 1898, it is provided that a certain water area at Gibraltar shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and that powers should be conferred upon them to make Regulations for the proper control of the same: "And whereas it is desirable that an altera-

"And whereas it is desirable that an alteration should be made in the limits of such water area:

area:
"We beg most humbly to recommend that
Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to
revoke the said Order in Council and to sanction the following proposals:—

"1. All the water area lying between the Admiralty Harbour Works, the North Mole, and the shore, together with the water area extending from the outer edge of low water for a width of 200 yards outside the same from Rosia Mole on the South to the South end of the West Arm of the North Mole—including

the Northern Entrance—and for a width of 50 yards outside the faced wall of the North Mole, the boundaries being delineated on the Chart attached to the Order in Council, shall be deemed to be Admiralty Waters.

2. Control over the said Admiralty Waters shall be vested in the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar or in such person as may by direction of the said Lords Commissioners be performing

the duties of King's Harbour Master.

"3. It shall be lawful for the Senior Naval Officer, or for the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, from time to time to make, and, when made, to alter or revoke, such Regulations, in writing, as he may deem expedient, in respect of the use, order and government of the Admiralty Waters, and of all ships and boats therein, including regulations for the exclusion or admission of merchant and other private vessels from and to the Admiralty Waters at Gibraltar, or any part of

- "4. All such regulations shall be confirmed by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and shall be published in the London Gazette and the Gibraltar Official Gazette, and shall be in force as from the last of the two dates at which they are so published. The production of a copy of either Gazette containing such regulations shall be good and sufficient proof for all purposes of the contents thereof, and that the same have been duly made and confirmed in accordance with the terms of this
- "5. The masters of all merchant and other private vessels admitted to the Admiralty Waters shall be subject to the directions of the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar, or of the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, in all matters connected with anchoring, mooring, securing or shifting berth
- in those waters.
  "6. If the master of any vessel within Admiralty Waters does not moor, anchor, place, secure, move, unmoor or remove the same according to directions given by the Senior Naval Officer at Gibraltar, or by the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, in conformity with any Regulations made under this Order, or if there is no person on board of any such vessel to attend to such directions, the Senior Naval Officer, or person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, may cause the vessel to be moored, anchored, placed, secured, moved, unmoored or removed, and for that purpose may cast off, loose, or unshackle, and (if need be) sever any chain or rope of the vessel, first putting on board a sufficient number of persons for the protection of the vessel in case there is not a sufficient number of persons on board to protect the same, and all ex-penses attending the exercise of these powers shall be paid by the owner or person in charge of the vessel.
  "7. All merchant and other private vessels
- permitted to use the Admiralty Waters shall be subject to the payment of all such general Harbour or Light dues as may from time to time be levied by the Colonial Government of Gibraltar, as if they were anchored, moored, or placed in the Mercantile Port of Gibraltar.
- "8. The Senior Naval Officer, or the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, may call upon the owner, or person in charge of any wreck, or other thing of any kind whatsoever, being an obstruction in the Admiralty Waters, or in or to the approaches

thereto, to remove or destroy such wreck or thing, and the owner or person in charge shall forthwith remove or destroy such wreck or thing, and every fragment of such wreck or thing, which may arise in course of removal or destruction to the satisfaction of the Senior Naval Officer, or of the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master.

"9. No explosive shall be used for the purpose of destroying any such wreck or thing without the concurrence of the Senior Naval Officer, or the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, and in such manner

as he may direct.
"10. If the owner or person in charge fails or neglects to remove or destroy such wreck or thing within a reasonable time, to be determined by the Senior Naval Officer or the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master; or if, in the opinion of the Senior Naval Officer, or the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, the removal of such wreck or thing is a matter of urgency, the Senior Naval Officer, or person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, may give notice to the owner or person in charge, or to his accredited agent at Gibraltar, that on the expiration of a period to be fixed by and stated in such notice the said Senior Naval Officer, or the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, will remove or destroy such wreck or thing, and on the expiration of such period may proceed to do so.

"11. Should any difficulty arise in effecting service of such notice on the owner, or person in charge, or on his accredited agent, such notice may be published in the Gibraltar Official Gazette, and such publication shall be

- deemed good and valid service thereof.
  "12. The expenses incurred by the Senior Naval Officer, or by the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master, in the removal or destruction of such wreck or thing, and in the temporary lighting, buoying, or marking thereof, shall be repaid by the owner or person in charge thereof, and the Senior Naval Officer or the person performing the duties of King's Harbour Master may detain, and, in case of non-payment of expenses on demand, may sell the wreck or thing, and out of the proceeds of the sale pay those expenses, and the expenses of the sale, rendering the surplus (if any) to the owner or person entitled thereto on demand, and any deficiency may be recovered as a Civil debt from the owner or person in charge. Provided always that no such sale shall (except in the case of property of a perishable nature) be made until at least seven clear days' notice of the intended sale has been given by advertisement in the Gibraltar Official Gazette.
- "13. For the purposes of this Order, the owner of a wreck or thing shall be deemed to be the person owning such wreck or thing when such wreck or thing becomes an obstruction, notwithstanding any subsequent sale, transfer, or abandonment.
- "14. Any person contravening any rule or regulation contained in or for the time being in force under this Order shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £20.
- "15. All fines, expenses and sums of money imposed or made recoverable by this Order or by any Regulation under it shall be recoverable in a summary manner subject to the conditions contained in the Justices Ordinance, Gibraltar, 1890, which said Ordinance shall be

deemed and taken to be incorporated with this

Order for the purposes thereof.

"16. All fines recovered under this Order shall be paid into the Colonial Treasury, for the use of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors.

"Your Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies has signified his concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Despatch relating to Field Operations.

My Lord,

I have the honour to transmit a report by the Officer Commanding the Southern Nigeria Regiment on the Ogwashi-Oku Patrol.

2. The fact that one Officer and 11 rank and file were killed while 23 rank and file were wounded indicates the arduous nature of these operations, and I trust that the strenuous and efficient work performed by the troops engaged will meet with deserved recognition. I may add that every effort was made to bring the disaffected natives under control by pacific measures, and that actual hostilities were engaged in only as a last resource.

3. Such efforts should also, I venture to think, be duly recognised in estimating the real success of operations from a military and political point of view. I hope, and in this hope Sir Walter Egerton joins, that the Africa General Service Medal will be awarded for the operations on account of the admirable manner

in which they were carried out.

4. I endorse Lieutenant-Colonel Trenchard's commendation of the excellent services ren-dered by Major Bruce and Captain G. N. Sheffield. The efficient and tactful conduct of affairs by Mr. Norton-Harper as Political Officer in Ogwashi-Oku was an important factor in the successful issue of the patrol, and I mention his name as deserving special commendation for the good service he has rendered.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to submit the following despatch on the Ogwashi-Oku Patrol.

The Ogwashi-Oku Patrol, Nov. 1909-May 1910.

This Patrol [\*] was rendered necessary by the people of Ogwashi-Oku refusing to comply with Government orders, blocking the roads through their town, and destroying the Government Rest House. It was under the command of Captain Sheffield, 3rd Battalion Essex Regiment, and was composed of 3 Officers, 1 B.N.C.O., 1 Medical Officer, 131 rank and file, and I Maxim. Onitsha was left on the 2nd November and Ogwashi-Oku reached on the 8th November. It was found necessary soon after the patrol started to increase this force by 1 Officer and 60 men, owing to the density of the bush and the strong opposition encountered. The column was in the field from the 2nd November, 1909, to December 18th, 1909. Strong opposition was met with in the town of Ogwashi-Oku, the casualties amounting to:

> 7 N.C.O.'s and men killed. 15 soldiers wounded.

And amongst the carriers to:

3 killed, 7 wounded.

On December 18th the troops were withdrawn to Onitsha (20 miles), and the people informed that they would be given three weeks to come in and submit. But early in January, 1910, they again defied the Government by destroying the Roman Catholic Mission buildings in the town; the column under Captain Sheffield was, therefore, ordered to return to Ogwashi-Oku on the 6th of January. A night march was made to the former camp in order to lessen the risk of casualties, opposition being met with at the entrance to the camp, and one soldier severely wounded; further casualties were prevented by the darkness of the night. Fighting continued for several days in the vicinity of the camp until a considerable clearing of the bush had been made all round, so as to prevent the bushmen from continually sniping day and night, which they had been doing with some success. Sub-columns were sent out to try and capture the ringleaders

Nzekwe and his followers, but on their approach they immediately scattered and kept up a guerilla warfare.

The second phase lasted from the 6th January to the 24th April. The casualties during this period amounted to:

1 soldier killed, 4 soldiers wounded, 1 carrier wounded.

On the 25th of April reinforcements [strength 5 Officers, 160 rank and file, 2 Maxims] were sent to join the column, and Major Bruce proceeded from Lagos to take over command.

On the 4th of May an attempt was made to capture the ringleader Nzekwe at Aniogu, where he was reported to be living, but owing to the darkness of the night, the trees that had been felled across the paths, and the numerous spikes as well, it was decided to give up the attempt and return to camp. The following night the column took another road, and successfully surprised the bush camp, but failed to capture Nzekwe; one soldier was severely wounded. On the 6th of May Major Wayling surprised another bush camp, and had one wounded. Sub-columns were out soldier during the next few days getting information and searching surrounding country. On the 15th the column under Major Bruce reached Abedi, after a trying march in torrents of rain on the 14th. Strong opposition was met with, the roads leading into the town being stockaded and a heavy fire opened by the bushmen. Captain H. G. Chapman, Suffolk Regiment, and 3 soldiers were killed and 2 soldiers wounded (one since dead). The bush round the town was exceptionally thick, which made advance most difficult, and but for the inaccurate shooting of the bushmen the casualties would have been far heavier than they were. more bush camps were located on the following days, and the enemy, continually harassed and kept on the move, decided to give up the war, and on the 27th of May Nzekwe and 200 armed bushmen gave themselves up to Major Bruce at Ogwashi-Öku.

The total casualties up to date amount to:

1 Officer and 11 rank and file killed. 23 rank and file wounded.

I would recommend to your Excellency's notice the excellent work performed by the following Officers:—

Major Bruce, Norfolk Regiment, commanded the Ogwashi-Oku patrol during the third phase, and, owing to the excellent plans made and the very hard work carried out during the rainy season, brought the operations at last to a successful conclusion.

Captain G. N. Sheffield, 3rd Battalion, Essex Regiment, for five months commanded the Ogwashi-Oku patrol, and inflicted heavy defeats on the enemy.

# SHORES OR BANKS OF FISHGUARD BAY AT GOODWICK.

#### REMOVAL OF MATERIALS PROHIBITED.

Whereas the Board of Trade, acting in pursuance of the Harbours Act, 1814, as amended by the Harbours Transfer Act, 1862, find it necessary for the protection of the Port of Cardigan to prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of Fishguard Bay between a point 85 yards south of Goodwick Bridge and the southern embankment of Fishguard Harbour, situate about 350 yards north of Goodwick Bridge, at Goodwick, being within the said Port.

Now the Board of Trade do hereby by this Order prohibit the taking or removing of any shingle or ballast from the shores or banks of

Fishguard Bay between the points above mentioned.

The Trade Board, in proposing to fix the above, take note that the employers' representatives, in agreeing thereto, did not bind themselves to accept the 3½d. per hour, and reserved their right to reconsider the same before the rate is fixed.

Any worker who by permission of an employer attends to start work either for the morning or afternoon shall be considered as engaged for at least two hours in either case, and be paid accordingly at the above rate for such two hours in the event of her not being found sufficient work to earn the equivalent of two hours' pay at the minimum rate.

The above rate is to apply to all female workers (including all female learners as defined by the Trade Board, except only when such female learners are working by time) who are wholly, mainly, or substantially employed in the making of boxes or parts thereof as aforesaid or in any branch or process thereof, but shall not apply to any female workers who are merely employed in work incidental or ancillary thereto.

The above Trade Board have also given similar notice that they propose to fix the following minimum rates for female learners (as defined by them) who are working by time:—

BOLTON UNION.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Bolton Union;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by a General Order dated the 14th day of December, 1852, addressed to the Guardians of the Poor of certain Unions and Parishes, including the Bolton Union, the Poor Law Board prescribed Regulations with regard to the administration of outdoor relief to poor persons in the said Union;

And whereas it is expedient that further provision should be made temporarily with regard to the administration of relief to certain classes of poor persons in the said Union:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the Bolton Union may, after not less than seven days' notice of the proposal has been sent by their Clerk to each Guardian, pass a Resolution (hereinafter referred to as "the Resolution") to the effect that the powers conferred by this Order shall be exercised by them, and a copy of the Resolution shall be forwarded to Us by the Clerk within one week after the passing of the Resolution.

ARTICLE II.—(1.) The Guardians may, from and after the passing of the Resolution, and during the operation of this Order, relieve out of the workhouse the wife and family of any able-bodied male person who is relieved in the workhouse.

(2.) An able-bodied male person who is relieved in the workhouse, while his wife and family are relieved by the Guardians out of the workhouse, shall not be absent from the workhouse more than once in any one week, nor for

a period exceeding twelve hours, nor without the consent of the Guardians.

(3.) Any such able-bodied male person who is absent from the workhouse without any contravention of sub-division (2) of this Article may be relieved by the Guardians during his absence from the workhouse, without being set to work during the time or any part of the time of his absence.

ARTICLE III.—This Order shall operate and have effect until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

DORSETSHIRE (CONTROL OF DOGS)
ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Power to make Regulations.

- 1.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District specified in the Schedule to this Order may, in accordance with the provisions of this Order, make Regulations, with a view to the prevention of worrying of cattle (including sheep), for requiring that dogs or any class of dogs shall, during all or any of the hours between sunset and sunrise, be kept by the owners thereof under control in manner prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2.) The Regulations may apply to the whole or any part of the District, and may exempt any class of dogs either generally or under prescribed conditions.

#### Confirmation of Regulations.

- 2.—(1.) Regulations made under this Order shall not take effect unless and until they have been submitted to and confirmed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Unless the Board otherwise direct, the following provisions shall apply—
  - (i.) Notice of intention to apply for confirmation of any Regulations shall be given in one or more of the local newspapers circulating within the District in two successive issues two weeks at least before the making of the application.

- (ii.) For two weeks at least before an application, a copy of the Regulations proposed to be confirmed shall be kept at the office of the Local Authority of the District, and be open during office hours thereat to the inspection of ratepayers of the District without fee or reward.
- (iii.) The Clerk of the Local Authority shall on the application of any such ratepayer furnish him with a copy of the proposed Regulations on payment of sixpence.
- (3.) A copy of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, signed and certified by the Clerk of that Local Authority to be a true copy and to have been duly confirmed, shall be evidence, until the contrary is proved, in all legal proceedings, of the due making, confirmation, and existence of the Regulations without further or other proof.

# Seizure of Dogs where Regulations are Contravened.

3. Any dog in respect of which an offence is being committed against a Regulation made under this Order may be seized and treated as a stray dog under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

# Extension of Definition in Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

4. Dogs shall be animals for the purposes of the following sections of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (Police);

Section forty-four (General administrative provisions);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

5. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Dorsetshire (Control of Dogs) Order of 1911.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 6TH APRIL 1911.)

WILTSHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1911.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling

them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.

1. The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order) shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained. Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.

# Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets.

- 2.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.
- (2.) In the case of swine moved into the market, fairground or saleyard from premises outside the Scheduled Area with a licence (Form A) the provisions of Article 4 of the principal Order shall apply to the subsequent movement of the swine.
- (3.) If the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or under the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of the swine exposed at the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of the Order under which the market or saleyard is so authorised.
- (4.) In the case of any other movement of swine from a market, fairground or saleyard the movement shall be subject to the following conditions:—
  - (i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate.
  - (ii.) If the place of destination is outside the Scheduled Area it must be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse.
  - (iii.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained.
  - (iv.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
  - (v.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

Regulation of Markets, &c., in Scheduled Area.

3. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant).

Effect of Licences granted under this Order.

4. No licence shall be required under the principal Order for the movement into a Scheduled Area of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Order.

Saving of certain existing Local Order.

5. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of the existing local Order declaring certain parts of the Scheduled Area to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the principal Order.

#### Revocation.

6. The Order of the Board dated the ninth day of May, nineteen hundred and eight, relating to the Scheduled Area, is hereby revoked.

#### Commencement.

7. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of April, nineteen hundred and eleven.

#### Short Title.

8. This Order may be cited as the WILT-SHIRE (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1911, and shall in relation to the Scheduled Area be read as part of the principal Order.
