tion of the boundary of the rural district of the Isle of Thanet and the sea, thence in a southerly direction following the said boundary and the River Stour to its mouth; on the east and south by the coast line from the mouth of the said River Stour to the point of junction of the western boundary of the borough of Hythe and the sea; on the west by the boundaries respectively of the borough of Hythe and the urban district of Cheriton to the point of junction of the said urban district of Cheriton and the borough of Folkestone, thence approximately due north to the point of junction of the rural districts of Elham Bridge and Dover, thence westward by the southern boundary of the rural district of Bridge to its junction with Stone-street (Roman-road), thence following the Roman-road to the point of junction with the western boundary of the county borough of Canterbury and continuing round the said boundary to the point of junction of the parishes of St. Dunstan Within and Canterbury, and thence approximately due north to the said point on the coast line north of the said Swalecliffe Coastguard Station (hereinafter called "the Company's area").

2. To make such transfer or vesting or to provide that any such transfer or vesting may be made upon and subject to such terms and conditions as may have been or may be agreed upon between the Kent Company on the one hand and the Company on the other hand or as may be prescribed or authorized or provided for by the intended Act, and that such transfer or vesting shall be freed and discharged from all or any of the debts, liabilities, charges or incumbrances created by or affecting the Kent Company or their undertaking, and to provide for the cessation and determination of any powers, rights, privileges, duties and obligations of the Kent Company in or over the Company's area.

3. To enable the Company to exercise in their own name and under their own seal and in the names and under the hands of their directors, officers and servants all or any of the powers by the said Acts of 1902 and 1906 conferred upon the Kent Company so far as they relate to the Company's area as fully and effectually as if they had been by the said Acts expressly conferred upon the Company, and to alter and amend the said Acts, and if thought fit to exempt the Company from all or some of the obligations imposed by the said Acts or to provide that some or all of the provisions of the said Acts shall not apply or shall apply in a modified form to the Company, and to extend the period within which under the said Acts the Company would or might be required to exercise any of the powers thereby conferred.

4. To make provision for extending the Company's area from time to time subject to such consents and on such conditions (if any) as may be prescribed or authorized by the intended Act so as to include such other part or parts of the Kent Company's area of supply as may be agreed between the Company and the Kent Company, and to authorize the Company and the Kent Company to enter into and carry into effect agreements with respect to such extension, and to extend and make applicable to such extended area all or some of the provisions of the intended Act.

5. To authorize the Company to acquire by agreement and (if and so far as may be necessary) enable the owners and other persons in-

terested to sell and convey the lands in the county of Kent hereinafter described, and to authorize the Company to hold and use and in and upon the same or some part or parts thereof, to construct, erect, lay down, maintain, work and use stations for producing, generating, using, transforming, transmitting, conveying and distributing electrical energy or power and any material product, matter or thing arising or used in the process of such generation or transformation, with all necessary dynamos, batteries, accumulators, storage motors, generators, engines, plant, machinery, works, buildings, appliances, apparatus and conveniences in connection therewith.
