NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We hereby revoke the said Order dated the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and in substitution for the Regulations contained in that Order We hereby make

the following Regulations:—
ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising that portion of the main road from London to Brighton which passes through the village of Handcross and lies between the milestone indicating thirty-three miles from London and a point in the said main road on the south side of the village opposite to the premises now known as Haylor's Laundry.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.
