**MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.**

**Altering Regulations under Section 9 (1).**

**COUNTY OF EAST SUSSEX.**

To the County Council of East Sussex;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regula-

tions made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas by sub-section (3) of the said section, We are empowered to revoke or alter any regulation made by Us under the said section;

And whereas by an Order dated the 29th day of November, 1907, We made, on the application of the County Council of East Sussex, Regulations under sub-section 1 of the said section with respect to the driving of a motor car on that portion of the main road from London to Brighton which passes through the village of Handcross and lies between the milestones indicating thirty-three and thirty-four miles from London;

And whereas We have received and duly considered an application from the County Council of East Sussex for the removal of the restriction imposing a speed limit on motor cars on so much of the said main road as extends from a point opposite Haylor's Laundry to the milestone indicating thirty-four miles from London:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We hereby revoke the said Order dated the twenty-ninth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and seven, and in substitution for the Regulations contained in that Order We hereby make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising that portion of the main road from London to Brighton which passes through the village of Handcross and lies between the milestone indicating thirty-three miles from London and a point in the said main road on the south side of the village opposite to the premises now known as Haylor's Laundry.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

#### MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).

COUNTY OF LONDON.

Metropolitan Borough of Hampstead.

To the London County Council;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in Regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the

area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;

And whereas the London County Council having made application to Us to make a Regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the Metropolitan Borough of Hampstead, We directed a Local Inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the Inquiry was held accordingly, and Report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following Regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the Metropolitan Borough of Hampstead which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the twenty-fourth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

#### SCHEDULE.

Holly Hill (otherwise known as Holly Bush Hill); and so much of the Grove as extends from its junction with Holly Hill to its junction with the cross road lying immediately to the south of the Hampstead Water Works Reservoir; and

So much of Heath Street as extends from its junction with Holly Hill to its junction with Church Row.
