THE MOTOR CARS (USE AND CON-STRUCTION) (SCOTLAND) ORDER, 1911.

DATED MARCH 25, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers given to me by the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, and by any other statutes in that behalf, I, the undersigned, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Regulations applicable to Scotland, with respect to the use of motor cars on highways and the conditions under which they may be used, viz.:—

- 1. Condition number (1) set forth in Article II. of the Motor Cars (Use and Construction) (Scotland) Order, 1904, shall cease to have effect and for the said condition there shall be substituted the following condition, viz.:—
- (1) The motor car, if it exceeds in weight unladen seven hundredweight, shall be capable of being so worked that it may travel either forwards or backwards.
- 2. Where in any Order under the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, applicable to Scotland, the Motor Cars (Use and Construction) (Scotland) Order, 1904, is referred to, such reference shall be deemed to mean and include a reference to the said Order as amended by this Order.
- 3. This Order may be cited as "The Motor Cars (Use and Construction) (Scotland) Order, 1911."

THE HEAVY MOTOR CAR (SCOTLAND) ORDER, 1911.

DATED MARCH 25, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers given to me by the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, and by any other statutes in that behalf, I, the undersigned, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, do hereby make the following Regulations, applicable to Scotland; that is to say:—

MILITARY MOTOR CARS.

- 1. Article XVII of the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905, shall cease to have effect, and for the said Article there shall be substituted the following Article; that is to say:—
- "Article XVII.—The Regulations, in relation to any heavy motor car which belongs to His Majesty the King, and is used for the time being, under the care, superintendence, or control of a Secretary of State, for military purposes, shall apply and have effect:—
- "(a) As if, in Article III of this Order, six tons' were substituted for five tons,' and 'eight tons' were substituted for 'six and a half tons'; and
 "(b) as if to Article VI of this Order
- "(b) as if to Article VI of this Order there were added the following sub-division; that is to say,—
- "4. Nothing in sub-division (1) of this Article shall have effect so as to prevent the use of tires constructed, shot or fitted with diagonal crossbars or to regulate or determine the width of the spaces between such crossbars, and if the tires of any pair of wheels of a heavy motor car are so constructed, shod or fitted, the conditions of sub-division (2) of this Article shall, for the purpose of determining the width of each of those tires, apply subject to the substitution throughout those conditions of five hundred-

weights for seven and a half hundredweights as the unit of registered axle-weight."

- 2. Where in any Order under the Motor Car Acts, 1896 and 1903, applicable to Scotland, the Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1905, is referred to, such reference shall be deemed to mean and include a reference to the said Order as amended by this Order.
- 3. This Order may be cited as "The Heavy Motor Car (Scotland) Order, 1911."

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 27TH APRIL 1911.)

East Sussex (Parasitic Mange) Order of

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Definition of Parasitic Mange.

1. The expression "parasitic mange" in this Order means sarcoptic mange or psoroptic mange.

Separation of Diseased and Suspected Animals and Notice of Disease.

2.—(1.) Every person having in his possession or under his charge a horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange shall (a) as far as practicable keep that animal separate from horses, asses and mules not so affected or suspected; and (b) with all practicable speed give notice of the fact of the horse, ass or mule being so affected or suspected to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the horse, ass or mule so affected or suspected is.

(2.) The constable receiving such notice shall forthwith give information of the receipt by him of the notice to an Inspector of the Local

Authority, who shall forthwith report the same to the Local Authority.

Veterinary Inquiry by Local Authority as toexistence of Parasitic Mange.

3.—(1.) The Local Authority on receiving information of the existence, or supposed existence, of parasitic mange shall forthwith cause inquiry to be instituted as to the correctness of such information with the assistance and advice of a Veterinary Inspector, or of a veterinary practitioner qualified according to the Act of 1894 to be a Veterinary Inspector.

(2.) The owner and occupier of any premises on which there is a horse, ass or mule affected with, or suspected of, parasitic mange, shall give all reasonable facilities for the inquiry by the Local Authority under this Article, and any person failing to give such facilities shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Detention of Animals.

4.—(1.) A Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority may serve a Notice (in the Form A set forth in the Schedule to this Order, or to the like effect) on the occupier of any stable, shed, field or other premises in which there is a horse, ass or mule which in his opinion is affected with parasitic mange, and thereupon the following restrictions shall take effect:—

(i.) The horse, ass or mule so affected shall not be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises specified in the Notice, except with the written authority, and under the supervision, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and only to some other place of detention; and during the detention it shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, be treated by the owner thereof with some dressing or other remedy for

parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;

- (ii.) No other horse, ass or mule shall be moved out of the stable, shed, field or other premises unless on each occasion immediately before the movement it is treated with some dressing or other remedy for parasitic mange approved for that purpose by a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority;
- (iii.) No horse, ass or mule shall be allowed to stray out of the stable, shed, field or other premises.
- (2). A Notice under this Order shall remain in force until it is withdrawn by a Notice in writing served on the occupier of the premises by an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (3) An Inspector shall with all practicable speed send a copy of any Notice served under this Article to the Local Authority and to the police officer in charge of the nearest police station of the District.

Regulations of Local Authority as to Cleansing and Disinfection.

- 5.—(1.) The Local Authority may, for the purpose of preventing the spreading of parasitic mange, make Regulations for the following purposes, or any of them:
 - (i.) For providing for the cleansing and disinfection of any place used by, and of utensils, mangers, feeding troughs, pens, hurdles, harness, or other things used for or about, any horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange;
 - (ii.) For prescribing the mode in which such cleansing and disinfection are to be effected;
 - (iii.) For requiring the owner, lessee or occupier of any such place to cleanse and disinfect any such place, utensils, mangers, feeding troughs, pens, hurdles, harness or other things, at the expense of the Local Authority, or at the expense of such owner, lessee or occupier;
 - (iv.) For requiring the removal by the owner from contact with horses, asses or mules of litter used for or about any horse, ass or mule affected with or suspected of parasitic mange.
- (2.) The mode of disinfection shall be one of those prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (3.) If any person fail to cleanse and disinfect any place or any utensil, manger, feedingtrough, pen, hurdle, harness, or other thing, or to remove any litter, in accordance with any such Regulation, it shall be lawful for the Local Authority, without prejudice to the recovery of any penalty for the infringement of such Regulation, to cause such place or such utensil, manger, feeding-trough, pen, hurdle, harness or other thing to be cleansed and disinfected, or to remove such litter, and to recover summarily the expenses thereby incurred from such person.
- (4.) Where the power conferred by the preceding provisions of this Article is exercised by the Local Authority, the owner, lessee or occupier of the place to be cleansed and disinfected shall give all reasonable facilities for that purpose.

Provisions as to Regulations of Local Authority.

6.—(1.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Order.

(2.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by the Local Authority under this Order, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

7. Horses, asses and mules shall be animals, and parasitic mange of horses, asses and mules (in this Order called parasitic mange) shall be a disease for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):

Section forty-three (Police);

· Section forty-four (General Administrative Provisions);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences and legal proceedings.

Exemption of Army Veterinary Service and Veterinary Colleges.

8. Nothing in this Order applies to any horse, ass or mule kept in stables of military barracks or camps under the care and supervision of the Army Veterinary Service, or in stables of any Veterinary College affiliated to the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons.

Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a horse, ass or mule is moved in contravention of this Order, or of any Notice thereunder, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If any horse, ass or mule is allowed to stray in contravention of this Order, or of any Notice thereunder, the owner of the animal, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the premises from which the animal is allowed to stray, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is omitted to be done as regards cleansing or disinfection in contravention of this Order, or of any Regulation made thereunder, the owner and the lessee and the occupier and the person in charge of any place or thing in or in respect of which the same is omitted, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any owner, occupier, or person in charge of premises requiring to be cleansed and disinfected fails to give the facilities to a Local Authority required under this Order, he shall

be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order-

- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;
- "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector;
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Extent.

11. This Order extends to the administrative county of East Sussex; and the county boroughs of Brighton, Eastbourne, and Hastings.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of May, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the East Sussex (Parasitic Mange) Order of 1911.
