PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860 and 1898, namely, the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty-two, and the Act of the sixty-first and sixty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter twenty-three, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, in the year one thousand nine hundred and ten, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Acts, 1860 and 1898, namely, the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter one hundred and forty two, and the Act of the sixty-first and sixty-second years of Her said late Majesty, chapter twenty-three, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for effecting an union of two contiguous benefices within the metropolis and within the diocese of London, namely, the benefice (being a rectory) of Christ.

Church, Spitalfields, and the benefice (being a vicarage) of Saint Mary, Spital Square, or Spitalfields (hereinafter called Saint Mary, Spitalfields), and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union.

"Whereas the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley Bishop of the said diocese of London has caused proposals for a scheme for effecting an union of the said two benefices to be laid before us, which proposals were prepared under the seventh and eighth sections of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act and were approved by the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and were assented to by him as the patron of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, and by the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, that is to say, by the Worshipful Philip Vernon Smith, Chancellor of the diocese of Manchester, Sir William Mackworth Young, of Oak Lea, Silverhill, Saint Leonards-on-Sea, in the county of Sussex, Knight Commander of the Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, the Reverend Edward Alexander Stuart, Canon Residentiary of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ at Canterbury, the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, rector of the parish of the Holy Trinity, Saint Marylebone, in the county of Middlesex, and the Reverend Frank Theodore Woods, vicar of the parish of Saint Andrew, Bishop Auckland, in the

county of Durham, which said five persons are commonly called Hyndman's Trustees, and the same proposals were also assented to by the patrons of the benefice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, situate with the metropolis, and in the said diocese of London, that is to say, by the Reverend Ernest Newton Sharpe, rector of the parish of Saint Paul, Kersal Moor, in the county of Lancaster, the Reverend Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, vicar of the parish of the Holy Trinity, Cambridge, Francis Augustus Bevan of number 54, Lombard Street, in the said city of London, banker, John Francis William Deacon of number 20, Birchin Lane, in the said city of London, banker, and the said Edward Grose Hodge, which said last-named persons are commonly called the church patronage trustees, and the same proposals were also assented to by the vestry of the parish of Christ Church, Spital-fields, by the vestry of the new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and by the vestry of the new parish of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields.

"And whereas the said proposals comprised amongst other things the severance of a portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, from the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and its union with the said bene-

fice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields.

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two benefices of Christ Church, Spitalfields, and Saint Mary, Spitalfields, should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto and to the other matters hereinafter referred to should be made as are hereinafter mentioned.

"And whereas each of the said benefices of Christ Church, Spitalfields, of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, is now full, the Reverend Charles Henry Chard, clerk in Holy Orders, being the present incumbent of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, the Reverend George Rigg, clerk in Holy Orders, being the present incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and the Reverend William John Parker, clerk in Holy Orders, being the present incumbent of the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields.

"And whereas the said Arthur Foley, now Bishop of London, as such Bishop, and the patrons of the said three benefices, and the vestries of the said parishes respectively, are willing that the scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals and this present scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly but otherwise is based upon the said proposals.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as diocesan, and as patron of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields (in testimony whereof he has to this scheme set his hand and his episcopal seal) and with the consent of the said Philip Vernon Smith, William Mackworth Young, Edward Alexander Stuart, Edward Grose Hodge, and Frank Theodore Woods, as the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and with the consent of the said Ernest Newton Sharpe, Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, Francis Augustus Bevan, John Francis William Deacon, and Edward Grose Hodge, as the patrons of the said benefice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, (in testimony whereof they, the said secondly and

thirdly mentioned consenting parties, have to this scheme respectively set their several hands and seals) and with the consents of the vestry of the said parish of Christ Church, Spitalfields, of the vestry of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and of the vestry of the said new parish of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, (in testimony of which consent this scheme is signed, in the case of each of the said vestries, by the chairman of a meeting of the same vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council all that is in this scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned as follows:—

PART I.

"As to the proposed union itself and certain immediate incidents thereof, we recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, and the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, be united into one benefice under the style of 'The United Benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields, with Saint Mary, Spitalfields,' which said united benefice is hereinafter called the united benefice.

"2. That, if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said present benefices shall be vacant, the union shall forthwith take effect, and, if the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, only shall then be vacant, the said union shall also forthwith take effect, and the incumbent of the other of the said present benefices shall become the first incumbent of the united benefice; and, if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, both of the said present benefices shall be full, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and the then incumbent of the other of the said two benefices shall be the first incumbent of the united benefice, and, in any case, it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the said diocese of London to admit to the united benefice such first incumbent (if an incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Christ Church, Spitalfields), without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall thereupon become the incumbent of the united benefice. Until the time of the union taking effect the said two benefices shall remain separate and the rights and liabilities in respect thereof and of the incumbents of each of them

shall remain unaffected.
"3. That, if after this scheme shall have been ratified by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, and before the said union shall have taken effect the incumbent for the time being of the said benefice of Saint Mary Spitalfields, shall, with the consent of the Bishop of London, retire from his incumbency in order that the said union may take immediate effect, then the incumbent so retiring from his incumbency shall be entitled during the period hereinafter specified to receive out of the annual income of the united benefice and by way of compensa-tion, an annual sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds, which annual sum shall commence as from the day on which the said union shall take effect, and shall be payable by equal halfyearly payments in every year; the first half-

yearly payment thereof to become due at the end of six calendar months next after the day on which the said union shall take effect; and the said annual sum shall be payable to the retiring incumbent during the remainder of his life, if he continue to be a member of the Church of England, but not otherwise, or until he shall accept other church preferment of a net annual value equal to or greater in amount than the said annual sum so to be made payable to such retiring incumbent. And upon his accepting such preferment the said annual sum shall thenceforth absolutely cease to be payable, but if he shall accept other church preferment of a less net annual value (to be ascertained without reference to, and exclusively of, the house of residence, if any) than two hundred and fourteen pounds, then whilst he shall hold such other preferment the said annual sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds shall in each year be reduced by a sum equal in amount to the net annual sum (to be ascertained as aforesaid) payable to him for the said year in respect of such other preferment. Provided always that, if such retiring incumbent shall hereafter be convicted of any offence against the ecclesiastical law the punishment for which would be deprivation or suspension, his right to receive such annual sum, payable by way of compensation as aforesaid, shall cease or shall be suspended as from the date of such conviction. And provided also that, if the same annual sum, or any part thereof, payable by way of compensation as aforesaid, shall cease to be payable to such retiring incumbent by his ceasing to be a member of the Church of England as aforesaid, or by his being convicted of any offence against the ecclesiastical law as aforesaid, or by his acceptance of such church preferment as aforesaid or by his death (as the case may be) on any other than one of the half-yearly days of payment, then he or his executors or administrators shall be entitled to a proportionate part of the said annual sum for the period which, at the time of such cesser, shall have elapsed of the current half-year, which proportionate part shall be payable at the end of the current half-year.

4. That the said annual sum shall be charged upon the annual income of the united benefice and shall be payable out of the same by the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice, and as between the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice and the retiring incumbent and his assigns the said annual sum shall be a first charge at law and in equity upon the income of the united benefice and the incumbent of the united benefice shall be deemed to have accepted the same subject to a trust to pay to the said retiring incumbent or his assigns the said annual sum out of the income of the said united benefice and for that purpose to use all due diligence to receive and collect the income of the said united benefice; and that, if such annual sum, or any part thereof, shall at any time be in arrear and unpaid for more than twenty-eight days after any of the said half-yearly days of payment and the fact of the same being so in arrear shall be verified by the declaration of the incumbent who shall have so retired, or his assigns, or in such other or further manner as shall be required by the Bishop of London, it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to make an order upon the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice requiring him to pay the amount in arrear within a time to be specified in such order and, if the same be not paid within such period, then it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to sequester the profits of the said united benefice until all such arrears and the costs of the sequestration shall have been paid and satisfied, but the power to be so conferred upon the said Bishop shall not in anywise abridge or interfere with the rights of the incumbent who shall have so retired, or his assigns, to recover the said annual sum and all arrears thereof by proceedings at law or in equity, or with the legal or equitable rights of the incumbent for the time being of the united benefice to recover from the preceding incumbent of the united benefice, his executors or administrators, any arrears of the said annual sum which ought to have been paid by such preceding incumbent.

" PART II.

"As to the parish church of the united benefice and the church of St. Mary, Spitalfields, and certain officers of the same and certain matters connected therewith, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect the church of Christ Church, Spitalfields, shall become, and thereafter continue to be, the

parish church of the united benefice.

"2. That upon the union taking effect the font, communion table, sacramental plate, and other furniture used in the church of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, may be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the church of the new benefice hereinafter mentioned (if such new benefice shall be within the diocese of London) unless in the opinion of the Bishop such articles are required for the church of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, and any articles which shall not be so appropriated may be transferred to any other church or chapel or churches or chapels within the diocese of London which the Bishop may select.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the

"3. That upon the union taking effect the table of fees used in the church of Christ Church, Spitalfields, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees

for the united parish.

"4. That upon the final closing of the church of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials, of the new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and the tablets and monuments, if any, in the church of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, shall be transferred to the parish church of the united benefice.

"5. That, if upon the union taking effect the present organist and verger of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, hold office or either of them holds office in that church, they, he or she (as the case may be) shall cease to hold such offices or office, and shall thereupon be entitled to receive for their, his or her loss of office the compensation hereinafter specified, that is to say, the verger, Mrs. Mary Ann King, shall receive a gross sums of fifty pounds to be paid to her by instalments of such amounts and at such times as shall to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, seem fit, and the said organist shall receive a gross sum of ten pounds, and that these compensations shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, out of the net proceeds of the sale or sales of the site and materials of the church of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, hereinafter mentioned, but it shall be lawful for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, if we shall see fit, to advance the

compensation moneys before mentioned or any part or parts thereof out of the fund created by section 22 of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860.

"PART III.

- "As to the endowments of the united benefice, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:
- "1. That upon the union taking effect an annual sum of sixty-six pounds, being part of the annual sum of one hundred and sixty-six pounds now payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the incumbent of the benefice of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and all other the properties, moneys, revenues, and income constituting the endowments of the said benefice (but not including the parsonage house belonging thereto nor the annual sum of one hundred pounds mentioned in the next succeeding clause of this scheme) shall be transferred and annexed to the united benefice.
- "2. That upon the union taking effect an annual sum of one hundred pounds, being the remainder of the said annual sum of one hundred and sixty-six pounds, shall be applied by us in the following manner, that is to say:
 - (a) If no compensation become payable to a retiring incumbent under clause 3 of Part I. of this scheme or if such compensation become payable then upon the cesser and determination of the payment thereof, the said annual sum of one hundred pounds shall be payable by us to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the new district which is hereinafter proposed to be constituted or created; provided always that until such new district shall have been constituted or created the said annual sum of one hundred pounds shall be accumulated by us towards the endowment of such new district.
 - "(b) If the full annual sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds shall under clause 3 of Part I. of this scheme, become payable to a retiring incumbent by way of compensation, then and in such case the said annual sum of one hundred pounds shall be payable by us to the incumbent of the united benefice so long as the said full annual sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds continues to be payable to such retiring incumbent.
 - "(c) In case the full annual sum of two hundred and fourteen pounds payable under the said clause 3 to a retiring incumbent by way of compensation shall (as provided by the same clause) be in any year or years reduced in consequence of the receipt by such retiring incumbent of income derived from other church preferment of aless annual value than the said full annual sum payable by way of compensation, then, if the annual income derived from such preferment amounts to one hundred pounds or more, the whole of the said annual sum of hundred pounds shall be applied in the manner which is set forth in the present clause under the letter (a); but, if the annual income derived from such preferment is less than one hundred pounds, a portion only of the said annual sum of one hundred pounds equal to such annual income shall be applied as aforesaid, and the remainder of the said annual sum of one hundred pounds shall be paid by us to the incumbent of the united benefice.

"PART IV.

"Upon the subjects of patronage and of a certain new district we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and pro-

"1. That the patronage of the united benefice shall be vested in the Bishop of London.

"2. That an ecclesiastical district within the limits of the metropolis or within the vicinity of the metropolis as defined by the said Union of Benefices Act, 1898 (such district having then been or being then about to be formed or legally constituted under some or one of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England and authorizing the formation or constitution of such district) shall be selected by the Bishop of London as the district for which a church shall be built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinafter recommended.

"3. That the patronage of such new district and benefice shall be vested in the before named Philip Vernon Smith, William Mackworth Young, Edward Alexander Stuart, Edward Grose Hodge, and Frank Theodore Woods, and their heirs and assigns in the same and as full and ample a manner as the patronage of the said present benefice of Saint Mary, Spital-

fields, is now vested in them.

"4. That when a church for such new district has been built out of the proceeds of the sale or sales hereinafter recommended it shall be consecrated by the name and style of Saint Mary, or by such other name or style as may appear to the Bishop of the diocese to be more expedient.

"PART V.

"As to the church and parsonage house of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and the sites and appurtenances thereof, and as to the proceeds of any sale or sales of the materials, site, furniture, or fittings of the same church and of the materials and site of the same parsonage house, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:

"1. That, upon the union taking effect the church of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, be taken

"2. That, subject to the provisions contained in Part II. of this scheme, the furniture or fittings (other than the font, communion table, and sacramental plate), and the materials and site of the said church, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof, and also the materials and site of the said parsonage house shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the provisions of the seventeenth section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860.

"3. That the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us as aforesaid shall form one aggregate fund and shall be applied

as follows, that is to say:-

"(1) For the payment of the gratuity or gratuities which are contemplated by clause

5 of Part II. of this scheme.

"(2) For or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for, and the erection of a new church within, the limits of the said new district constituted or to be constituted as aforesaid, and to be erected as the church of such new district.

- "(3) For or towards the acquisition of a suitable site for and the erection of a parsonage house (or the purchase, enlargement, or alteration of any existing house suitable with or without alteration for a parsonage house) situate within the limits of the said new district constituted or to be constituted as aforesaid and as the parsonage house of such new district.
- "4. The remainder (if any) of such fund to be added to the said fund created under the twenty-second section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860.

"PART VI.

- "As to a portion of the new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and as to the benefice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners further recommend and propose:—
- "1. That upon the union taking effect a portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, shall be severed from the united benefice and shall be united to the contiguous benefice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, the patronage whereof is vested in the beforenamed church patronage trustees.
- "2. That the said portion of the new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, to be united to the benefice of Saint Stephen, Spitalfields, shall comprise:—
- "All that portion of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, which is comprised in and is co-extensive with the liberty of Norton Folgate.
- "Provided always that this scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the seventeenth section of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1860, are made requisite to the sale or letting or appropriation under the powers conferred by that Act of the site of any church shall be obtained to the sale and appropriation hereby proposed of the church of Saint Mary, Spitalfields, and of the site thereof; together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof and to the mode of dealing with such site which is hereby proposed.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy; of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the sixth day of April, in the year one thousand nine hundred and eleven, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the eighth and ninth years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter seventy, of the Act of the fourteenth and fifteenth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter ninety-seven, and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her said late Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following representation as to the assignment of a consolidated chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Martin, Edmonton, situate within the parish of Edmonton, in the county of Middlesex and in the diocese of London.

in the diocese of London.

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said parish of Edmonton and of the new parish (sometime district) of Saint Mary, Edmonton, in the said county and diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such parish and new parish.

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said parish of Edmonton and of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Edmonton, should be formed into a consolidated chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said church of Saint Martin, Edmonton, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this representation), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, as the patrons of the vicarage of the said parish of Edmonton and also as the patrons of the vicarage of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Edmonton (in testimony whereof they have affixed their common or capitular seal to this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said parish of Edmonton and of the said new parish of Saint Mary, Edmonton, which are described in the schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one consolidated chapelry for the said

church of Saint Martin, Edmonton, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin,

Edmonton.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Edmonton, comprising:

"1. HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the representation of the Local Government Board, that for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall

have been given to the Incumbent and the vestry clerk or churchwardens of such parish.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the churchwardens of the parish of King's Cliffe, in the county of Northampton, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the civil parish of King's Cliffe aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said parish as hereinafter directed.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 22nd day of March, 1911, notice of such representation was given, and it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 1st day of May, 1911, and that the said Order in Council should be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the parish affected by such representation one month before the said 1st day of May, 1911.

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 22nd day of March, 1911, has been duly published in the London Gazette and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner

directed by the said Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial ground in the said civil parish of King's Cliffe, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be and the same is hereby prohibited, and that burials in the said parish be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

KING'S CLIFFE.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of All Saints, in the parish of King's Cliffe, in the county of Northampton; and in the churchyard, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said churchyard, burial may be allowed, subject to the conditions that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brick-

work properly cemented;

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the

ground adjoining the grave;

(c) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(d) In the said churchyard, in any grave

(d) In the said churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has taken place during the period of fourteen years prior to the date of the Order in Council, the burial

may be allowed, of the bodies of George and Agusta Coleman, at their decease; subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

The KING has been pleased to command that the following Regulations respecting Foreign Orders and Medals shall be substituted for those hitherto in force:

1. It is The King's wish that no subject of His Majesty shall wear the Insignia of any Foreign Order without having previously obtained His Majesty's permission to do so, signified either:

(a) By Warrant under the Royal Sign-

Manual, or

(b) By private permission conveyed through His Majesty's Private Secretary.

2. Permission given by Warrant under the Royal Sign-Manual will enable the Insignia of the Foreign Order to be worn at all times and without any restriction.

Private permission will only enable the Insignia to be worn on the occasions specified in the terms of the letter from The King's Private Secretary conveying the Royal Sanction.

3. The full and unrestricted permission by Warrant under the Royal Sign-Manual is designed, subject to the exception mentioned in Rule 4 (a) respecting British Naval or Military Officers during hostilities, to meet cases where the Decoration may be said to have been earned by some valuable service rendered to the Head of the State conferring it, or to the State itself. The private or restricted permission is contemplated for Decorations which are more or less of a complimentary character. In either case, the matter will be submitted to The King by His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

4. Full and unrestricted permission by Warrant under the Royal Sign-Manual is contemplated in the following cases:—

For a Decoration conferred—

(a) On an Officer in His Majesty's Navalor Military Forces lent to a Foreign Government; on an Officer in His Majesty's Naval

or Military Forces attached by his Government to a Foreign Navy or Army during hostilities; or on any British Official lent to a Foreign Government and not in receipt of any emoluments from British public funds

during the period of such loan.

(b) On any person not at the time in the service of the Crown, who, while himself outside the limits of His Majesty's Dominions, has rendered valuable services to the Head of the State conferring the Order, or to the State itself, within the period of two years immediately preceding the notification of the Decoration to His Majesty's Government provided for in Rule 5. The term "service of the Crown" (supru) comprises any person holding a Royal Commission, or any person in receipt of a salary from public funds in the United Kingdom, or in any British Dominion, Colony, or Protectorate. (c) On any British subject employed in a

Foreign Embassy or Legation in the United

Kingdom.

5. The desire of the Head of a Foreign State to confer upon a British subject the Insignia of an Order, or the fact that he has done so, must be notified to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs either through the British Diplomatic Representative accredited to the Head of the Foreign State, or through his Diplomatic Representative at the Court of St. James. His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall be under no obligation to consider claims that are not brought to his notice through one of these channels.

6. When His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs shall have taken the King's pleasure on any such application, and shall have obtained His Majesty's permission for the person in whose favour it has been made to wear the Insignia of a Foreign Order, he shall signify the same to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department in order that he may cause a Warrant, if it be a case for the issue of a Warrant as defined in Rule 4, to be prepared for the Royal Sign-Manual.

When such Warrant shall have been signed by The King, a notification thereof shall be inserted in the Gazette, stating the service for which the Foreign Order has been conferred.

Persons in whose favour such Warrants are issued will be required to pay to His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Home De-

partment a stamp duty of 10s.

The Warrant signifying His Majesty's permission may, at the request and at the expense of the person who has obtained it, be registered in the College of Arms. Every such Warrant as aforesaid shall contain a clause providing that His Majesty's licence and permission does not authorise the assumption of any style, appellation, rank, precedence, or privilege appertaining to a Knight Bachelor of His Majesty's Realms.

7. When a British subject has received the Royal permission to accept the Decoration of a Foreign Order, he will, at any future time, be allowed to accept the Decoration of a higher class of the same Order, to which he may have become eligible by increase of rank in the Foreign Service, or in the service of his own country; or any other distinctive mark of honour strictly consequent upon the acceptance of the original Decoration, and common to every person upon whom such Decoration is conferred.

8. Medals which constitute a particular class of a Foreign Order are subject in all respects to the above Regulations in the same manner as higher grades of the Order, except that permission to wear will be given by Letter and not by Royal Warrant. The King's permission must be obtained for any other Medal to be worn. No permission is needed to accept a Foreign Medal if it is not intended to be worn.

9. Naval and Military Attachés to His Majesty's Missions abroad may, at the termination of their appointments, be given restricted private permission to wear, on certain specific occasions, the Insignia of a Foreign Order conferred upon them by the Chief of the State only in which their headquarters were situated.

MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

COUNTY OF THE WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of Section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

BRIGHTON CORPORATION TRAM-WAYS.

OTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the Council of the county borough of Brighton, holden at the Town Hall of the said borough on Thursday, the fourth day of May, 1911, the said Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Brighton Corporation Act, 1900, and the Tramways Act, 1870, and of all and every other power them thereunto enabling, did make the following bye-laws and regulations.

COUNTY BOROUGH OF BRIGHTON.

Bye-laws and Regulations, hereinafter described as the Bye-laws, made this Fourth day of May, 1911, by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Brighton, under the Powers conferred by the Brighton Corporation Act, 1900, and the Tramways Act, 1870.

Repeal of former bye-laws.

1.—From and after the date of these byelaws coming into force, all bye-laws heretofore made by the said mayor, aldermen and burgesses, with respect to the tramways within the said borough, shall be repealed; but any proceedings pending at the time of such repeal, or which shall subsequently arise after such repeal in connection with former bye-laws, may be prosecuted as if such repeal had not taken effect.

Interpretation.

2.—For the purpose of these bye-laws, the term "the corporation" shall mean the mayor, aldermen and burgesses of the county borough of Brighton; the term "car" shall mean any engine, car or carriage using electrical or other mechanical power, and run by the Corporation on, or in connection with, any tramway laid down within the said borough; the term "motorman" shall mean any servant of the Corporation driving, or helping to drive a car; the term "conductor" shall mean any servant of the Corporation having charge of, or helping in the charge of, a car; the term "officer" shall mean any tramway inspector or any other servant of the Corporation in authority over the motormen and conductors; and the term "shelter" shall mean any public waiting-room or shelter, used, or intended to be used by tramway passengers, and to which the public have access.

Obstruction.

3.—The motorman of any car, on coming in sight of an obstruction or a vehicle standing or travelling on any part of the road so as not to leave sufficient space for the car to pass, shall sound his bell or whistle as a warning to the person in charge of such obstruction or vehicle, and that person shall, with reasonable despatch, cause such obstruction or vehicle to be removed so as not to obstruct the car.

4.—No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the tramway, nor shall any motorman or conductor needlessly cause interruption to the ordinary

road traffic.

5.—No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Corporation in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any car, tramway or shelter of the Corporation.

Stopping places provided.

-The motorman or conductor of a car shall stop the same at any of the stopping places which may from time to time be appointed by the Corporation for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers when required by any passenger desiring to leave the car, or by any person desirous of travelling by the car, for whom there is room and to whose admission no valid objection can be made.

Entering a car whilst in motion.

7.—No person shall enter, mount or leave, or attempt to enter, mount or leave, any car whilst in motion.

Boarding cars.

-The entrance to and exit from the cars shall be by the conductor's or rear platform, except when the cars are stationary at a terminus or important stopping place, when passengers shall, if required by the motorman or conductor, enter or leave the car from the motorman's or front platform.

Entering cars when full.

9.—When any car contains the full number of passengers which it is constructed to carry, no additional person shall enter, mount or remain in or on any such car unless permitted so to do by the conductor...

Objectionable persons.

10.—No person in a state of intoxication or affected with an infectious or contagious disease, or who, from any other cause, is, in the opinion of the conductor or other officer of the Corporation likely to be offensive to other passengers, shall be allowed to mount, enter or ride upon any car, or remain in any shelter, and any such person found in or upon any car or shelter shall be immediately requested to leave the car or shelter by the conductor or officer aforesaid, and, in default of such person so doing, it shall be lawful for the conductor or other officer of the Corporation to remove any such person from the car or shelter.

Dirty clothing.

11.-No person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor or other officer of the Corporation, soil or injure the seats, curtains, in or on any car or in any shelter, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, shall be entitled to enter or remain on any car or in any shelter. Any person so found on any car or in any shelter shall immediately leave, after having been requested to do so by the conductor of a car, or any other officer of the Corporation.

Provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics and daily labourers, or person shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on a car under the provisions of this bye-law on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment.

Offensive language or conduct.

12.-No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any car, or in any shelter, or commit any nuisance in, upon, or against any car, shelter, pole, pillar, or premises used in connection with the Tramway system, or in any way wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger or person using a shelter. No person shall play or perform on any musical instrument, or distribute advertisements, or beg, or collect alms, or subscriptions, or play any game, or gamble, or deposit remnants of food or fruit in or upon any car or in any shelter.

Riding on the platform.

No passenger or other person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall travel on the steps or on either platform of any car or stand on the roof, or sit on the outside rail on the roof or platform, and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or board a car, and no person (not being a passenger on such car) shall hold or hang on by or to any part of a car.

Firearms.

14.—No person shall enter, get upon, or travel in or on any car with loaded firearms, or with any article, instrument or implement which may be dangerous or offensive to any passenger.

Smoking.

15.—No person shall smoke or carry lighted pipes, cigars or cigarettes, inside, or on the seats in front of the trolley standard on the outside of any car, or in any shelter, or expectorate inside or outside any car, or in any shelter.

Damaging cars.

16.—No person shall wilfully damage or deface any seat, curtain, or any other part or fitting of any car, or remove or deface any number or other notice, or wilfully deface or damage any advertisement on any car or in any shelter. No person, not being a servant of the Corporation, shall touch, handle or interfere with any part of the electrical equipment or brake gear, in, under, or upon any car (legitimate use of the passenger bell excepted). Any person acting in contravention of this bye-law shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

Paying fares.

17.—Each passenger shall, on demand, pay to the conductor, or other officer of the Corporation without delay, the fare legally demandable for the journey, and shall receive a ticket in receipt, and, in any case, whether demanded or not, shall pay such fare before leaving the car. Tickets shall not be transferable, and shall only be available by the car on which they are issued, except where the working arrangements are such that passengers are allowed to transfer from one car to another with the same ticket.

Showing tickets.

18.—Each passenger shall retain his ticket intact until the termination of his journey, and shall show it on demand to the conductor or any officer of the Corporation, or shall, when required to do so, deliver up his ticket. Any passenger who, when travelling on a car, is unable to produce his ticket, unless he shall have previously given up his ticket to an officer of the Corporation, shall be deemed not to have paid his fare and shall pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

No breaks in journey.

19.—No passenger will be allowed to break his journey at any point. Any passenger having paid the fare legally demanded, and received a ticket, shall be deemed to have completed his journey should he alight from the car before the point is reached to which his ticket entitles him to travel. No such passenger shall be allowed to again board the same, or any other car, without paying another fare.

This bye-law shall not apply at those junctions where the working arrangements are such that passengers are allowed to transfer from one car to another with the same ticket.

Children.

20.—No child under three years of age, and who is accompanied by a passenger, shall be liable to pay a fare, but no such child shall occupy a seat, unless there shall be more seating accommodation than that required by the paying passengers.

Disabled cars.

21.—If at any time a car becomes disabled, or in any way injured, or from any other cause

is unable to proceed, the passengers shall, upon the request of the conductor or other officer of the Corporation, acting in the performance of his duty, leave the same, and such passengers who have paid their fares shall not be entitled to demand back the amount of their fares so paid, but on production of their tickets shall be allowed to travel by the next available car the remainder of the distance in respect of which they have paid their fares. No person, except with the leave of the conductor, shall enter or mount a disabled or injured car.

Personal luggage.

22.—Personal luggage not exceeding 28 lbs. in weight may be carried by hand, but unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, shall be placed on the front or motorman's platform. The conductor may decline to take into or upon the car any luggage of a form or description calculated to annoy or inconvenience any passengers.

Heavy packages.

23.—Personal luggage or property exceeding 28 lbs. in weight, but not exceeding 112 lbs., when accompanied by a passenger, will be taken on the front or motorman's platform, unless otherwise directed by the conductor, provided there shall be sufficient room, and that the loading and unloading thereof shall not delay the car.

Dogs and other animals.

24.—No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any car except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into or on any car after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any car in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the car immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

Penalty.

25.—Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

Exhibition of bye-laws.

26.—There shall be placed and kept in a conspicuous position inside of each car in use, and in each shelter, a printed copy of these bye-laws.

Operation.

27.—These bye-laws shall come into force on the 10th day of July, 1911.
