The following Addresses were presented to Their Majesties on the occasion of their visit to the Crystal Palace on Friday, the 12th instant, to open the Festival of Empire:—

CAMBERWELL BOROUGH COUNCIL.

To Their Most Excellent Majesties The King and Queen.

*May it please Your Majesties,*

Your Gracious Majesties' most dutiful and loyal subjects, being The Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Camberwell, in Council assembled, desire most loyally to welcome Your Majesties to the borough at the opening Concert of the Festival of Empire and Imperial Exhibition at the Crystal Palace.

The route taken by Your Majesties to-day through the ancient Royal Manor of Camberwell passes the new King's College Hospital, on Denmark Hill, the Foundation Stone of which Your Majesty's Royal Father of revered memory was graciously pleased to lay, in July, 1909, and the locality derives its name from Prince George of Denmark, for whom a mansion was built here in the Seventeenth Century, which was inspected by Her Gracious Majesty Queen Alexandra and the

Members of the Reigning Family of Denmark upon their visit in 1870.

The route also passes the houses in which John Ruskin wrote many of his famous works, the great musician Mendelssohn composed his "Ode to Spring," and Sir Henry Bessemer ended his life of great public usefulness.

In Dulwich Village, where Robert Browning wrote, are the Almshouses of the College, built and endowed under provisions in the Will of Edward Alleyn, a close friend and associate of William Shakespeare. In the grounds of the Old College is situate the Picture Gallery containing the valuable and world-famed pictures originally collected for the Court of Poland in 1790 by the efforts and energies of Noel Joseph Desenfans, the Polish Consul-General for Great Britain, who afterwards left them to his friend, Sir Francis Bourgeois, by whom they were bequeathed to the College.

The Crystal Palace, where the Festival of Empire is being held, contained the Great Exhibition of 1851, and the removal from Hyde Park and the rebuilding at Sydenham was watched with great personal interest by Her Most Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, and Your Majesty's Royal Grandfather the Prince Consort, who often drove together over the route Your Majesties have taken to-day.

The Council, as the representatives of a great London Borough, trust that the day is not far distant when the Crystal Palace will belong to

the nation, and that thus opportunity may be given not only for the continuance under National auspices of the Schools of Practical Engineering, of Arts, of Languages, of Music, and of Training for Colonial Life, but also for the preservation for ever of the beautiful grounds for the use and enjoyment of Your Majesties' loving subjects, so that the whole may be a lasting and fitting tribute to Your Majesty's—we all hope and pray—long and illustrious Reign, and also to the Reigns of Their Majesties Queen Victoria and King Edward VII, and may become a Colonial Palace in token of a Consolidated and Loyal Empire.

We humbly desire to thank Your Majesty for encouraging by Your Gracious Presence this effort to develop friendly intercourse and co-operation between the Mother Country and the Dominions Beyond the Seas.

And we will ever humbly pray that Your Majesty may long be spared to rule over a Nation and Empire united by the strongest ties of loyalty and devotion to Your Sacred Person, Your Throne and Your Royal House.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

The Queen and I are much gratified by this dutiful Address. We are very glad to visit your Borough and receive so warm an assurance of the loyalty and devotion of its inhabitants.

Camberwell is rich, as you remind Us, in places and memories of historic, literary, and artistic interest. In the Crystal Palace you have close at hand the monument of that first great National Exhibition which owed its inspiration and its success to the personal efforts of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert; and with Their example before Us We rejoice to be able to encourage by Our presence to-day the Festival of Empire and the Pageant of London which are designed to further the Imperial and National interests They had at heart.

PENGE URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL.

It is a great pleasure to Us to be welcomed to-day by the representatives of the district in which the Crystal Palace is situated. We hope that every success will crown the labours of those who in promoting this Festival of Empire have striven to serve the cause of Imperial unity and to awaken interest in the historic past of Our great Mother City.

The inhabitants of Penge will, I am sure, give the Festival their generous support so that it may worthily uphold the traditions of the Great Exhibition of sixty years ago.

ASSEMBLY OF THE FLEET AT SPITHEAD IN JUNE, AND REVIEW BY HIS MAJESTY THE KING ON THE 24TH JUNE, 1911.

Regulations.

The Naval Commander-in-Chief at Portsmouth has, on behalf of the Admiralty, issued the following Regulations to be observed by all vessels at Spithead during the time that the Fleet is assembled there for the Review in June, 1911:—

The Fleet will assemble and the Review take place within the limits of the Dockyard Port of Portsmouth.

1. In order to reduce, as far as possible, the chances of collision, all owners of vessels are earnestly requested to give directions to the Masters of their ships to follow closely the instructions herein laid down, and to carry out the requests of the officers in charge of Patrol vessels and steam boats, who will be specially charged with the duty of keeping the Review ground clear.

Vessels disobeying these directions are liable, in the interests of safety, to be removed from the Review ground.

2. The Patrol vessels will carry an ensign on a staff at the stern and a red flag on a staff in the bows, to distinguish them from other vessels.

3. The Fleet will be anchored between the Isle of Wight and the mainland, and between the entrance to Portsmouth harbour and the Bramble bank.

Note.—An Anchorage plan of the Fleet, showing also anchorages which merchant vessels may use, will be published by the Admiralty, and may be obtained from all sellers of Admiralty charts on or about the 1st June; a special chart of Spithead, on a scale of 5 inches to a sea mile, will also be published.

4. In the crowded condition of the fairways between the Isle of Wight and the mainland, navigation must be conducted with the greatest caution, and sailing vessels and small craft must remember that large steam vessels will not always be able to give way to them.

5. Vessels are particularly cautioned against approaching close to squadrons of ships-of-war which may be under way; the fact that they are of heavy draught and manœuvring in pilotage water in close order, renders it impossible for them to give way to individual vessels. Masters of sailing vessels, yachts and small boats must remember that the wash in the wake of large ships-of-war may cause sailing vessels to miss stays and become unmanageable.

6. All steam vessels in the vicinity of the Fleet are requested to burn the best Welsh coal, so that the smoke may not obstruct the view of the Fleet, nor cause danger of collision. Vessels neglecting this rule will be removed to a distance.

7. From the 19th to 28th June, inclusive, vessels are permitted to pass between the lines of ships under the following Regulations (excepting during the Review and Illuminations on Saturday, the 24th June, see paragraphs 9 to 14):—

(a) Vessels proceeding to the *westward*, are only to pass between lines C and D or between lines E and F.

Vessels proceeding to the *eastward*, are only to pass between lines D and E or between lines F and G.

Vessels, of under 300 feet in length only, proceeding to the *westward* between lines C and D, may, on arriving at berth C 22 ("Isis"), return to the *eastward* between lines B and C by passing through line C between berths C 22 ("Isis") and C 23 (Torpedo Boat Destroyer).

See special charts mentioned in paragraph 3 above, also attached diagram.

All vessels should avoid the Torpedo Boat Destroyers' anchorages, as the space between these vessels is very small, except across the Swashway channel where a fairway has been left.

In any channel where vessels meet, they must adhere to the Rule of the Road to keep to their own starboard side of the channel.

(b) The number of vessels anchored at Spithead between about the 19th and 28th June, inclusive, will render it difficult for ships to navigate this channel at night, and especially so on the night of the 24th June.

As the channel through Spithead will also be practically closed from noon on the Review day, the 24th of June, large steam vessels, other than those employed for the Review, passing to and from Southampton between noon on that day and 3 a.m. on the following day should use the Needles channel.

(c) The speed of steam vessels, when within the columns, is to be limited to 7 knots. Neglect of this rule, especially by paddle steamers, causes danger to small boats, which may result in loss of life. This rule will be strictly enforced.

(d) While between the columns, no vessel is to overtake and pass another, and no vessel is to stop unless to avoid collision.

(e) Should circumstances render it undesirable that vessels should pass between the columns, the ships-of-war at each end of the space that is closed to traffic will hoist a blue ensign, where it can best be seen, which will immediately indicate that no vessel is to pass

between these columns; any such vessel must then pass south of the Fleet and of Ryde Middle. Should the ships-of-war be dressed, the blue ensign will take the place of one of the ensigns ordinarily displayed.

8. All vessels, when altering course or stopping, are to make use of the sound signals mentioned in Article 28 of the Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea, viz.:—

When altering course to starboard, one short blast.

When altering course to port, two short blasts.

When engines are going astern, three short blasts.

9. On the Review day, Saturday, the 24th June, traffic between lines F and G will cease at 10.0 a.m., in order to allow the "Special merchant vessels" to enter between these lines from the eastward and proceed to take up their allotted berths in line G.

A signal gun will be fired at noon by each of the Flagships, after which no vessel is to enter the Review ground, and all vessels and boats are to be clear of the lines by 1 p.m.

10. The Review ground is the space within the following boundaries:—

Northern Limit.—A line joining the northern lines of Destroyers and extended in a N.W. by W. and a S.E. by E. direction.

Southern Limit.—Line G extended in a N.W. by W. and S.E. by E. direction; and the 5 fathom line northward of Ryde Middle.

Eastern Limit.—Line M; a line joining berth M 5 and the Horse fort; and a line joining the Horse fort and Nomans fort.

Western Limit.—The meridian drawn through berth D 29.

Vessels must take particular care not to encroach over the eastern and western limits of the Review ground, as large spaces are required for the Royal Procession to turn in.

11. No vessel, unless she should be disabled, will be permitted to anchor in the fairway channels approaching the Review ground, viz., from Cowes, North or South of Ryde Middle; nor from the south-eastward; nor in Portsmouth harbour channel.

12. During the time His Majesty the King is passing through the Fleet no vessel of any kind will be permitted to cross the line of ships-of-war, nor pass between the columns, nor follow the Royal Procession.

13. When the Royal yacht has returned into harbour a signal gun will be fired by each of the Flagships, after which vessels will again be permitted to pass through the lines as described in paragraph 7 above, except that no traffic will be permitted between lines F and G until the "Special merchant vessels" occupying berths in line G have weighed and proceeded to the westward.

14. After dark, on the 24th June, the ships-of-war will be illuminated, and searchlights may be used, rendering navigation most difficult and dangerous. Between 9 p.m. and 3 a.m. on the following day no vessels of over 200 feet in length will be permitted to pass through the Fleet. Small vessels of under 200 feet may pass through the lines, as described in paragraph 7 above.



15. Whilst the Fleet is at Spithead the Torpedo Boat Destroyers occupying berths immediately east and west of the night leading line through the Swashway, and also the ship-of-war occupying the westernmost berth in line D, will, from sunset to sunrise, exhibit two *fixed white lights vertically*.

16. Great caution must be observed by small vessels entering the main channel to Portsmouth harbour from the Swashway.

17. Attention is drawn to Notice to Mariners No. 463 of 1911, paragraph 2. Great care should be taken to avoid the buoys referred to.

18. The two southern buoys (green, with white horizontal stripes), marking the Submarine mining ground off Gilkicker point, will

be temporarily withdrawn on or about the 10th June.

NOTE.—Nothing in this Notice is to be construed as absolving vessels from observing the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea.

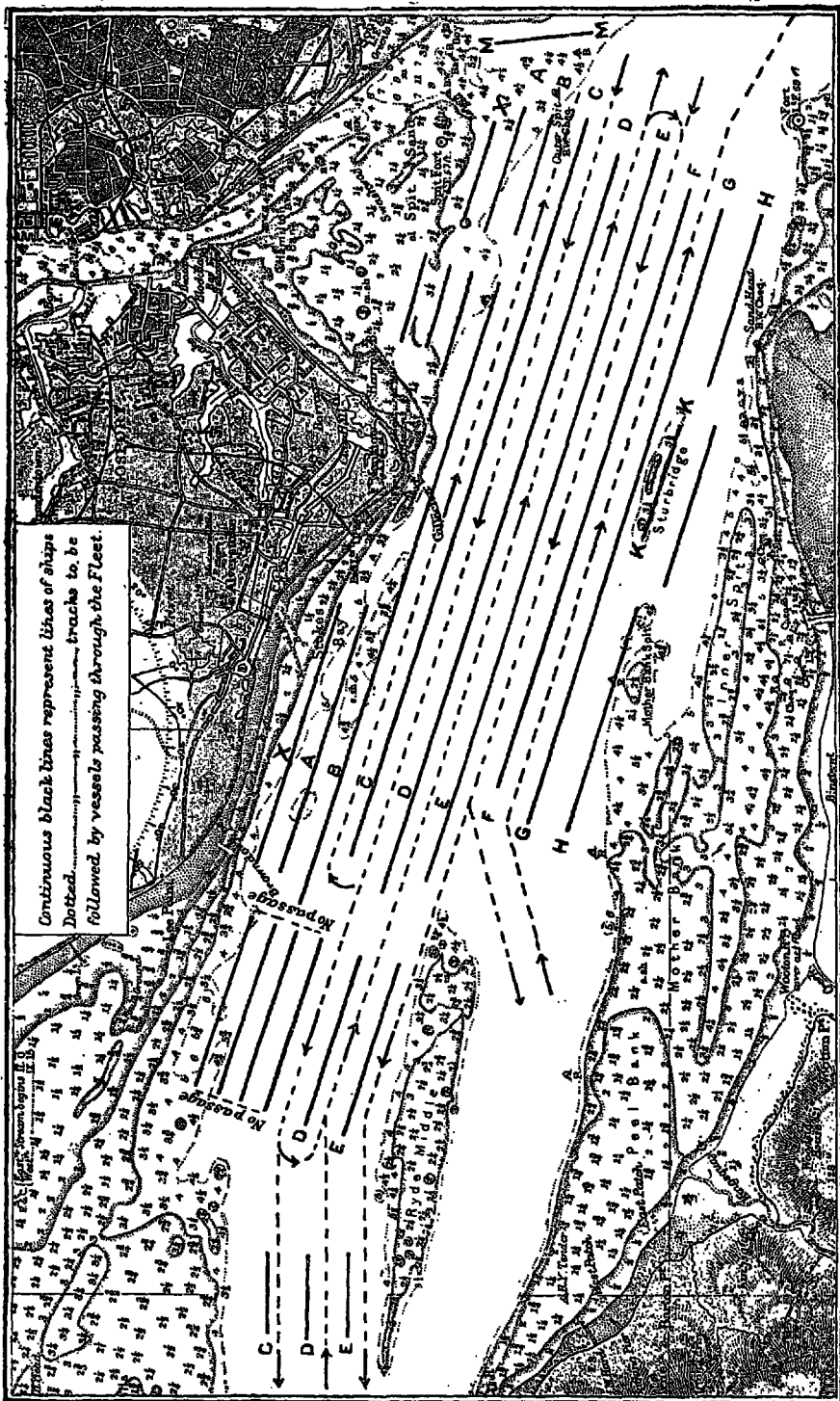
