union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories, or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or

vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the 5th day of August, 1910, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We, the undersigned Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of All England and Metropolitan, do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend Edward Carr, Lord Bishop of Peterborough, as bishop of the diocese within which are situate the vicarage of Barkestone and the vicarage of Plungar, both in the county of Leicester and diocese of Peterborough, having represented unto us that the said benefices being contiguous to each other and of which the aggregate population does not exceed fifteen hundred persons, might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent, and that the Most Noble Henry James Brinsley, Duke of Rutland, K.G., being the patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the vicarage of Barkestone and also to the vicarage of Plungar (if the same respectively were now vacant), has consented to the proposed union.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such enquiry and consent to Your Majesty in Council We caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed to the principal outer door of the Parish Church of each of the said benefices with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she or they might within such six weeks show cause in writing under his, her or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Peterborough, our enquiry into the circumstances of the case, the statement of circumstances in reply thereto, the consent in writing of the said Most Noble Henry James Brinsley, Duke of Rutland, K.G., as patron of both the said benefices, and the copies of the representation and notices before mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

BY an order of the Local Government Board, dated the 11th May, 1911, it is declared that sections 17, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 33 comprised in Part II; sections 35, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 48, 49, 50, and 51, comprised in Part III;

sections 53, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 66, 67, and 68, comprised in Part IV; Part V; and sections 92, 93, and 95, comprised in Part X of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, shall be in force in the urban district of Broadstairs and St. Peter's on and after the 29th day of June, 1911, subject to the conditions and adaptations set out in the First Schedule hereto.

On and after the date of the confirmation of any bye-laws made by the Local Authority under the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1907, with respect to the matters mentioned in section ninety-two of the Act of 1907, the local Act cited in the first column of Part I of the Second Schedule to this Order shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that Part, be no longer in force in the District.

On and after the day on which this Order comes into operation, the local Act cited in the first column of Part II of the Second Schedule to this Order, shall, to the extent specified in the second column of that Part, be no longer in force in the District.

Section Twenty-five. "The power of making or enforcing bye-laws under section one hundred and fifty-seven of the Public Health Act, 1875, as extended by section twenty-three of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890, with respect to the paving of yards and open spaces in connection with dwelling-houses, shall cease to be exerciseable."

Section Thirty.
