WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate,

a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;



THE LEE CONSERVANCY BOARD.

Proposed Bye-laws for regulating the Conveyance, Loading, and Unloading of Petrol and Other Dangerous Goods upon the River Lee.

WHEREAS the Lee Conservancy caused the above-mentioned proposed Byelaws to be published in the London Gazette of the 22nd April, 1910, and also caused to be inserted in the Times newspaper of the 23rd and 30th days of April, 1910, a statement drawing attention to the fact of the said publication in the London Gazette.

And whereas the said Lee Conservancy Board did during upwards of one month after such publication afford to all persons the opportunity of making in writing or otherwise objections to or representations respecting such proposed Bye-laws.

And whereas the said Lee Conservancy having taken into consideration all such objections and representations as were made to them concerning the same made alterations in and additions to such proposed Bye-laws which said Bye-laws as altered and added to are as follows:—

BYE-LAWS for Regulating the Conveyance, Loading, and Unloading of Petrol and Other Dangerous Goods upon the River Lee.

The Lee Conservancy Board in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by "The Lee Conservancy Acts (1868 to 1900)" and "The Lee Navigation Improvement Acts" in those Acts referred to and of every other authority them hereunto in anywise enabling order and direct as follows that is to say:—

- 1. Bye-law Number 56 of The River Lee General Bye-laws made by the Board and allowed by His Majesty in Council on the 21st day of December 1908 shall as from the date when these present Bye-laws come into operation be and the same is hereby repealed.
- 2. These Bye-laws may be cited as "The River Lee Petrol and other Dangerous Goods Bye-laws" and shall come into operation at the expiration of fourteen days after the day upon which they have been allowed by His Majesty in Council.
- 3. In these Bye-laws the following words and expressions shall have the several meanings hereinafter assigned to them unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction viz.:—
 - "The Board" means the Lee Conservancy Board.
 - "The Navigation" means and includes all the navigable portions of the River Lee as that River is defined by the 3rd Section of "The Lee Conservancy Act 1868."
 - "Petrol" includes any rock oil Rangoon oil Burmah oil oil made from petroleum coal schist shale peat or other bituminous substance and any products of petroleum also naphtha wood spirit and any other liquid or substance or any product of or mixture or with any liquid or substance which when tested in the manner set forth in Schedule I. to the Petroleum Act 1879 or in the Schedule to the Order-in-Council as to mixtures of petroleum made on the 7th day of May 1907 gives off an inflammable vapour

at a temperature of less than *73 degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer.

- "Barge" includes any dumb barge or other craft for carrying goods or any sailing barge.
- "Petrol Tank Barge" means any tank barge or barge fitted with a tank or tanks which is used for the conveyance on the Navigation of petrol as defined in these Byelaws.
- "Dangerous goods" includes carbide of calcium and other carbides and all goods (other than explosives as defined by the Explosives Act 1875 and petrol as defined in these Bye-laws) which are or may be specified from time to time in the "Special Classification of Explosives and other Dangerous Goods by Merchandise Trains" issued annually by the Railway Clearing House.
- "Persons" includes a firm or a body corporate.
- "Owner" means and includes master owner consignee consignor broker and agent.
- "Master" means any person having or taking the command charge or management of a barge or a petrol tank barge for the time being.
- "Engineer" means and includes the person for the time being acting in that capacity for the Board and any person from time to time authorized by him to act for him or on his behalf.
- "Wharf" means and includes any quay landing place siding and other place upon the Navigation at which goods are landed loaded or unloaded.
 - "Horse" includes all draught animals.

Words importing the masculine gender include females and words importing the singular include the plural.

- 4. There shall be displayed at the stern of every barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol and every empty petrol tank barge on entering the Navigation and during the time that such barge or petrol tank barge remains on the Navigation a red metal flag not less than eighteen inches square with a white circular centre six inches in diameter and no tug shall tow such a barge or petrol tank barge without also exhibiting a similar flag in a conspicuous position above the deck.
- 5. No fire or artificial light or matches or other means of producing ignition shall be permitted nor shall any person smoke nor shall smoking be allowed upon any barge containing petrol or upon any petrol tank barge whether containing petrol or not whilst such barge or petrol tank barge is upon the Navigation whether under way or not.
- 6. The following Bye-laws in respect of the loading or discharge of petrol within the Navigation shall in every case be complied with .—
 - (a) When the loading or discharge of petrol has been commenced such loading or discharge shall be proceeded with continuously with all due speed and diligence but the loading or discharge of petrol shall not be commenced later than one hour before
- * Note.—Equal to 22.7 degrees Centigrade or 18.2 degrees Reaumur.

- sunset or earlier than one hour before sunrise.
- (B) No petrol shall be discharged at any of the Board's public wharves until the means of transport by which the same is to be removed therefrom shall be at the wharf in readiness to receive the same and all petrol so discharged shall be forthwith removed from the wharf to some place beyond the limits of the jurisdiction of the Board.
- 7. No petrol shall be conveyed upon the Navigation in any barge other than and except a petrol tank barge unless it is safely stowed in barrels drums or other similar receptacles.
- 8. No person owner or master shall convey petrol upon the Navigation in any barrel drum or other similar receptacle which is not staunch and free from leakage.
- 9. The following Bye-laws shall always be observed in respect to barges or petrol tank barges conveying petrol and empty petrol tank barges:—
 - (A) No barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or any empty petrol tank barge shall be navigated above Bow Locks or in the Limehouse Cut except in tow of a horse and not more than one such barge petrol tank barge or empty petrol tank barge shall be towed at one time.
 - (n) No other barge whatsoever shall be towed at the same time with any barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or with any empty petrol tank barge.
 - (c) Every barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol and every empty petrol tank barge shall at all times during the navigation loading or discharge thereof be under the control and personal supervision of the master thereof.
 - (D) Immediately after the discharge of the petrol and before the barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol is removed or the horse or tug approaches for the purpose of such removal the master shall securely close or cause to be securely closed all manholes valves and ventilators.
- 10. The following Bye-laws in addition to those contained in Bye-law No. 9 shall always be observed in respect to petrol tank barges:—
 - (a) Immediately after any petrol tank barge is loaded and before it is removed from the wharf at which it has been loaded all manholes shall be screwed down gas tight all valves on suction pipes closed and all ventilator openings securely stopped or covered with wire gauze.
 - (B) No manholes valves or ventilators shall be opened whilst any petrol tank barge is in tow of a horse or a tug or before it has been made fast to the wharf at which the petrol is to be discharged.
- 11. No barge or petrol tank barge conveying more than sixty tons of petrol shall be navigated on the Navigation unless it has two competent men in constant attendance on board.
- 12. No barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol shall be moored in or lie in the Navigation except the same be constantly in charge of a competent person until all petrol on board shall have been discharged and every empty petrol tank barge moored or lying in the Navi-

gation shall be constantly in charge of a competent person.

- 13. No petrol or dangerous goods shall be discharged or allowed to escape into the Navigation.
- :14. The owner and master of any barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or dangerous goods shall at all times while such barge or petrol tank barge is within the Navigation and whether under way or moored take all due and proper precautions for the prevention of accident either by fire or otherwise.
- 15. The bilges of a petrol tank barge or of a barge used for the conveyance of petrol or dangerous goods shall not be pumped when such petrol tank barge or barge is on the Navigation unless and until all such precautions have been taken as will insure that no petrol or dangerous goods can escape into the Navigation.
- 16. Every barge or petrol tank barge on the Navigation containing petrol or carrying petrol or dangerous goods and every empty petrol tank barge shall proceed to its destination without unnecessary delay and all petrol or dangerous goods contained therein shall be discharged with all due speed and diligence after arrival at such destination.
- 17. The master shall when so required by the Engineer or by any officer of the Board show to such Engineer or officer all petrol or dangerous goods under his control upon the barge or petrol tank barge and shall afford every reasonable facility to enable such engineer or officer to inspect and examine such petrol or dangerous goods and such barge or petrol tank barge so that he may ascertain whether the provisions of these Bye-laws are duly observed.
- 18. Numbers 4, 5, 6, 9 (A) (B) and (C), 11 and 12 of these Bye-laws shall also apply to carbide of calcium and other carbides and be read and construed as if in those Bye-laws the expression "petrol" included carbide of calcium and other carbides and in addition the following Bye-laws shall be observed viz.:—
 - (A) Carbide of calcium and other carbides shall only be brought into or carried on the Navigation in hermetically closed metal receptacles containing each not more than 224 lbs. of such strength and construction or so protected as not to be liable to be broken or to become defective or insecure in conveyance otherwise than by gross negligence or extraordinary accident.
 - (a) No receptacle containing carbide of calcium or other carbides shall be opened

- within the jurisdiction of the Board except in some duly licensed place of storage.
- (c) Every precaution shall be taken to prevent the contact of water or moisture with the carbide of calcium or other carbides and where such contact may have occurred to prevent the gas evolved from being ignited.
- (n) Every receptacle containing carbide of calcium or other carbides shall be labelled and such label shall bear in conspicuous characters the words "Carbide. Dangerous if not kept dry" and with the following caution:—"The contents of this package are liable if brought into contact with moisture to give off a highly inflammable gas" and with the addition of the name and address of the sender.
- 19. When any barge or petrol tank barge conveying petrol or dangerous goods or any empty petrol tank barge or any petrol or dangerous goods is or are navigated moored loaded discharged or otherwise dealt with in contravention of any of the above Bye-laws the owner and master of such barge or petrol tank barge or empty petrol tank barge or the owner of such petrol or dangerous goods shall each incur a penalty not exceeding £5 for each such contravention and a further penalty not exceeding £5 for each day on which each such contravention continues and without prejudice to the right to recover such penalty it shall be lawful for the Engineer to cause such barge or petrol tank barge or any such petrol or dangerous goods to be removed at the expense of the owner thereof to some place of safety and all expenses of or incident to such removal may be recovered in the same manner in which penalties are by "The Lee Conservancy Acts 1868 to 1900" made recoverable.
