## THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

Bentham Hiring Fair.

Whereas on the 3rd May, 1911, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Settle Rural District Council to the effect that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the Hiring Fair which has been held annually at Bentham, in the Rural District of Settle, in the West Riding of the county of York, on the 22nd day of June, should in future be held on the 23rd day of June when the 22nd June is a Sunday or a Bank Holiday:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Acts, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that the alteration of the date of the Fair as proposed would be for the convenience and advantage of the public:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fair which has been held annually at Bentham, in the Rural District of Settle, in the West Riding of the county of York, on the 22nd day of June, shall in future be held on the 23rd day of June when the 22nd June is a Sunday or a Bank Holiday.
