

## MOTOR CAR ACT, 1903.

## COUNTY OF RADNOR.

Whereas by sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903, it is enacted that within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by the Local Government Board with a view to the safety of the public, on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

And whereas the County Council of Radnor have made application to the Local Government Board for a regulation to be made in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising the following roads within the parishes of Rhayader, Nantmel, and Cwmdauddwr, in the county of Radnor, that is to say:—

South Street, and so much of Builtth Road as extends from its junction therewith to a point situate 165 yards to the east of Tan House Bridge;

West Street, Bridge Street, Rhayader Bridge, and so much of the road leading to Elan Valley Reservoirs as extends from Rhayader Bridge to a point situate seventy yards to the west of the Cambrian Railway Arch;

East Street, and so much of the road leading to Penybont as extends from East Street to a point situate sixty yards to the east of Rhyd-hir-Bridge;

North Street, and so much of St. Harmon Road as extends from its junction with North Street to its junction with Bryntirion Road;

New Road; and

Church Street, and so much of Aberystwith Road as extends from its junction with Church Street to a point in the road opposite the western extremity of Pen-y-pistyll.

Notice is hereby given that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Local Government Board, will attend at the Magistrates' Room, Rhayader, on Wednesday, the twenty-eighth day of June, 1911, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject matter of the said application.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry, and be heard with reference to the said application.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

*Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.*

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-second day of June, nineteen hundred and eleven.
