The Sword of State, borne by the Gentleman Usher to the Sword of State, the Right Honourable Sir Spencer Ponsonby-Fane, G.C.B., and attended by Garter, was carried into the Throne Room, and laid upon the

The Knights Companions and the Officers of the Order then proceeded to the Grand Reception Room and waited there while the Sovereign and Her Majesty the Queen Sovereign and Her Majesty the Queen [attended by four Pages, H. D. Erskine, Esquire, of Cardross, C.V.O., Gentleman Usher of the Pakes and M. D. Usher of the Robes, and the Duchess of Devonshire, Mistress of the Robes], His Majesty King Manuel, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, and His Royal Highness Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, passed to the Throne Room.

The Sovereign being seated in His Chair of State, Her Majesty the Queen being on His immediate left hand, His Majesty King Manuel, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, and His Royal Highness Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein being in the seats allotted to them at the upper end of the Table, the Sovereign commanded Garter to summon the Knights Companions, who entered the Throne Room as their names were severally called over.

The Knights Companions then took their respective seats at the Table. The Prelate passed up the room, and took his stand on the right of the Sovereign, the Chancellor passing to his place on the left of Her Majesty the Queen, and the Register, Garter, Black Rod and Secretary standing at the foot of the Table.

His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales was then, by the Sovereign's command, conducted from his apartments to the Throne Room, between Their Royal Highnesses the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn and Prince Arthur of Connaught, preceded by the Secretary, carrying the Star and Collar of the Order, Black Rod, carrying the Riband and George,

and Garter, carrying the Garter.
On entering the Throne Room His Royal

His Royal Highness was then conducted before the Sovereign, who indicated to him the seat upon his, the Sovereign's, immediate right hand.

Garter, kneeling, then presented the Garter to the Sovereign, who, assisted by the Royal Knights, buckled it on the left leg of His Royal Highness, the Admonition being pronounced

by the Prelate.

Black Rod next presented in like manner the Riband and George to the Sovereign, who, assisted as before, adjusted the same on the left shoulder of His Royal Highness, the Admonition being pronounced by the Chancellor.

The Secretary, then presented in like manner the Star of the Order which the Sovereign affixed to His Royal Highness' left breast.

The Secretary in like manner presented the Collar, which was handed by the Sovereign to His Royal Highness, the Admonition being

pronounced by the Register.

The Sovereign thereupon gave the Accolade to His Royal Highness, who proceeded round the table, receiving the congratulations of Her Majesty the Queen, His Majesty King Manuel, His Royal Highness the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn, His Royal Highness Prince Arthur of Connaught, His Royal Highness Prince Christian of Schleswig-Holstein, and each of the Knights Companions present, and resumed his seat.

The Chapter being ended, the Knights Companions were again severally called over by Garter, and, with the Officers of the Order, retired from the presence of the Sovereign with the usual ceremonies.

WILD BIRD (ENGLAND).

The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cumberland) Order, 1911.

Dated 20th June, 1911.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the Wild Birds Protection Acts, 1880 to 1908, and upon application by the Council of the Administrative County of Cumberland, I hereby make the following Order:—

Title.

I. This Order may be cited as "The Wild Birds Protection (Administrative County of Cumberland) Order, 1911."

BIRDS.

Close Time extended.

II. The time during which the killing or taking of Wild Birds is prohibited within the Administrative County of Cumberland shall be extended so as to be between the first day of March and the first day of September in any year, except in the case of Plover (not including Lapwing, Peewit or Green Plover) and Wild Duck, the close time for which remains as fixed by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, namely, between the first day of March and the first day of August in any year.

Additions to the Schedule of the Act of 1880.

III. The Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, shall apply within the Administrative County of Cumberland to the following species of Wild Birds in the same manner as if those species were included in the Schedule to the Act:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Reed Bunting, Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Corn Crake (or Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Dipper, Turtle Dove, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Kestrel, Kite, Linnet, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Ring Ouzel, Rock Pipit, Tree Pipit, Quail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redstart, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Coal Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Wagtails, Blackc.p Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Sedge Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.

Certain Birds protected during the whole of the Year.

IV. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cumberland:—

Turtle Dove, Goldfinch, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Owl (all

species).

Certain Birds protected on Sundays and on Christmas Day.

V. During that period of the year to which the protection afforded by the Wild Birds Protection Act, 1880, as extended by Clause II of this Order, does not apply, the killing or taking of the following species of Wild Birds on Sundays and on Christmas Day is prohibited throughout the Administrative County of Cumberland:—

Brambling, Bullfinch, Lapland Bunting, Reed Bunting, Snow Bunting, Yellow Bunting (Yellow Hammer), Chaffinch, Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Shore Lark, Sky Lark, Linnet, Lesser Redpole, Mealy Redpole, Siskin, Tree Sparrow, Twite, Wren, Goldencrested Wren.

Eggs.

Certain Eggs protected throughout the County.

VI. The taking or destroying of the Eggs of the following species of Wild Birds is pro-libited throughout the Administrative County of Cumberland:—

Hedge Accentor (Hedge Sparrow), Reed Bunting, Common Buzzard, Chiffchaff, Cornic Crake (or Land Rail), Tree Creeper, Crossbill, Cuckoo, Curlew, Dipper, Dotterel, Turtle Dove, Dunlin, Peregrine Falcon, Pied Flycatcher, Spotted Flycatcher, Goldfinch, Little Grebe, Kestrel, Kingfisher, Lapwing (Peewit or Green Plover), Linnet, Mallard or Wild Duck, House Martin, Sand Martin, Merlin, Nightjar, Ring Ouzel, Owls, Oyster Catcher, Tree Pipit, Rock Pipit, Golden Plover, Ringed Plover, Quail, Water Rail, Raven, Lesser Redpole, Redshank, Redstart, Sandpiper, Shoveller, Skylark, Snipe, Tree Sparrow, Stonechat, Swallow, Swift, Teal, Terns, Coal Tit, Great Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Marsh Tit, Twite, Grey Wagtail, White Wagtail, Yellow Wagtail, Blackcap Warbler, Garden Warbler, Grasshopper Warbler, Garden Warbler, Willow Warbler, Wood Warbler, Wheatear, Whinchat, Whitethroat, Lesser Whitethroat, Woodpeckers, Wren, Golden-crested Wren.
