ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(SWINE-FEVER INFECTED AREA.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894

to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Declaration of Swine-Fever Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

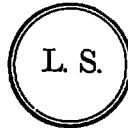
Suspension of Local Orders.

2. So long as any borough mentioned in the Schedule hereto continues to be, or be comprised in, a Swine-Fever Infected Area, any Order relating to such borough now in force, which declares that the provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 which require movement of swine in a float, cart, or van shall not apply to movement along, over, or across any street in the said borough, shall cease to operate.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-seventh day of June, nineteen hundred and eleven.
