The following Address was presented to the King on the occasion of Their Majesties' visit to Norwich for the Royal Agricultural Show on Wednesday, the 28th instant:—

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Lord Mayor, Sheriff, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Norwich extend to Your Majesty a most loyal and hearty welcome to our ancient City on the occasion of Your Majesty's visit as President of the Royal Agricultural Society of England.

It is twenty-five years since the Royal Show was last held in the capital of East Anglia, when it was our privilege to welcome in this historic hall our late Sovereign of happy memory King Edward, then Prince of Wales. THE FAIRS ACT, 1873.

ASHBORNE HORSE AND CATTLE FAIRS.

Whereas on the 17th March, 1911, a representation was made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Ashborne Urban District Council to the effect that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the Fairs for the sale of Horses and Cattle which have been held annually at Ashborne on the 13th February, the 21st May, the 16th August, the 20th October and the 29th November, respectively, should, commencing with the year 1912, be held on the third Thursday in the months of February, May, August, October and November in each year.

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when the same would be taken into consideration has been duly published in pursuance of the Fairs Act, 1873:

And whereas on such representation and consideration it appears to me that the alteration of the dates of the Fairs as proposed would be for the convenience and advantage of the public:

Now therefore I, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fairs Act, 1873, do hereby order that the Fairs for the sale of Horses and Cattle which have been held annually at Ashborne on the 13th February, the 21st May, the 16th August, the 20th October and the 29th November, respectively, shall, commencing with the year 1912, be held on the third Thursday in the months of February, May, August, October and November in each year.

GOVERNMENT NOTICE.

It is hereby notified that His Excellency the Governor, acting on the advice of the Council of Health, and in exercise of the powers vested in him by Articles 38 and 44 of the Fourth Sanitary Ordinance, has been pleased to direct that the Regulations for the prevention of contagious, infectious and epidemic diseases published by Government Notice No. 165 of the 28th August, 1908 (as amended by Government Notice Nos. 199, 214, 243, 244, 290, and 324 of 1910), be amended as follows:—

- (I.) Paragraph 1 of Article 8 of Part I of the aforesaid Regulations is cancelled, and the following paragraph is substituted therefor, viz.:
- "Where a ship has persons on board who are in a filthy or otherwise unwholesome condition, or is overcrowded with passengers, emigrants or otherwise, or has on board persons coming from infected places, who, owing to the shortness of the passage, have not had time to develop infection, or persons who cannot show, to the satisfaction of the Quarantine Medical Officer, that they have not been in an infected place, within a period of twelve days in the case of small-pox, and five days in the case of any other disease, previous to their arrival in Malta, the Quarantine Medical Officer may, if in his opinion it is desirable with a view to preventing the introduction of disease and on his certifying to that effect—
 - (a) enforce, as regards such ship, any of the sanitary precautions laid down in these Regulations, which may be necessary to prevent the introduction of disease;
 - (b) subject any of the persons on board to observation or to surveillance, for a period not exceeding twelve days in the case of small-pox and five days in the case of any other disease, and, in addition to, or in substitution for such observation or surveillance, to any other sanitary precaution laid down in these Regulations, which may be necessary to prevent the introduction of disease."
- (II.) The following paragraph is added after paragraph 1 of the said Article 8 of Part I of the aforesaid Regulations, viz.:
- "The powers mentioned at (a) and (b) of the foregoing paragraph may also be exercised in respect to any ship, from whatever place arriving, and to any persons on board such ship, in any case in which, in the opinion of the Quarantine Medical Officer, it is desirable to adopt the measures specified in the sub-paragraphs above referred to, with a view to preventing the introduction of disease, and on his certifying to that effect."
- (III.) The following paragraph is added after Article 1 of Part III of the aforesaid Regulations:—
- "The importation of articles of food from any place other than an infected place is allowed, provided that such articles have been so conveyed that, in the opinion of the Quarantine Medical Officer, they could not have been

contaminated by disease either at the place of origin or on their way to this port."

The Ministers of the Interior and of Finance.

Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October 10, 1910:

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after the 22nd June, 1911, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from Smyrna shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from Smyrna, but of which it appears sufficiently clearly that they have come from elsewhere, and which are packed in such a manner and have been so transported that they cannot have been in contact with infected objects.

II. As regards transit:

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or treatment on the way.

Declaration of Sheep-Scab Compulsory Dipping Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area") is hereby declared to be a Compulsory Dipping Area for the purposes of the Sheep-Scab (Compulsory Dipping Areas) Order of 1906 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and that Order shall apply to the Area accordingly, subject to the modifications contained in this Order.

Period for Compulsory Annual Dipping.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Dipping Area are to be treated by the owner for sheep-scab by effective dipping under Article 2 of the principal Order as modified by this Order, are hereby fixed to be the four-teenth day of July and the first day of September in every year.

Double Dipping on Separate Dates required for Compulsory Annual Dipping.

3. The annual dipping required by the principal Order as modified by this Order shall be a double dipping on separate dates specified in Notices under the principal Order with an interval of not less than ten days between the two dates.

Exemptions.

4. Article 2 (Compulsory Dipping of all Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Area) of the principal Order shall not as regards the Dipping Area apply to sheep for which an exemption has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District, which exemption shall only be granted for sheep which for the purposes of sale, exhibition or movement shall have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of the principal Order and this Order on or since the seventeenth day of June in the current year, and have since such dipping been kept separate from sheep not dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order and this Order. The sheep thus exempted shall until the expiration of the prescribed dipping period be kept separate from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by the principal Order and this Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority, and shall be

subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries. This modification does not alter the effect of Part II of the principal Order (Regulation of Exposure and Movement of Sheep in Compulsory Dipping Areas).

Double Dipping on Separate Dates required for Movement Licences.

5. Article 5 (2) (i) of the principal Order shall in its application to the Dipping Area be read and have effect as if the certificate thereby required for a Movement Licence authorising movement of sheep out of the Dipping Area were a certificate showing that the sheep have been dipped twice on separate dates within twenty-eight days before the granting of the Licence with an interval of not less than ten days between the two dates, and in the manner prescribed by that Article.

Area not subject to Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908.

6. The Sheep-Dipping (South Wales and Monmouth) Order of 1908 will not apply to the Area to which this Order applies so long as it continues to be a Compulsory Dipping Area:

- float, cart or van to a slaughter-house situate in the county borough of Hastings, for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of that borough, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.

- (4.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available routs and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughterhouse, be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article, shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the owner of the float, cart or van as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
 - (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
 - (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county borough of Hastings, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.

- (2.) Swine may also be moved to any premises to which this Order applies if such movement is authorised by a licence (Form A) granted under and in accordance with the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.
- (3.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (4.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (5.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (6.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (7.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

7. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 8.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the cowner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float,

cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the owner, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
