PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that,
"Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets,
chapelries, and other places or districts may
be separated from the parishes or mother
churches to which they belong with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial
may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they
are contiguous, or be constituted separate
parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is,
amongst other things, enacted, "That when
with respect to his own diocese it shall appear
to the Archbishop of the Province, or when
the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to
the said Archbishop that any such tithing,
hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the
diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of
such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or
mother church, and either be constituted a
separate benefice by itself or be united to any

other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes: And the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme, in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the model in which it appears to him it the the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rentcharges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent, in writing under his or their hands, to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Edgar, Lord Bishop of St. Albans, hath, pursuant to the enactment aforesaid, made a representation, in writing, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverence Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

- "I, Edgar, Bishop of St. Albans, in pursuance of the 26th section of an Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, cap. 106, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—°
- "The borough of Colchester, in the county of Essex and my diocese of St. Albans, contains within its limits the several ecclesiastical parishes hereinafter mentioned, the ancient boundaries whereof are very irregular, and in certain cases there are detached portions of such parishes lying at a distance from their parish church and are wholly surrounded by other parishes, so that the cure of souls within the said borough cannot be effectively administered without the alterations to the boundaries of such parishes as is hereinafter proposed.
- "1. There is in the said county of Essex, in my diocese of St. Albans, the rectory of Lexden, the parish whereof contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of one thousand and eight, and the net annual value arising from tithe rentcharge and glebe is three hundred and forty-two pounds.
- "2. There is in the same county and diocese the rectory of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the said parish of Lexden, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of four thousand three hundred and twenty-nine. The net annual value of the benefice of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, arising from tithe rentcharge and glebe is two hundred and eighty-six pounds.
- "3. There is in the same county and diocese the rectory of Holy Trinity, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of two thousand and two. The net annual value of the benefice of Holy Trinity, Colchester, arising from tithe reptcharge and glebe is two hundred and forty-seven pounds.
- "4. In the same county and diocese is the rectory of St. Giles, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the said parishes of St. Mary the Virgin and Holy Trinity, Colchester, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of six thousand one hundred and one, and the net annual value whereof arising from tithe rentcharge, glebe, and dividends from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners is one hundred and sixty-ofe pounds.
- "5. In the same county and diocese is the vicarage of St. Botolph, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the said parishes of St. Giles and Holy Trinity, Colchester aforesaid,

- and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of eight thousand three hundred and twentynine, and the net annual value whereof arising from dividends from Queen Anne's Bounty and the Ecclesiastical Commissioners is three hundred and seventeen pounds.
- "6. In the same county and diocese is the rectory of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the said parishes of St. Botolph and St. Giles, Colchester aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of one thousand one hundred and ninetysix, and the net annual value arising from invested funds is three hundred and eighty pounds.
- "7. In the same county and diocese is the vicarage of St. Peter, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the said parishes of St. Mary the Virgin, St. Botolph, and Holy Trinity, Colchester aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of two thousand one hundred, and the net annual value arising from tithe rentcharge is four hundred and fifty pounds.
- "8. The particular district of St. Paul, Colchester, was, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, founded under The Church Building Acts' out of a portion of the said parish of Lexden, and has since become a new parish, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of one thousand eight hundred and seventy-two, and the net annual value arising from a charge on the rectory of Lexden and funds in the hands of Ecclesiastical Commissioners is one hundred and sixty-eight pounds.
- "9. In the same county and diocese are the united rectories of St. Nicholas with St. Runwald, Colchester, the parishes whereof lie adjoining the said parishes of Holy Trinity, St. Peter, and St. Botolph, Colchester aforesaid, and contain together, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of nine hundred and ninety-five, and the net annual value arising from tithe rentcharge is three hundred and twelve pounds.
- "10. In the same county and diocese is the rectory of St. James, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the said parishes of St. Botolph, St. Mary Magdalen, and St. Giles, Colchester aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of one thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, and the net annual value arising from tithe rentcharge is two hundred and sixteen pounds.
- "11. In the same county and diocese is the rectory of St. Martin, Colchester, the parish whereof lies adjoining the parish of St. Peter, Colchester aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of one thousand and seventy-five, and the net annual value arising from glebe lands and interest on capital in the hands of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners is one hundred and seventy-five pounds.
- "12. In the same county and diocese is the rectory of Greenstead, the parish whereof lies

adjoining the said parishes of St. Giles, St. Botolph, St. Mary Magdalen, and St. James, Colchester aforesaid, and contains, according to the census of one thousand nine hundred and one, a population of one thousand and thirty-one, and the net annual value arising from tithe rentcharge is one hundred and thirty-nine pounds.

- "13. A certain district, being a detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and at present uninhabited, lies adjacent to the said parish of Lexden, and at a distance of about six hundred yards from the parish church thereof, but at a distance of more than a mile from the parish church of Holy Trinity.
- "14. A certain district, being a detached portion of the said parish of St. James, Colchester, and at present uninhabited and adjacent to the said parish of Lexden, lies at a distance of six hundred yards from the parish church thereof, but at a distance of one and three-quarter miles from the parish church of St. James, Colchester.
- "15. A certain district of the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, at present uninhabited, projects in a northerly direction into the said parish of Lexden, and lies at a distance of half a mile from the parish church thereof, but at a distance of nearly one mile from the parish church of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "16. A certain other district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, at present uninhabited, projects into the said parish of Lexden, and lies at a distance of less than half a mile from the parish church thereof, but at a distance of one mile from the parish church of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "17. A certain district of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, containing a population of about eighty-five persons, and forming part of a detached portion of the said parish, is intersected diagonally by a certain new street known as Salisbury Avenue, and the houses therein are partly in the parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and partly in the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "18. Four certain other districts which are all detached portions of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and containing in the whole a population of about three hundred and fifteen persons, lie wholly within the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester. The parish church of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, lies at a distance of one-third of a mile from the nearest extremity of the said detached portions to the said church, but the parish church of Holy Trinity, Colchester, lies at a distance of two-thirds of a mile from the same point and in the same direction.
- "19. A certain other district forming part of another detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, forming the house and grounds of a certain messuage known as Cannons, extends in a westerly direction into the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and is separated from the remainder of the said detached portion by the high road leading from Colchester to Layer.

- "20. A certain district (uninhabited), being a detached portion of the said parishes of St. Nicholas with St. Runwald, Colchester, lies wholly within the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and at a distance of three-quarters of a mile from the parish church thereof, but the parish church of St. Nicholas with St. Runwald, Colchester, lies at a distance of one mile from such detached portion and in the same direction.
- "21. A certain district, being a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and containing a population of one hundred and fifty-five persons, and lies wholly within the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester. The easternmost point of the said district lies at a distance of half a mile from the parish church of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, but at a distance of one mile from the parish church of St. Botolph, Colchester, and in the same direction.
- "22. A certain other district, being part of another detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and being the site of the Union Workhouse and grounds belonging thereto, lies adjacent to the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and at a distance of three hundred yards from the parish church thereof, but at a distance of over half a mile from the parish church of St. Botolph, Colchester.
- "23. A certain district or strip of territory of the said parish of Lexden, at present uninhabited, extends in a southerly direction into the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and is separated from the rest of the said parish of Lexden by a certain new road leading from the high road from Colchester to Lexden Park.
- "24. A certain other district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, lying to the east of Head Street and to the north of St. John Street, and containing a population of about two hundred persons, lies adjacent to the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and to the parish church thereof.
- "25. A certain other district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, containing a population of about thirty persons, is bounded on the north by Princess Street and on the east by Butt Road, and lies adjacent to the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester.
- "26. A certain district of the said parish of St. Peter, Colchester, containing no population, lies to the south of Culver Street, and is situate on the north-east side of the district referred to in the preceding paragraph, and lies adjacent to the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and near the parish church thereof.
- "27. A certain district of the said parish of Holy Trinity, containing no population, and forming another part of the detached portion of the said parish which is referred to in the seventeenth paragraph of this representation, forms part of the site of the Cavalry Barracks, the greater part whereof are within the limits of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester.
- "28. A certain other district of the said parish of Holy Trinity and forming another

- part of the detached portion of the said parish which is referred to in the nineteenth paragraph of this representation lies to the east of the high road known as Layer Road, and extends in that direction into the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester.
- "29. A certain district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, containing a population of one hundred and fifteen persons, lies to the east of the Butt Road and to the south of St. John Street, and is bounded on the south by the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and may be advantageously added to that parish.
- "30. A certain district of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, being a detached portion of the said parish, is entirely separated therefrom by the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and contains part of the Cavalry Barracks, the greater part of which are situate in the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester.
- "31. A certain other district of the said parish of St. Botolph, containing a population of about three hundred and eight persons, consists of a narrow strip of territory which is bounded on the east and west sides by the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and lies within two hundred yards of the parish church of the last mentioned parish.
- "32. Two certain other detached portions of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, at present uninhabited, lie in the south-western part of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and are wholly surrounded by such last-mentioned parish.
- "33. A certain district, being a detached portion of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, containing a population of about twelve persons, forms a narrow strip of territory which intersects two detached portions of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester; the said detached portion lies at a distance of six hundred yards from the parish church of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, but at a distance of three hundred and fifty yards from the parish church of St. Giles, Colchester.
- "34. A certain other detached portion of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, lies in that part of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, known as Old Heath, and is wholly surrounded by such last-mentioned parish.
- "35. A certain district, forming part of a detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, containing a population of about six hundred and five persons, lies to the south of Kendal Road, and extends into the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester.
- "36. A certain other district of the detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, referred to in the preceding paragraph, and containing a population of about one hundred persons, extends in a westerly direction into the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and is for the most part surrounded thereby.
- "37. A certain other district forming part of a detached portion of the said parish lies at the junction of the Military Road with Magdalen Street, and contains a population of

- about fifty-five persons, and extends into the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester.
- "38. A certain other detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, lies in the southern end of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and is wholly surrounded by such last-mentioned parish.
- "39. A certain other district, forming part of a detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, which is referred to in the 35th and 36th paragraphs of this representation, containing a population of about three hundred and ninety-five persons, and lying to the north of Kendal Road aforesaid, but excluding therefrom the district referred to in the 36th paragraph, projects into the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, and lies close to the parish church thereof. A detached portion of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, lies on the western side of this district.
- "40. A detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, lies on the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and on the north side of Barrack Street, and has for upwards of sixty years been computed by the inhabitants thereof to be within the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester.
- "41. A detached portion of the said parish of St. James, Colchester, lies on the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and on the south side of Barrack Street, and has similarly been computed to be within the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester.
- "42. A detached portion of the said parish of St. Runwald, Colchester, containing the site of St. Mary Magdalen Schools, lies on the western boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, and is bounded on all other sides by the detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, referred to in the thirty-ninth paragraph of this representation.
- "43. A certain district of the parish of St. Nicholas, Colchester, containing a population of about ten persons, lies to the north of the High Street and to the west of West Stockwell Street, and is adjacent to the said parish of St. Peter, Colchester, and near to the parish church thereof.
- "44. A certain district of the parish of St. Martin, Colchester, containing a population of about one hundred and seventy-five persons, lies to the west of West Stockwell Street, adjacent to the said parish of St. Peter, Colchester, and near to the parish church thereof.
- "45. A certain district of the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, at present uninhabited, extends in a northerly direction into the parish of St. Paul, Colchester, and lies within less than half a mile of the parish church of St. Paul, Colchester.
- "46. A certain district of the said parish of Lexden at present uninhabited, adjacent to the district referred to in the preceding paragraph and to the said parish of St. Paul, Colchester, lies at a distance of over one mile from the parish church of Lexden, but at a distance of less than half a mile from the parish church of St. Paul, Colchester.

-: "47. A certain part of a detached portion of St. Botolph, Colchester, at present uninhabited, lies to the north of a footpath bounding the northern side of the grounds of the Workhouse and Infirmary, and is adjacent to the said parish of St. Paul, Colchester, and the annexation of the districts contained in this and both the preceding paragraphs will. tend to form a more regular and natural boundary for the said parish of St. Paul, Colchester.

"48. A certain district of the said parish of St. Peter, Colchester, containing a population of eighty-five persons, and situate on the west side of the North Station Road, projects into the said parish of St. Paul; Colchester, and lies at a distance of three hundred yards from

the parish church thereof.
"49. A certain detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, at present uninhabited, lies on the north-east side of the said parish of St. James, Colchester, and is entirely separated from the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, by the said parish of St. James, Colchester.

"" 50. A certain other detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, at present uninhabited, is surrounded for the most part by the said parish of Creenstead, and lies at a distance of a quarter of a mile from the parish church thereof, but at a distance of over one mile from the parish church of St. Botolph, Colchester aforesaid.

"51. It appears to me that under the provisions of the said Act 1 and 2 Victoria C. 106 and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same Reign C. 49 the following alterations in the contents of the above-mentioned parishes may advantageously be made, viz :-

"The separation of the several districts mentioned in the paragraphs the numbers of which are set out in the second column of the Schedule next hereinafter written from the several parishes to which they respectively belong, and which are mentioned in the first column of the same Schedule, and their annexation to the several parishes set opposite thereto in the third column of the same Schedule.

"53. Pursuant to the directions contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-mentioned Act of Parliament, I, the said Bishop, have drawn up a scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the several districts so as aforesaid proposed to be annexed to the respective parishes of Lexden, St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, Holy Trinity, Col-chester, St. Giles, Colchester, St. Botolph, Colchester, St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, St. Peter, Colchester, St. Paul, Colchester, St. James, Colchester, and Greenstead, and the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations may best be effected and how the changes consequent thereon in respect to Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other Ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect of patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace, together with the consents in writing, of the persons whose names are set out in the second column of the Schedule to the last paragraph above written, being the patrons of the said several benefices mentioned in the first column of the said Schedule and set against their names respectively, and of the said persons whose names are set out in the third column of the said Schedule, being the incumbents of the benefices respectively set against their names in the first column of the said Schedule, and in case you shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied therewith, I request that Your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council.

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop is in the words and figures following:—

"SCHEME.

- "1. It is proposed to separate the following districts from the parishes of Holy Trinity, St. James, and St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and to annex the same for Ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of Lexden, namely:—
- "(1) A district being a detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 1 and coloured light red, and situate on the eastern boundary of the said parish of Lexden, and separated therefrom by the district next hereinafter mentioned.
- "(2) A district being a detached portion of the said parish of St. James, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 2 and coloured light purple, and adjoining the lastmentioned district.
- "(3) A district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1

annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 3 and coloured dark green, and which lies to the north of an imaginary line drawn from the north-easternmost corner of the above-mentioned detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and proceeding eastwards along the centre of a new road numbered 1224 on the current Ordnance map for the west or head ward of Colchester until it meets the boundary between the said parishes of Lexden and St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.

- "(4) A district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 4 and coloured dark green, and which lies to the west of an imaginary line, starting from the southeasternmost corner of the above mentioned detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and proceeding thence in a south-westerly direction along the eastern boundary of the field numbered 1227 on the current Ordnance map for the west or head ward of Colchester, and thence along the eastern boundary of the field numbered 1226 on the same map, until it meets the boundary between the said parishes of Lexden and St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "2. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the parishes of Holy Trinity, St. Runwald, and St. Botolph, Colchester, and Lexden, and to annex the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, namely:—
- "(1) A district which is delineated and described in plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and is thereon numbered 5 and coloured light red, and consists of that part of the detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, which lies to the south of an imaginary line starting from the point where the boundary between the parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and the said detached portion passes the north-eastern corner of the yard of the Salisbury Hotel in Butt Road, and proceeding thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary fence of the gardens in Beaconsfield Avenue until it reaches the point where such fence is intersected by the parish boundary of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and is bounded on the south-east by Butt Road.
- "(2) Three districts which are detached portions of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and which are delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and are thereon numbered 6, 7, and 8, and coloured light red, and are situate near to one another in the centre of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and also one other district which is another detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, and which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and is thereon numbered 9 and coloured light red, and is situate near the south-western boundary of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "(3) A district being part of another detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, situate on the south-eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 10 and

coloured light red, and consists of the land which on the current Ordnance map for the south ward of Colchester is marked with the number 1373.

- "(4) A district which is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Runwald, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 11 and coloured blue, and is situate in the centre of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "(5) A district which is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 12 and coloured pink, and abuts on the south side of the high road from Colchester to London, and lies in the north-western portion of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.
- "(6) Another district which is part of a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 13 and coloured pink, and is situate on the north-eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and comprises the whole of the said detached portion except the land which on the Ordnance map for the west or head ward of Colchester is marked with the number 1067.
- "(7) A district of the said parish of Lexden which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 14 and coloured light brown, and consists of that part of the said parish which is situate on the south side of a new road numbered 1220 on the Ordnance map for the west or head ward of Colchester.
- "3. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the parishes of St. Mary the Virgin and St. Peter, Colchester, and to annex the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, namely:—
- "(1) A district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 15 and coloured dark green, and consists of all that part of the said parish which is bounded on the west by Head Street and on the south by St. John Street.
- "(2) A district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 16 and coloured dark green, and consists of that part of the said parish which is bounded on the west by Denmark Street and on the north by Princess Street.
- "(3) A district of the said parish of St. Peter, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 17 and coloured orange, and consists of that part of the said parish which lies to the south of Culver Street.
- "4. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the parishes of Holy Trinity, St. Mary the Virgin, St. Botolph, and St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and to annex the same, for ecclesiastical purposes, to the

- adjoining parish of St. Giles, Colchester, namely:—
- "(1) A district which is part of a detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, situate near the south-western corner of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and which is defineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 18 and coloured light red, and consists of that part of the said detached portion which lies on the eastern side of the high road from Colchester to Layer.
- "(2) Another district, being part of a detached portion of the said parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, which lies immediately to the north of the district hereinafter described in clause 4 of this paragraph, and which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 hereto annexed, and thereon numbered 19, and coloured light red, and consists of that part of the said detached portion which lies on the eastern side of Butt Road.
- "(3) A district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 20 and coloured dark green, and adjoins the north-west corner of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and consists of that part of the first-mentioned parish which is bounded on the west by Butt Road and on the north by St. John Street.
- "(4) A district, being a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 21 and coloured pink, and is situate on the western boundary of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, aforesaid.
- "(5) A district of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 22 and coloured pink, and which lies on the eastern side of Mersea Road, and separates a detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, situate near the northeastern corner of that parish, from the rest of that parish, which said district is bounded on the northern extremity by an imaginary line starting from a point in the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Giles which is opposite the centre of Plough Corner, and proceeds thence in a south-easterly direction along Magdalen Street until it meets the north-western angle of the boundary of the detached portion above mentioned, and is bounded on its southern extremity by an imaginary line starting from a point in the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, which lies opposite to the footpath bounding the northern side of the Camp, and proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the said footpath to the south-western angle of the boundary of the detached portion above mentioned.
- "(6) Two several districts, being detached portions of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, which are respectively delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 23 and 24 and coloured pink, and which are situate in that part of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, which lies between the hamlet of Old Heath and the River Colne.
- River Colne.

 "(7) A district which is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, and

- which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 25 and coloured dark purple, and is bounded on the west by the detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, mentioned in the 5th clause of this paragraph, and on the east by another detached portion of the lastmentioned parish.
- "(8) A district which is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 26 and coloured dark purple, lying within the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, near the hamlet of Old Heath.
- "5. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the parish of St. Giles, Colchester, and to annex the same, for ecclesiastical purposes, to the adjoining parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, namely:—
- "(1) A district, being part of the detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, adjoining the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Botolph, and which said district is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 27 and coloured yellow, and which consists of that part of the said detached portion which lies to the south of a folly or footpath leading from Winnock Road to Wimpole Lane.
- "(2) A district, being part of another detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, which lies within the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and the northern boundary of which runs along Magdalen Street, and which said district is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 28 and coloured yellow, and consists of that part of the said detached portion which lies to the north-east of Military Road.
- "(3) A district, being part of the first above mentioned detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 29 and coloured yellow, and consists of that part of the said detached portion which lies to the west of that portion of Childwell Alley which runs direct from north to south between the railway and Magdalen Street.
- "(4) A district, being a detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 30 and coloured yellow, and which lies in the southern part of the said parish of St. Botolph, and is wholly surrounded by that parish.
- "6. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the said parishes of St. Giles, St. Botolph, St. James, and St. Runwald, Colchester, and to annex the same, for ecclesiastical purposes; to the adjoining parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, viz.:—
- "(1) A district which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 31 and coloured yellow, and lies on the western boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and comprises all the said detached portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, exclusive of the said two districts numbered 27 and 29 in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and herein-

before proposed to be annexed to the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester.

- "(2) A district which is delineated and described on the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 32 and coloured pink, and is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and lies on the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and on the north side of Barrack Street.
- "(3) A district which is delineated and described on the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 33 and coloured light purple, and is a detached portion of the said parish of St. James, Colchester, and lies on the eastern boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and on the south side of Barrack Street.
- "(4) A district which is delineated and described on the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 34 and coloured blue, and is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Runwald, Colchester, and lies on the western boundary of the said parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, and comprises the site of St. Mary Magdalen Schools.

 "7. It is further proposed to separate the

"7. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the said parishes of St. Nicholas, Colchester, and St. Martin, Colchester, and to annex the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of St. Peter, Colchester, viz.:—

- "(1) A district of the said parish of St. Nicholas, Colchester, which is delineated and described on the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 35 and coloured light green, and consists of that part of the said parish of St. Nicholas, Colchester, which is bounded on the east by West Stockwell Street and by the site of the old graveyard formerly belonging to the church of St. Runwald, which is situate on the west side of the said street, and is bounded on the south side by the High Street.
- "(2) A district of the said parish of St. Martin, Colchester, which is delineated and described on the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 36 and coloured dark brown, and consists of that part of the said parish of St. Martin, Colchester, which is bounded on the south by Nunns Cut Road, and on the west by West Stockwell Street and a Folly leading from Northgate Street to St. Peters Street.
- "8. It is further proposed to separate the following districts from the parishes of St. Mary the Virgin; Colchester, Lexden, St. Botolph, Colchester, and St. Peter, Colchester, and to annex the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of St. Paul, Colchester, namely:—
- "(1) A district of the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 37 and coloured dark green, and consists of that part of the said parish lying north of the southern boundary of the field numbe red 1071 on the current Ordnance map for the said parish of St. Mary the Virgin.
- "(2) A district of the said parish of Lexden, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 38 and coloured light brown, adjoining the western side of the last above-mentioned dis-

trict, and consisting of the lands numbered 653 and 1072 on the current Ordnance map for the said parish of Lexden.

- (3) A district being part of a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph; Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 39 and coloured pink, and consisting of the field numbered 1067 on the current Ordnance map for the west or head ward of Colchester.
- "(4) A district of the said parish of St. Peter, Colchester, which is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 40 and coloured orange, and is bounded on the south by the River Colne and on the east by the North Station Road.
- "9. It is further proposed to separate a district from the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and to annex the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of St. James, Colchester.
- "The said district is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 41 and coloured pink, and adjoins the northern boundary of the said parish of St. James, Colchester.
- "10. It is further proposed to separate a district from the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and to annex the same for ecclesiastical purposes to the adjoining parish of Greenstead.
- "The said district is a detached portion of the said parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and is delineated and described in the plan No. 1 annexed hereto, and thereon numbered 42 and coloured pink, and adjoins the western boundary of the said parish of Greenstead.
- "11. The ecclesiastical parish of Lexden will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured light green, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the First Schedule hereunder written.
- "The ecclesiastical parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured yellow, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Second Schedule hereunder written.
- "The ecclesiastical parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured light brown, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Third Schedule hereunder written.
- "The ecclesiastical parish of St. Giles, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured light red, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written.
- "The ecclesiastical parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured orange, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Fifth Schedule hereunder written."
- "The ecclesiastical parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured dark brown, and the boun-

daries thereof will be those which are stated in the Sixth Schedule hereunder written.

"The ecclesiastical parish of St. Peter, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured pink, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Seventh Schedule hereunder written.

"The ecclesiastical parish of St. Paul, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon the plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured light red, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Eighth Schedule hereunder written.

"The ecclesiastical parish of St. Nicholas with St. Runwald, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon the plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured dark green, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Ninth Schedule hereunder written.

"The ecclesiastical parish of St. James, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured dark purple, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Tenth Schedule hereunder written.

"The ecclesiastical parish of St. Martin, Colchester, will accordingly consist of the lands which upon the plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured light purple, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Eleventh Schedule hereunder written.

"The ecclesiastical parish of Greenstead will accordingly consist of the lands which upon plan No. 2 annexed hereto are coloured light red, and the boundaries thereof will be those which are stated in the Twelfth Schedule hereunder written.

"It is further proposed that each of the incumbents of the respective benefices of Lexden, St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, Holy Trinity, Colchester, St. Giles, Colchester, St. Botolph, Colchester, St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, St. Peter, Colchester, St. Paul, Colchester, St. Nicholas with St. Runwald, Colchester, St. James, Colchester, St. Martin, Colchester, and Greenstead shall have the sole and exclusive cure of souls within the limits of his parish as defined by plan No. 2 annexed hereto, and that all the fees for churchings, marriages, and other ecclesiastical and solemnized and performed at the church and churchyard of such parish in respect of the inhabitants of the district or districts annexed thereto shall belong to and be received by such incumbent.

"That the inhabitants of the said respective districts shall not in future be entitled to any accommodation in the respective churches of the parishes from which such districts have been separated except in the case of any person or persons (if such there be) who now possess a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings within the said churches respectively and who may not be willing to relinquish the same.

"That nothing in this scheme shall be so construed as to limit the right hereinbefore exercised by any of the inhabitants of the said respective districts of burial in the churchyard of the parish from which such district shall have been separated.

"That the parishioners of such respective districts shall be exonerated from all liability to repair the churches of the parishes from which such districts shall respectively have been separated, but shall be entitled to accommodation in the churches of the parishes to which such districts shall be respectively annexed, and shall be liable to the repairs of such churches respectively but subject to the provisions of the Compulsory Church Rates Abolition Act, 1868.

"No alteration shall be made in the patronage or endowments of any of the above-

mentioned benefices.

"FIRST SCHEDULE.

"THE ALTERED BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH OF LEXDEN.

"The boundary to commence at the northwestern corner of the field numbered 653 on the current Ordnance map for the west or head ward of Colchester, at the northern end of the west boundary of the said field, and to proceed southwards along such boundary and along the west boundary of the field numbered 1072 on the said map till it meets the boundary between the parishes of Lexden and St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, thence westwards southward along the said boundary till it reaches the Lexden Road, thence eastward along the said road and southward along the New Road leading to Lexden Park, thence westward along the centre of the said New Road which is numbered 1220 on the said map, and along the centre of the said road which is numbered 1224 on the said map, until it reaches the north-eastern corner of the field numbered 1227, thence southward along the eastern boundaries of the same field and of the enclosure numbered 1226, until it reaches the boundary between the parishes of Lexden and St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester. From this point the boundary continues along the existing parish boundary of Lexden, until it reaches the point where the boundary hereinbefore described commenced.

"SECOND SCHEDULE.

"THE ALTERED BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH OF St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester.

"The boundary to commence at the extreme north-western corner of the field numbered 1068 on the current Ordnance map for the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and proceeds thence eastwards along the boundary of the said field, thence along a public footpath leading to the waterworks until it meets the boundary between a detached portion of the parish of St. Botolph, Colchester, and the parish of St. Peter, Colchester, thence it proceeds eastward and southward along that boundary until it reaches Pope's Lane, where it meets the boundary between the parishes of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and St. Peter, Colchester. It then follows that boundary eastward to North Hill and southward along Head Street, and then continues in the same

direction along the centre of Head Street and Butt Road until it meets the boundary between the parishes of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and St. Giles, Colchester.

"It then proceeds southward along that boundary to a point opposite the centre of Princess Street, thence westward along the centre of that street and southward along the centre of Denmark Street until it meets the boundary between the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and a detached portion of the parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, thence it turns westward and southward along that boundary to the point where it intersects the boundary between the houses situate between Beaconsfield Avenue and Salisbury Avenue. It then turns eastward along the boundary fence between these houses into Butt Road until it meets the boundary of the parish of St. Giles, Colchester. Thence it turns southward along the centre of Butt Road until it again meets the parish boundary of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and follows that boundary in a southerly direction along the same road, and along the centre of the Layer Road to the point where the parish boundary meets the northern end of the land numbered 1373, which comprises the house and ground known as Cannons, thence it proceeds in the same direction along the centre of the said road to the southern boundary of the same land, where it again meets the boundary of the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester. It then pro-St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester. ceeds southward along that boundary and continues to follow it westwards and northwards until it reaches the centre of the eastern boundary of the field numbered 1226 on the current Ordnance map for the parish of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, being the point where the existing boundary of the parish leaves the eastern boundary of the said field. It then continues northward along the eastern boundary of that field and of the field numbered 1227 on the same map, where it meets the boundary of the new parish of Lexden, as it is proposed to amend the same, and as it is hereinbefore described in the First Schedule and along which it proceeds to the point where the boundary in this Schedule hereinbefore described commenced.

"THIRD SCHEDULE.

"PART I.

"THE ALTERED BOUNDARIES OF THE MAIN PORTION OF THE PARISH OF HOLY TRINITY, COLCHESTER.

"The boundary to commence in the centre of Head Street at a point opposite its junction with Culver Street and to proceed eastward along the centre of Culver Street to Lion Walk, thence southward along the eastern boundary of the said parish, and thence in a more or less westerly direction along the said boundary to the junction of the boundaries of the parishes of St. Giles and St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, thence turning northward till it reaches the centre of St. John Street, at which point it turns westward along that street to its junction with Head Street, thence it turns northward along the centre of the last-

mentioned street to the point where the boundary hereinbefore described commenced.

" PART II.

"THE ALTERED BOUNDARIES OF THE DETACHED PORTION OF THE PARISH OF HOLY TRINITY, COLCHESTER.

"The boundary to commence at the point in the present boundary between the parishes of St. Mary the Virgin, Colchester, and St. Giles, Colchester, which is opposite the centre of Princess Street, and to proceed southward along the said boundary until it meets the north-eastern corner of the detached portion of the parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester. Thence to follow that boundary southward to the point which lies opposite the boundary fence between the houses situate between Beaconsfield Avenue and Salisbury Avenue, thence turning westward it proceeds along the boundary fence between those houses till it again meets the boundary of the said detached portion on its westward side—thence turning in a northerly and easterly direction along that boundary till it reaches the centre of Denmark Street, thence northward along the centre of that street and eastward along the centre of Princess Street till it meets the point where the boundary hereinbefore described commenced.

"FOURTH SCHEDULE.

"THE ALTERED BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH OF ST. GILES, COLCHESTER.

"The boundary to commence at the junction of Crouch Street with St. John Street and to proceed eastward along the latter street until it meets the point where the western boundary. of the main portion of the parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, intersects that street, thence turning southward along the said boundary until it meets the existing northern boundary of the said parish of St. Giles, and following the same eastward and northward and again eastward and south-eastward until it meets St. Botolph Street, thence southward along the said street to Plough Corner, thence turning south-eastward along Magdalen Street to its junction with Military Road, thence along the latter road, which forms the northern boundaries of the two detached portions of the parish which are intersected by a detached portion of the parish of St. Mary Magdalen, thence southward along the eastern boundary of the easternmost of the said two detached portions, thence westward along the southern boundary of the said detached portion and along the southern boundary of a detached portion of the parish of St. Mary Magdalen, Colchester, which lies between the said two detached portions, thence turning northward along the western boundary of the last-mentioned detached portion until it meets the southern end of the westernmost of the said two detached portions of St. Giles, Colchester, thence westward along the southern boundary of such last-mentioned detached portion, and continuing in the same direction

until it again meets the eastern boundary of the main portion of the said parish of St. Giles, Colchester, thence proceeding south and - east along the said boundary it follows the existing boundary of the said parish along its southern boundary until proceeding northward : along the Layer Road it meets the southern end of a detached portion of the parish of Holy Trinity, Colchester, which lies on the eastern side of the said road, and thence proceeding northward along the said road and along Butt Road, until it meets the point where the boundary first commenced.

"FIFTH SCHEDULE.

"THE ALTERED BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH of St. Botolph, Colchester.

Having regard to Article 1 of the Royal Decree of October, 1910:

Bring to the notice of the public that on and after the 9th July, 1911, the importation and transit of rags, used articles of clothing, and unwashed underclothing and bedding from the ports situated in the province of Naples and from the city of Palermo shall be prohibited.

Luggage which travellers bring with them shall be included in this prohibition in so far as unwashed underclothing and bedding are concerned.

This prohibition shall not apply:

I. As regards importation and transit:

To goods which have arrived from one of the said ports, but of which it appears sufficiently clearly that they have come from elsewhere,

and which are packed in such a manner and have been so transported that they cannot have been in contact with infected objects.

II. As regards transit:

To goods which are packed in such a manner that they cannot have undergone any kind of manufacture or treatment on the way.

- 1. Arrivals from Palermo are subject only to medical visit and disinfection, the delay to the ship not to exceed 24 hours.
- 2. Ships arriving from Alexandria, Port Said, Naples or Palermo, and which have undergone the measures in force against those ports in a foreign lazaret, will receive pratique, after favourable medical visit, in the first Turkish port where there is a sanitary doctor.
- 3. The measures in force against Samsoun are reduced to 24 hours' observation and disinfection (the numbers of cholera cases in Samsoun having considerably diminished).
- 4. The measures imposed against Ala-Tcham are reduced to medical visit.
- 5. A medical visit is imposed on arrivals from Chio, where a death from suspected cholera has occurred.
- 6. A medical visit is also imposed on arrivals from Odessa, where three cases of plague have occurred.

Regulations under Section 9 (1).
COUNTY OF SURREY.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Motor Car Act, 1903 (hereinafter

referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that, within any limits or place referred to in regulations made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to the safety of the public on the application of the local authority of the area in which the limits or place are situate, a person shall not drive a motor car at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour:

at a speed exceeding ten miles per hour;
And whereas the County Council of Surrey, having made application to Us to make a regulation in pursuance of the said sub-section putting the above-mentioned provisions of that sub-section in force within the limits comprising certain roads or parts of roads situate within the parish of Cobham, in the county of Surrey, We directed a local inquiry to be held into the matter by one of Our Inspectors, and the inquiry was held accordingly, and report has been made to Us thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us in that behalf, We do, by this Our Order, make the following regulations:—

ARTICLE I.—The provisions of sub-section (1) of section 9 of the Act with respect to the driving of a motor car at a speed not exceeding ten miles per hour shall apply and have effect within the limits comprising the roads or parts of roads within the parish of Cobham which are specified in the Schedule hereto.

ARTICLE II.—These regulations shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven.

SCHEDULE.

The road extending from a point in Anyards Road 50 yards north of its junction with Street Cobham Road, along High Street and Station or Mill Road, to a point 100 yards east of the Mill; and

NOW THEREFORE, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, We do hereby Order that, notwithstanding anything in the Order of 1909 or in the Orders of 1910 or in the Order of 1911, the provisions of the Order of 1909 shall operate and shall have effect until the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 10TH JULY 1911.)

MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911. (No. 3.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

PROVISIONS AS TO SCHEDULED DISTRICT No. I.

Movement of Animals into, out of, or within

Scheduled District No. I.

1. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the First Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. I) or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon, a highway or thoroughfare within that District.

PART II.

Provisions as to Scheduled District No. II.

Movement out of Scheduled District No. II, and Movement into such District.

- 2.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the Second Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. II).
- (2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. II, except in the manner hereinafter provided.
- (3.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be allowed by the person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. II.

Movement of Animals into Scheduled District No. II for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—An animal may be moved by railway from outside Scheduled District No. II (except from Scheduled District No. I) to a railway station in such District; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse situate within such District, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

PART III.

Provisions as to Scheduled District No. III.

Movement out of Scheduled District No. III, and Movement into or within such District.

- 4.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved out of the District described in the Third Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as Scheduled District No. III), except into Scheduled District No. II, and then only in accordance with Part II of this Order.
- (2.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved into, or be moved along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. III, except in the manner hereinafter provided.

(3.) No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be allowed by the person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within

Scheduled District No. III.

(4.) An animal may be moved into Scheduled District No. III by railway or water from outside that District (except from Scheduled Districts Nos. I and II) to a railway station or wharf in Scheduled District No. III; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station or wharf only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station or wharf is situate, and only to a slaughterhouse situate in Scheduled District No. III.

(5.) An animal may also be moved into, or may be moved within, Scheduled District No. III with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority—

(i) to a slaughterhouse; or

(ii) on a particular occasion, for feeding

purposes or otherwise; or

(iii) to a railway station in the District for movement into Scheduled District No. II.

PART IV.

GENERAL.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

- 5.—(1.) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement
 - (i) is necessary or expedient; and
 - (ii) will not involve movement into, or out of, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare within Scheduled District No. I.
- (2.) Where the movement is to a slaughterhouse in Scheduled District No. III from premises other than a railway station or wharf, an animal shall not be moved with a Movement Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:
 - Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow \ \frac{1}{2} about six inches long on the left hind quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.
 - Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow on the forehead of each of the sheep, and by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely:—Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.
 - Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above-mentioned.
- (3.) A copy of a Licence granted under this Order authorising movement to a slaughter-house shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the police station nearest to the slaughter-house specified in the licence, in any case in which the slaughter-house is situate in another District of a Local Authority.
- (4.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Fourth Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Provision for Movement through Scheduled Districts by Railway.

6. For the purposes of this Order, animals shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Scheduled District in any case where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District.

Provisions as to farms on borders of Scheduled Districts.

7. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the District, and where the farm extends to two Districts, the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner District.

Local Authority for the purpose of granting Licences.

8. Except where it is otherwise expressly stated a Movement Licence under this Order shall be granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

General Provisions as to Movement.

9. Animals, while being moved under this Order, shall be accompanied by the Licence authorising the movement and shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughter-house they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

10. Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the said movement.

Granting Movement Licences.

11. A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughter-house from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

12. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any Order of the Board relating to any disease other than Foot-and-Mouth Disease, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 13.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

14.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person

moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

- (2.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

. 15. In this Order—

- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Animals" means cattle, sheep, goats, and swine:
- "Slaughter-house" means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon-factory.
- Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

16. The Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1911 and 1911 (No. 2) are hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order, except as regards movement under a licence granted on or before that date.

Commencement.

17. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of July, nineteen hundred and eleven.

Short Title.

18. This Order may be cited as the MIDDLE-SEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 3).
