The following letter from the KING was received by the Secretary of State for the Home Department on the 29th June, 1911:—

*Buckingham Palace,
29th June, 1911.*

To My People,

Now that the Coronation and its attendant ceremonies are over, I desire to assure the people of the British Empire of my grateful sense that their hearts have been with me through it all. I felt this in the beautiful and impressive Service in the Abbey—the most solemn experience of my life—and scarcely less in the stirring scenes of the succeeding days, when my people have signified their recognition and their heartfelt welcome of me as their Sovereign. For this has been apparent, not only in the loyal enthusiasm shown in our passage to and from Westminster and in the Progresses which we have made in different districts of London, but also in the thousands of messages of goodwill which have come to me across the seas from every part of the Empire. Such affectionate demonstrations have profoundly touched me, and have filled me afresh with faith and confidence. Believing that this generous and outspoken sympathy with the Queen and myself is, under God, our surest

source of strength, I am encouraged to go forward with renewed hope. Whatever perplexities or difficulties may lie before me and my people, we shall all unite in facing them resolutely, calmly, and with public spirit, confident that, under Divine guidance, the ultimate outcome will be to the common good.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of Carnarvon, desire to offer a loyal and hearty welcome to Your Majesty on this your fourth visit to our ancient Borough. The presence of Your Majesty and of Your gracious Consort amongst us upon this historic occasion arouses

a deeper and more heartfelt enthusiasm than ever, not only on the part of Your people in this town, but also throughout the Principality.

In decreeing that the ceremonial Investiture of H.R.H. the Prince of Wales should take place within the Principality Your Majesty has conferred a signal honour upon the Welsh nation, and we in Carnarvon, in particular humbly express our sincere gratitude to Your Majesty for selecting our town to be the scene of the Investiture, and so enhancing the glory and renown of our magnificent Castle, which is so indissolubly associated with the title of Prince of Wales.

We are confident that this act of royal grace will be the means of strengthening and perpetuating the bond of loyalty and devotion which binds the people of Wales to Your Majesty's person and throne.

We pray that Your Majesty may long be spared to reign over us.

The Queen and I thank you for your loyal and dutiful welcome. We are deeply moved by the cordial demonstration of your attachment to our Throne and Persons.

The history and situation of Carnarvon make a special appeal to the imagination, not only of the Welsh people, but of the whole Empire. The solemn ceremony which is about to be enacted within the walls of your historic Castle carries us back more than 600 years. In those stern and troubled times Carnarvon was a stronghold in a land of continual war, and My ancestor, King Edward I., sought to establish peace among these mountains by associating the title and honours of Prince of Wales with the heir to the Crown of England. The cen-

turies that have elapsed have seen that peace develop into the closest union between England and Wales, and the title Prince of Wales is now prized by both countries as the highest dignity of their Sovereign's eldest Son.

The union between the two countries was strengthened in the 15th century by the accession of a Welsh Prince to the Throne of England; and I do not need to remind you that from his descent through the House of Tudor My dear Son derives a natural and intimate claim upon your allegiance. In acceding to the wish of the Principality that his advancement to the title should receive the confirmation and consecration of an Investiture in the land which by his Patent he is called upon to direct and defend, I knew that the ceremony would not only revive the treasured memories of an ancient and famous past, but would create a lively sense of personal affection between Prince and People. I believe that the occasion will serve a still deeper purpose in assembling in union and power around his person all the forces of Welsh national life which preserve the fame and achievements of your heroic ancestors, and will sustain in the world of modern times the virtues of the British race and the glories of the British Empire.

The presence of Her Gracious Majesty the Queen and of our Royal Prince and the Princess Mary touches our hearts, and quickens our loyal affection to the Royal Family, upon this happy occasion, to a degree which it is difficult to express; and we can only pray God that Your Majesty may long be spared to reign over us, and that this occasion may be a happy augury that Your Majesty may live to carry out and complete all the good works which Your late beloved father had it in his mind to complete for the good of his loyal and loving subjects.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF NORTH WALES.

To His Most Excellent Majesty the King.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the President and Governing Bodies of the University College of North Wales, beg to offer Your Majesty a most loyal welcome on this your second visit to our College, and we desire to express our sincerest pleasure that Her Majesty the Queen again accompanies Your Majesty.

It is a source of profound gratification to us that this visit should be made at a moment when the revival of the ancient ceremony of Investiture has given the Welsh people a special opportunity of testifying their loyal devotion to Your Majesties, and has invested the historic title of Prince of Wales with new significance and made its assumption by the Heir to the Throne an occasion of national rejoicing throughout the Principality. We are happy to be able to offer His Royal Highness our respectful congratulations in person. For this work they have been remarkably successful in gaining the sympathy and support of all classes of the community in Wales. All sections of opinion and all ranks of life—rich and poor, employers and employed, even school children

—have contributed substantially to the Building Fund.

We desire in conclusion to tender to Your Majesty the expression of our heartfelt loyalty and devotion. We see in Your presence amongst us to-day one more proof of the deep interest Your Majesty has ever taken in the development of intellectual culture and in all that tends to promote national efficiency; and we gather from it fresh encouragement to look forward to the completion at no distant date of the remaining portion of our building scheme, which will place the Faculty of Science on the same vantage ground as that on which the rest of the College activities now stand.

Vessels with cholera or plague patients on board and bound to Norwegian ports should be directed by the pilots to the Quarantine Station on Oddersen, near Christiansand.

Vessels with cholera patients on board and calling at ports in Nordland, Tromso, and Finmarken Prefectures, or using the inner channel between Honningsvaag and Lodingen, are to be directed to the provisional cholera lazaret in Tromso. ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH JULY 1911.)

MIDDLESEX AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1911 (No. 4).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1910, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Order.

1. The Middlesex and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1911 (No. 3) (here-

inafter referred to as the "principal Order") is hereby modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Transfer of Parishes from Scheduled District No. II to Scheduled District No. III.

2. The parishes of Slough, Eton, and Eton Wick shall cease to form part of Scheduled District No. II and shall form part of Scheduled District No. III.

Movement into or within Scheduled District No. II for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) An animal may be moved into or within Scheduled District No. II to a slaughterhouse within such District with a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate if the animal is, before the movement is commenced, marked by and at the expense of the owner in the manner described in Article 5 (2) of the principal Order. This provision shall be included in Part II of the principal Order.

(2.) Nothing in this Article shall affect movement of animals into Scheduled District No. II under Article 3 of the principal Order.

Movement into or within Scheduled District No. III for certain purposes.

4.—(1.) Where an Inspector of a Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient—

- (i.) that an animal should be permitted to be moved into Scheduled District No. III from premises outside any Scheduled District for breeding or dairying purposes; or
- (ii.) that an animal should be permitted to be moved within Scheduled District No. III as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm, or between different farms in Scheduled District No. III;

the Inspector may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under the preceding paragraph (ii) shall be marked by the Inspector granting the same with the words "Occupation Licence." Such a Licence shall be retained by the person to whom it is granted, and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

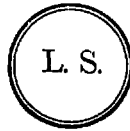

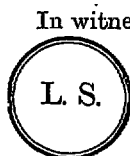

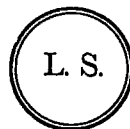
